The Chairman called attention to corrected and updated information from the Lottery office pertaining to the Executive Secretary's testimony on February 1. It can be found in Attachment No. 3 of the February 1, 1988, minutes.

A completed subcommittee assignment list was distributed to members. (Attachment 1)

Staff reviewed a summary of FY 1989 Capital Improvements by funding sources (Attachment No. 2) which shows the amount requested by agencies, the amount recommended by the Governor, the sources from which these appropriations would be made, and the amount previously appropriated for projects.

In response to questions, Staff said a contractor for the capital improvement project at Larned has been selected, but work has not started. It was noted by a member that the Governor's staff is working on the inclusion of appropriations in the budget for maintenance for institutions.

There was discussion regarding the status of the proposed move of the Historical Society from its 10th street location, it being noted that no funds were allocated for this. Ed De Vilbiss, State Architect, said that, based on the concept of erecting a new building, it will be two or three years before it could be occupied. He said there is a possibility of closing down the present building and storing its contents or attaching the Historical Society to the new museum to operate together as a complex which would save money.

Staff responded to questions by stating that the DOC's request for an Ellsworth completion project for FY 1989 was for a medium custody housing unit. There are presently about 90 minimum and about 260 medium security beds at Ellsworth. Staff explained the bond payment arrangement with the City of Ellsworth. He noted that the Governor recommended that the bond payment for 1989 be advanced to 1988 and that money be held in a special account to accrue interest. As requested, the appropriation will be a FY 1988 supplemental and, by advancing the payment, the City of Ellsworth will not have to issue the second bond. The suggestion was made that the appropriation be for 1989 and additional appropriations be made as required to fund the project. Staff said the matter was handled differently to make a second public bond issuance unnecessary. The Chairman noted this was a matter to be considered by the DOC budget subcommittee. It was noted that because of utility problems at Ellsworth, advance money may be needed.

Mr. De Vilbiss introduced Bill Groth, the Capital Complex architect. The minutes of the meeting of February 3 and 4, 1988 were approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:50 a.m.
