Senator Gerald "Jerry" Karr appeared before the committee and presented written testimony. Senator Karr suggested 3 changes in SB-469. The first change was to include in Section 1 "the not for profit corporations." This would primarily be hospitals that may have a masters level psychologist on their staff. The change in Section 2 would change the language that says "by state agency" to "in this state." The third change would add a new section on Line 131, which would allow the advisory committee to expire on July 1, 1989. Senator Karr also supported the amendment to be offered by the Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board which would involve adding a new Section 5 on line 134. This amendment dealing with confidentiality is shown in attachment 1.

Bill Crockett appeared before the committee and presented written testimony. Senate Bill 680 passed last year places Mr. Crockett's current employment in jeopardy, also the future of the psychiatric unit of St. Catherine's Hospital, Garden City. Mr. Crockett stated he was in support of  $\underline{SB-469}$  which is designed to include not-for-profit corporations. Attachment 2

Mary Ann Gabel requested support by the committee for  $\underline{SB-469}$  and also asked consideration in amending the bill with the addition of a new Section 5 concerning confidentiality. A copy of the requested new Section 5 is provided in Attachment 3.

John Peterson appeared before the committee with the request that the Advisory Committee, which is just getting organized, be allowed to operate for a period of time. Mr. Peterson stated that if changes were deemed necessary after a period of operation, they could be addressed at a later date.

Paul Klotz stated he would reserve comments on the bill until such a time as another bill which is being prepared comes before the committee.

Tom Bell appeared before the committee stating his organization was supportive of the proposed changes in the bill. It was suggested that in the event of difficulties the term "licensed hospitals" be used.

The meeting adjourned at 10:35 a.m. and will meet January 21, 1988.

TOPIC:

Senate Bill No. 469

I appreciate the opportunity to appear before the Committee to discuss minor changes that should be made in the Act that was passed in the 1987 Session regarding registered masters level psychologists. I am suggesting three changes in the bill that you have before you. First, I would like to include in Section 1 "the not for profit corporations", which would primarily be hospitals that may have a masters level psychologist on their staff.

In Section 2, in order to make certain that we are not putting any master level psychologist at a disadvantage during this transition period, I would like to change the language that says "by state agency" to "in this state". I think this would clarify the situation for the individual that may be caught in the transition.

And third, in the bill which you have before you, I would like to add a new section on Line 131, which would allow the Advisory Committee to expire on July 1, 1989.

As a Committee, I would like to recommend some additional thoughts. If the Advisory Committee for the masters level psychologist is allowed to expire, as you did for counselors, I think the Committee should consider developing a new makeup for the Board of Behavioral Sciences. As you know the current board of seven members include, two social workers, two psychologist, and three members from the general public. I think with the two new groups moving under the umbrella of the board, they need to be directly represented on the Board.

And last, I would like to suggest a possible additional amendment to the bill before you. This admendment has been suggested by the Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board and it would involve adding a new Section 5 starting on Line 134. The new language is on the attached copy of the bill. 0016 AN ACT concerning registered masters level psychologists; 0017 amending K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 74-5362, 74-5363 and 74-5368 0018 and repealing the existing sections.

0019 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 74-5362 is hereby amended to 0020 one of the read as follows: 74-5362. Any person who is registered under the 0022 provisions of this act as a registered masters level psychologist 0023 shall have the right to practice only in a licensed community 0024 mental health center or one of its contracted affiliates, in any 0025 federal, state, county or municipal agency, or other political 0026 subdivision, or in a duly chartered educational institution or in a 0027 not-for-profit corporation insofar as such practice is part of the 0028 duties of such person's paid position and is performed solely on 0029 behalf of the employer, so long as such practice is under the 0030 direction of a person licensed to provide mental health services 0031 as an independent practitioner and whose licensure allows for 0032 the diagnosis and treatment of psychological disorders. ### Statement of Position - Senate Bill #469

I am in support of Senate Bill #469 which is designed to include not-for-profit corporations in the list of locations in which a Registered Master's Level Psychologist can be employed.

I have a Master's Degree in Clinic Psychology and am employed as a Clinical Psychologist for the Psychiatric Unit - St. Catherine Hospital, Garden City, Kansas. St. Catherine Hospital is a 132-bed general hospital in Garden City, operated as a not-for-profit corporation by the Sisters of St. Dominic.

As you know, Senate Bill #680 of the 1987 legislative session includes state institutions and community mental health centers as locations in which registered Master's level psychologists can be employed. Consequently, St. Catherine would be unable to continue to employ me in my present capacity.

Curiously, I was employed by the Area Mental Health Center, Garden City, as a staff psychologist for eight years prior to beginning my employment at St. Catherine in May, 1985. The so called "exclusion clause", 74-5344(c) of Article 53, establishing licensure regulations for psychologists, permitted my employment at St. Catherine as a psychologist, just as it allowed my employment with the local community mental health center for the previous eight years. This clause essentially allowed a master's level psychologist employment in "...federal, state, county, or municipal agency, or other political subdivision, or a duly chartered educational institution, or a not-for-profit corporation insofar as such practice is a part of the duty of such person's salaried position...".

Senate Bill #680 places my current employment in jeopardy, and for that matter, places the future of our psychiatric unit in jeopardy. It is essential that our unit provides psychological services, and a licensed Ph.D. psychologist may be quite difficult for the hospital to recruit. In fact, the eighteen counties of Southwest Kansas included in our catchment area, to my knowledge, only have two licensed Ph.D. psychologists. Additionally, we are the Psychiatric inpatient facility in our eighteen-county catchment area and only one of two such facilities west of the state hospital at Larned.

Consequently, I urge you to support Senate Bill #469.

RATIONALE: There is specific statute pertaining to confidentiality between clients and licensed psychologists (K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 74-5323), social workers (K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 75-5360), and professional counselors (K.S.A. 1987 Supp. 65-5810). However, there is no similar provision in the RMLP act. The act can be amended by adding a statute identical to the one concerning counselors as noted above.
