Michael O'Keefe, Director of the Budget, reviewed the Governor's recommended adjustments to the FY 1989 Budget and provided an overview of the Governor's Budget for FY 1990. Mr. O'Keefe explained that Volume I of the Budget Report includes "Schedules" detailing state expenditures from various perspectives and "Appendices" providing trend data on revenues and expenditures. In response to a question, Mr. O'Keefe noted that under the Washburn University Plan on Appendix F, the reserve of \$6 million in Washburn's general fund will be depleted in regular increments over the five year period of the plan.

Mr. O'Keefe advised that the estimated ending balance for FY 1989 is \$382.7 million. The Governor is recommending revisions to the approved FY 1989 budget of \$56.1 million reducing the ending balance to \$326.6 million. The major areas of FY 1989 adjustments are \$10.4 million for state employee health insurance, \$8 million for automatic increases in demand transfers, \$15.1 million for capital improvements, \$6.6 million for Department of Corrections, \$13.7 in SRS, and \$3.7 million for the Kansas Bureau of Investigation to purchase the automated fingerprint identification system. Mr. O'Keefe explained that all of the adjustments listed in Schedule 10 of the Budget, Volume I, will not appear in the supplemental appropriations bills because in some cases the adjustment was covered by reductions in the specific agency's approved budget.

For FY 1990, the Governor recommends ending balances of \$196.8 million. Mr. O'Keefe noted the tax measures included in the Governor's budget are explained on pp. 1-8 and 1-9 of Volume I. Total expenditures from all funds in the FY 1990 budget are \$4.6 billion and 45.2 percent of that amount is for Education. Recommended State General Fund expenditures in FY 1990 amount to \$2.4 billion. Mr. O'Keefe reviewed the funding in Education and Human Resources which represent the largest areas of expenditure from all funds in the budget. He noted that the Governor's budget has combined and reduced to six the functions of government into which the budget is divided eliminating the recreation/historical and health/hospitals functions.

The FY 1990 budget is \$191.7 million above the FY 1989 budget. Of that amount, \$119 million is in education, i.e., \$48 million in Regents, \$57 million in Department of Education, \$8 million in school district income tax and \$3.5 million in the Historical Society for construction of the new research facility. Human Resources accounts for \$31.8 million of the \$191.7 million increase with \$1.8 million in Health and Environment, \$26 million in KDOT, \$6.5 million in Agriculture and Natural Resources, \$4.2 million in the Judicial Branch, largely
