Chairman Roenbaugh declared the meeting open for hearings on $\underline{Senate\ Bill\ 277}$, a bill dealing with amendments and changes to the grain warehouse law.

Tom Wilson, Director, Kansas State Grain Inspection Department, gave a bill overview, describing the requested amendments and/or changes thereof. The bill would require the Director to investigate and monitor a grain handling facility which is believed to be operating without a federal or state warehouse license--costs to be borne by the owner of the facility. References to hopper car, box car, and direct transfer would be replaced with the term "carlot." The bill would reduce from 90 days to 30 days a waiver that the Director may grant an applicant for warehouse licensure. Misdemeanors for noncompliance with provisions would be amended from class C to class A. The deductibility provision in insurance policies required of warehousemen would be increased from a maximum of \$250 to a maximum of \$10,000.

One of the members of the Committee asked where the bill specifies who should determine the deductibility permissible by a warehouseman.

The Director indicated that it should be included and that it would be determined by the amount of the balance sheet and worth of the particular warehouseman applying for same. Norman Furse, staff, Revisor of Statutes Office, was asked to examine the bill more closely for inclusion of this.

Another member asked Mr. Wilson if consideration had been given to making the noncompliance with provisions a civil offense rather than a class A misdemeanor. Mr. Wilson indicated that they would be glad to answer to that in the meeting in which final action on the bill is to be taken.

Mr. Joe Lieber, Kansas Co-op Council, indicated their organization to be in support of the bill.
