The meeting was called to order by Chairman Apt.

The chair opened discussion on <u>H.B. 2160</u>, an act concerning driver training and motorcycle safety courses and authorized fees. After a period of discussion <u>a motion was made</u> by Representative Dean that H.B. 2160 be reported adversely. Seconded by Representative Amos. Motion failed.

Chairman Apt called attention to $\underline{\text{H.B. 2637}}$, an act changing the dates for the Kansas Information Training Program.

Representative Crumbaker moved H.B. 2637 be passed favorably and place on the consent calandar. Seconded by Representative Hensley. Motion carried.

Chairman Apt recognized Mr. John Stefano who requested the committee to introduce a bill that would amend KSA 72-1101 by including the subjects, Science and the Arts, with the required subjects in elementary schools. (Attachment 1)

Representative Hensley moved this bill be introduced by the committee. Seconded by Representative R. D. Miller. Motion carried.

The chair drew the attention of the committee to a request by Representative Robin Leach concerning the use of seat belts on school buses with no penalty wording in the bill. Representative R. D. Miller moved this bill be introduced by the committee. Representative Laird seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Chairman Apt asked the committee to introduce a bill concerning vocational education; affecting the determination of financial aid for the provision of vocational education programs by community colleges. This would replace <u>H.B. 2074</u> which was killed last year. <u>Representative Empson moved this bill be introduced.</u> Seconded by Representative Crumbaker. Motion carried.

The chair opened discussion on <u>H.B. 2725</u>, relating to the teaching of Kansas history in schools and teacher preparation institutions. Chairman Apt explained the balloon (Attachment 2) which would change the grades Kansas history would be taught from 4 through 8 to 7 through 12. It also provides for exemption of out-of-state students who transfer in during their junior or senior year in high school. After discussion relating to credit units <u>Representative R.D. Miller made a motion to amend in line 4 following the words "1/2 unit of credit" by adding the words "or the equivalent thereof". Seconded by Representative Empson. The motion to amend carried.</u>

RESOLUTION ARTS EDUCATION

At the February 13 meeting of the Kansas Alliance for Arts Education, the State Affiliate of the Education Component of John F. Kennedy for the Performing Arts, the following was adopted unanimously:

BE IT RESOLVED: that KAAE seek to introduce a legislation to amend KSA 72-1101 to read: Required subjects in elementary schools. "Every accredited elementary school shall teach reading, writing, and arithmetic, geography, spelling, English grammar and composition, history of the United States and of the state of Kansas, civil government and the duties of citizenship, health and hygiene, Science and the Arts, together with such other subjects as the state board may determine."

The state board shall be responsible for the selection of subject matter within the several fields of instruction and for its organization into courses of study and instruction for the guidance of teachers, principals and superintendents.

The course may also include, but not by way of limitation, information pertaining to geography, natural resources, educational system, industrial climate and government of Kansas.

(2) Commencing with the 1991-92 school year, except as otherwise provided in this subsection, no student who has not taken and satisfactorily passed the course of instruction required by this subsection shall be certified as having completed the course requirements necessary for graduation from high school.

(3) Provision (2) of this subsection does not apply to any student who is enrolled in an accredited school and attending either of grades 11 or 12 if such student transferred from attendance at school in another state immediately prior to enrollment and attendance at school in this state.
