After calling the meeting to order, the Chairman said that the hearing on SB 746, which had been scheduled for today, has been postponed until Monday, March 28, in order to accomodate conferees who were unable to attend today's meeting.

SB 393 - Concerning fire safety and prevention; relating to the construction of school buildings

The Chairman asked the Committee to turn its attention to SB 393 and then commented that he was reluctant for the Committee to take action on the measure unless the concept of SB 393 is localized.

Senator Arasmith made a conceptual motion to amend SB 393 so as to restrict the bill to school buildings (excluding mobile, modular, portable, or relocatable buildings) and to localize the bill to apply to Johnson County Senator Allen seconded the motion, and the amendment was adopted.

When the Chair called for a vote on the bill, Senator Allen moved that SB 393, as amended, be reported favorably for passage. The motion was seconded by Senator Langworthy, and the motion carried.

HB 2725 - Kansas history course of instruction required in schools and teacher preparation institutions.

When the Chair called the Committee's attention to HB 2725, he distributed for Committee consideration two handouts. He explained that the two handouts represent the same concepts for amendments to HB 2725 but that they are represented in two different forms: Attachment 1, CRH 2725pl; Attachment 2, balloon form of proposed amendments to HB 2725.

Senator Langworthy moved to amend the language in Attachment 2 (balloon form) so as to include both Kansas history and government in the title and in Section 1. (a). The motion was seconded by Senator Salisbury. Senator Karr moved that the lead time for implementation of HB 2725 be no sooner than the commencement of the 1991-92 school year and requested that this motion be included as part of the primary motion. Senator Montgomery seconded this motion.

Senator Langworthy then made a substitute motion to pass HB 2725, as amended in the original balloon form, Attachment 2. Senator Allen seconded the motion, but the motion did not carry.

When the Chair called for a vote on the primary motion to amend HB 2725, the motion carried.

Senator Kerr made a motion to amend HB 2725 by striking all of the language following Kansas history in Section 1. (a) beginning with the word "which" and ending with the word "thereof". Senator Parrish seconded the motion, but the motion did not carry.

Senator Karr moved that HB 2725, as amended, be recommended favorably for passage. Senator Allen seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

HB 2799 - School districts, tuition payments for pupils attending school in districts of nonresidence

When the Chairman called the Committee's attention to HB 2799, Senator Montgomery submitted for distribution copies of some proposed amendments (Attachment 3) he would like for the Committee to consider. Senator Montgomery then moved that his proposed amendments to HB 2799 be adopted. Senator Warren seconded the motion and the amendments were adopted.

Senator Warren then moved that HB 2799, as amended, be recommended favorably for passage. Senator Montgomery seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

HB 2823 - Use of tobacco products prohibited in school buildings
When the Chairman called the Committee's attention to HB 2823, he also informed the Committee that copies of an amended bill for clarification purposes had been distributed to the members. (Attachment 4)

Senator Allen moved that the Committee adopt the amendments to HB 2823 as found in Attachment 4. Senator Salisbury seconded the motion.

Senator Anderson made a substitute motion to table HB 2823 and explained his motion by saying that HB 2823 represents a problem that should be handled by the local boards. The motion failed for lack of a second.

The Chair referred the Committee's attention to the original motion to adopt the amendments to HB 2823 (as found in Attachment 4), and the amendments were adopted.

Senator Salisbury moved that HB 2823, as amended, be recommended favorably for passage. Senator Kerr seconded the motion.

Senator Langworthy made a substitute motion recommending that the concept of HB 2823 be made into a resolution. Senator Anderson seconded the substitute motion, but the substitute motion did not carry.

When the Chair called for a vote on the primary motion to pass HB 2823, as amended, the motion carried.

The Chair adjourned the meeting.
