Representative Long made a motion, seconded by Representative Roenbaugh, to introduce to bill requests. One deals with the licensing of plumbers and plumbing contractors and the other deals with prohibiting free tobacco samples. The motion carried.

Representative Barr made a motion, seconded by Representative Roenbaugh, that HB2779 be reported adversely at the request of the sponsor. The motion carried.

HB2746 - Citizen requirements for liquor license

The bill changes the U.S. residency requirement from ten years to five years. Current law requires a person to reside in the U.S. for five years before they can become a U.S. citizen. The liquor license requirement is a ten year resident. This in essence requires 15 years residency.

Hearings were concluded on HB2746.

Representative Roenbaugh made a motion, seconded by Representative Roper, to approve the minutes of the February 3. The motion carried.
