## HB 2553 - State pay plan increase and longevity pay, certain state officers and employees, appropriation for FY 1990

Staff reviewed <u>HB 2553</u>. In answer to questions, staff stated that if <u>HB 2553</u> did not pass the Governor could exercise his statutory authority to approve the change in the pay plan as he had recommended and it would be budgeted at four percent. Staff stated that if the pay matrix was implemented and the longevity portion of the bill were delayed one year it would save \$4.9 million and without the added two steps at the top of the matrix range there would be a savings of about \$760,000. Staff stated that there are 1,564 classified employees at the regular top step of the matrix, D-18. There are under 350 employs who are frozen above step D-18.

Following discussion, <u>Senator Johnston moved</u>, <u>Senator Feleciano seconded</u>, to <u>report HB 2553 favorably</u>. Following further discussion, <u>the motion carried on a roll call vote</u>.
