At the last meeting of the House Appropriations Committee for the 1990 Session, the members of the Committee and Legislative Fiscal Staff were guests of Chairman Bunten for a luncheon of fried chicken, baked beans, cold slaw, and rolls. Also attending were Governor Mike Hayden, Speaker of the House Jim Braden, President of the Senate Bud Burke, and Director of the Budget Michael O'Keefe.

Several speakers congratulated Chairman Bunten on his retirement from the Legislature after 28 years of service, including six years as Vice-Chairman and eight years as Chairman of the Appropriations Committee.

HOUSE BILL NO. ____

AN ACT concerning the secretary of health and environment; relating to factors to be considered by the secretary prior to issuance or renewal of certain permits or licenses.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Whenever the secretary of health and environment considers the application of any person for the issuance or renewal of any permit or license, as provided in articles 30, 33, 34 or 45 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and acts amendatory of the provisions thereof or supplemental thereto, the secretary, in addition to any other considerations, shall consider the impact of the activity sought to be permitted or licensed on the social, historical, environmental, recreational, aesthetical and commercial environment of the community in which the permitted or licensed activity is to be located.

- (b) The secretary may require any person who applies for the issuance or renewal of any license or permit referred to in subsection (a) to furnish information relevant to the social, historical, recreational, aesthetical and commercial environment of the community in which the permitted licensed activity is to be located.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
