SB 616 - Kansas-Rhodes scholarship program.

Ms. Avis Swartzman, Legislative Revisor's Office

After calling the meeting to order, the Chairman announced that the Committee would continue its discussion and/or action on SB 616, an act establishing the Kansas-Rhodes scholarship program. He then asked the revisor of statutes, Ms. Avis Swartzman, to explain the amendments she had prepared in response to Committee discussion at yesterday's meeting. Ms. Swartzman informed the Committee that for clarification purposes she had changed the definition of Kansas-Rhodes scholar by removing the wording "full-time, in-state student" in Section 1, Sub. (b), line 0021, and inserting "resident of Kansas" in lieu thereof. (Attachment 1) Ms. Swartzman then made reference to the wording in Section 1., Sub. (c) which defines "Enrolled full time". She suggested that the Committee may not wish to use this language, since a full-time load for graduate students may not be twelve hours and since the Committee may not wish to stipulate that a Kansas-Rhodes scholar must be enrolled full time.

Senator Allen then moved to amend SB 616 by deleting the definition of "enrolled full time" (see Attachment 1), Section I, Sub. (c) and deleting other references to enrolled "full time". (Section 2., line 0039, and Section 4, Subsection (a), line 0052). The motion was seconded by Senator Warren, and the amendment was adopted. Senator Warren then moved that SB 616, as amended, be reported favorably for passage. Senator Langworthy seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

SB 577 - Vocational education; transfer of certain programs to community colleges

When the Chairman called the Committee's attention to SB 577 and said the floor was open for discussion and/or action on the bill, Senator Warren moved and Senator Salisbury seconded the motion to recommend SB 577 favorably for passage. In response to a Committee question, Ms. Avis Swartzman, revisor of statutes, replied that according to the provisions of SB 577, the agreement between the board of an area vocational school or area vocational technical school and the board of trustees of a community college does not have to be approved by the State Board of Education, but the courses transferred must be approved by the State Board. When the Chair called for a vote on the motion by Senator Warren, he ruled that the motion did carry.

When the Chair asked for a motion to approve Committee minutes of February 23, 24, and 25, Senator Arasmith requested the insertion of Ms. Brilla Highfill Scott's reply to his question relating to state funding of school districts, and this reply is found in the amended minutes of February 24. Senator Arasmith moved that minutes of February 23 and 25 and the amended minutes of February 24 be approved. Senator Allen seconded the motion, and the minutes were approved. The Chairman adjourned the meeting.

As used in this act: (a) "Kansas-Rhodes scholar-0019 ship" means an award under this act by this state to a Kansas-9020 Rhodes scholar. - 0102 (b) Complete and file an application for a Kansas-Rhodes 0103 scholarship;
- 0104 (c) Report promptly to the board of regents any information 0105 requested relating to administration of this act.
- 0106 Sec. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and 0107 after its publication in the statute book.

(e) Evaluate the Kansas-Rhodes scholarship program annually, and make a report thereon to the governor and the legislature;
