The Committee convened for the purpose of discussing <u>Senate</u>

<u>Bill 404</u>, concerning the census; making adjustments required by the constitution of Kansas; duties and responsibilities of the Secretary of State and other persons; making certain acts unlawful and prescribing penalties for violation.

<u>Vice Chairman Yost</u> called the meeting to order introduced Brad Bryant to explain the bill. Mr. Bryant explained that this bill requires the Secretary of State's Office to make census adjustments to comply with the constitutional amendment that requires the state of Kansas to adjust the 1990 federal census figures to exclude nonresident college students and military personnel, and ensure that the college students and military personnel who are Kansas residents are counted at their permanent residences. The bill provides authority (Attachment A) Secretary of State to survey all college students and military personnel early in 1990, and using the information gathered, compute the number of persons to be added to or subtracted from each election precinct in the state. This information is to be made available to the legislature to use in reapportioning its districts for the elections.

Mr. Coldsnow fielded questions from the Committee and after a brief discussion Senator Vidricksen made a motion to recommend SB 404 as favorable for passage. This was seconded by Senator Hayden and the motion carried with Senator Johnston asking to be put on record as being in opposition to this and voting "No."

The meeting was then adjourned by $\underline{\text{Senator Yost}}$ at 2:43 p.m.

Dear Mr. O'Keefe:

Senate Bill No. 404 would require my office to make the adjustments to the federal census figures pursuant to Article 10, Section 1 of the Kansas Constitution. The constitutional amendment adopted by the voters last year provides that legislative reapportionment be based upon federal census figures after making certain adjustments for students and military personnel.

In order to plan and begin preparations for making these adjustments, my office would require supplemental salary appropriations of \$10,000 for FY '89.

During FY '90 my office would need to establish contacts with colleges and military bases; consult with federal census and community leaders; design, print and distribute forms; rent office space; hire and train a staff; process the data collected; update the geographical information; and prepare the adjustment statistics by precinct. I estimate that appropriations of \$98,500 for salaries and \$93,000 for other operating expenditures would be required in FY '90.

During FY '91 my office would collect the final federal data, make the necessary adjustments, and prepare a report to the Legislature. I estimate that appropriations of \$66,700 for salaries and \$21,700 for other operating expenditures would be required in FY '91.

During FY '92 the report would actually be printed and distributed. In addition, staff would need to be available to consult with legislators during the reaaportionment process. I estimate that appropriations of \$50,800 for salaries and \$9,300 for other operating expenditures would be required in FY '92.

Although these estimates have been prepared on short notice and are subject to many unpredictable factors, my staff's experience with the state census gives me confidence in the general accuracy of these figures.
