Chairman Snowbarger called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m. The original agenda called for discussion and possible adoption of guidelines and criteria for redistricting, as well as consider subcommittee appointments. Consideration of those matters was postponed.

Brad Bryant, Director of Census Division, Secretary of State's office, stood for questions and responded to the following Committee Members' requests for information.

Representative Justice questioned the count in his district and the competency of census takers.

Representative Blumenthal had a question concerning how staff was selected, particularly for non-English speaking areas.

Representative Hensley referred to Mr. Bryant's testimony of 1-24-89 (Attachment 3), and requested information on several points. During this questioning Mr. Bryant advised that the results of the Population Count Evaluation Program (PCE) random count revealed an undercount of 2.29% in Wyandotte County, 0.32% in Johnson County and 1.23% in Sedgwick County. Representative Hensley provided Committee Members with materials on certain tracts in the City of Topeka (Attachment 1).

Representative Reardon requested information on procedures utilized to promote the state census.

Representative Whiteman had questions about the card mailing, canvassing, local review, and resurvey of college students and minorities.

Representative Adam's questions concerned procedures employed for non-English speaking and other minorities, problems with canvassers and firings, college count and local review. Mr. Bryant advised that he was not at liberty to discuss the exact procedures used in surveying college dorms in 1988 as this is the subject of a lawsuit. The Secretary of State's office will do the best they can to respond to any questions on this subject that are submitted in writing. Chairman Snowbarger requested that any such questions be returned with the Secretary of State's response for distribution to all Committee members and to become a part of the record.

Representative Adam referred additional questions concerning counts to Brad Bryant, Brent Anderson, and Mr. Pullin. Mr. Pullin discussed federal procedures for local review and correction of figures.


