SB 361 - No fund warrants allowed in drought emergencies

SB 381 - Appropriations for FY 1989 and FY 1990 for Kansas correctional institution at Lansing for an inmate housing unit

Chuck Simmons distributed and reviewed copies of a memorandum dated March 28, 1989 regarding <u>SB 381</u>. (Attachment 1) Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Winter seconded, for the approval of a technical amendment in Section 2 of SB The motion carried.

Senator Johnston moved, Senator Doyen seconded, to report SB 381 favorably as amended. The motion carried on a roll call vote.

SB 382 - Imprest funds of department of corrections

Chuck Simmons distributed and reviewed copies of a memorandum dated March 28, 1989 regarding <u>SB 382</u>. (<u>Attachment 2</u>) <u>Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Allen seconded, to report SB 382 favorably for passage. The motion carried</u> on a roll call vote.

HB 2037 - Sub. for H 2037 by Committee on Appropriations -- Appropriations for FY 1990, department of corrections and correctional institutions

Senator Johnston reviewed the FY 1989 and FY 1990 Subcommittee Reports for the Department of Corrections. (CCC), have submitted budgets to the Department of Corrections and are in the process of looking at their operational budget for FY 1990. The \$1.2 million in the FY 1989 Senate Subcommittee recommendations was originally allocated from the Community Corrections budget for the initial payment to each of those counties for the purpose of construction and equipping the facilities. This was never intended to be an operational budget so the Subcommittee recommended deleting it from Community Corrections, making a separate line item and increasing the amount to a round figure of \$600,000 which would be the first increment to each of those programs for the construction of the facilities. Hopefully, the CCC's will be on line in September or October, 1989.

Senator Gaines moved, Senator Winter seconded, the deletion of item number three under House Committee of the Whole Recommendations which adds a new subsection providing that no moneys appropriated for FY 1990 for the Department of Corrections shall be expended to establish or operate a sex offender treatment program for inmates, either directly or by contract, at any location on the property of Topeka State Hospital, or on any property adjacent thereto. The motion carried.

Following discussion, <u>Senator Winter moved</u>, <u>Senator Johnston seconded</u>, <u>to include the Meade and Labette County Community Conservation Camps (item number three</u>, <u>FY 1989</u>) as items for further review and discussion in the <u>omnibus session</u>. <u>The motion carried</u>.

Senator Winter moved, Senator Feleciano seconded, to include the issue of funding for community corrections and the Kansas Sentencing Commission for consideration during the omnibus session. The motion carried.

Senator Feleciano offered a motion have the Subcommittee Report regarding HB 2037 reflect portions of Committee discussion regarding the Meade and Labette County Community Conservation Camp which included possible contract obligations between the Department of Corrections and the counties. Following discussion, Senator Feleciano withdrew his motion.

Senator Johnston reviewed the FY 1989 and FY 1990 Subcommittee Report concerning the State Reception and Diagnostic Center (SRDC). Senator Gaines moved, Senator Doyen seconded, to delete recommendation number one under the House Committee of the Whole in FY 1990. The motion carried. Senator Parrish voted against the motion. Senator Johnston reviewed the FY 1990 Subcommittee Report regarding the Norton Correctional Facility (NCF) and Winfield Correctional Facility (WCF). Senator Winter reviewed the FY 1989 and FY 1990 Subcommittee Reports for the Kansas State Industrial Reformatory (KSIR). Senator Rock reviewed the FY 1989 and FY 1990 Subcommittee Reports for the Kansas Correctional-Vocational Training Center (KCVTC).

<u>Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Hayden seconded, to approve a technical change in the Subcommittee Report regarding HB 2037 of reappropriated balances. The motion carried.</u>

SB 381

Clean-Up Measure at Our Request

Last summer we met with State Building Committee to receive approval on a revised program for improvements at KCIL. Originally, the plan called for \$18.0 million for two housing units and other major improvements. The plan was adjusted to one constructed at the Hutchinson dormitory similar to that Facility, an entrance-visitors building, Work Correctional renovation of the laundry, utility, parking and site improvements. The appropriation language, however, specifies only construction of a dormitory housing unit. It is our opinion it would be best to have the appropriation better reflect the scope of the project. SB 381 is to accomplish this objective. If it is the opinion of the Committee that the change is not necessary, the bill can be dropped.

SB 382 - Imprest Funds

SB 382 amends K.S.A. 75-3058 to expand the cap on the imprest funds at certain correctional facilities, establish funds for those not now having such, and updates institution names where appropriate

Imprest funds allow facilities to maintain cash balances to meet obligations for inmate pay and gratuities, emergency travel to pick up inmates, and statutory travel costs for inmates upon release.

Once established the funds are replenished from operating funds. The fiscal note on SB 382 totals \$25,000.
