If, within 60 days after publication of such notice, there is presented either to the water district board or to the governing body of any such other water utility a written protest against the proposed extension signed by qualified electors of the water district or of the area served by any such other water utility, respectively, equal to 2% of the qualified electors who voted at the last preceding general election, the board or the governing body of the other water utility shall present such proposed extension to the qualified electors of the water district or of such other water utility at a special election called and held in the other water utility at a special election called and held in the amendments thereto. The boundary extension shall not be made unless approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon at the election hereinbefore required.
