Senator Burke asked whether or not there was any hope of compromise or any common ground among those interested in this bill. Senator Langworthy said she could not say for sure but it appeared there were just basic differences on this issue and it was possible this was one of those issues that could not reach a resolution due to basic differences.

Senator Salisbury asked why the bill had been introduced and Senator Langworthy stated that it was her understanding it was partly a clean-up bill, a change of fees and also a joint decision between the Board of Healing Arts and the Physical Therapists to tighten up the guidelines.

Senator Hayden told the committee the problem with this bill was the amendment made in the House committee which would give some rural areas that otherwise will go unserved, more lattitude for the PT assistants. He further stated he could not support the motion.

Senator Hayden requested his NO vote be recorded concerning the motion that HB-2161 be not passed.

The meeting adjourned at 10:20 a.m. and no further meetings are scheduled at this time.
