INTERNATIONAL MARKETING PROGRAM

European Office

The Kansas European Office (KEO) is now fully staffed, with support for both trade promotion and investment recruitment activities. The office provides assistance to Kansas companies entering the European market, tracks trends and issues affecting Kansas' ability to attract international investment and conducts an aggressive program of marketing the state to firms which have the potential to make that investment. KEO staff has continued to maintain an active role in the Council of American States in Europe (CASE) and the American Chamber of Commerce in Germany.

1. Prospect Activity

The KEO is currently working with 14 prospects and 9 suspects, which have indicated investment plans for the next two years. A total of 7,900 direct mail pieces were mailed out to targeted industries, resulting in numerous leads and inquiries with long-term potential. In addition, the KEO attended 11 "Invest in USA" seminars throughout Europe with more than 900 attendees. In October, KEO staff organized a seminar in Mannheim, West Germany, in cooperation with a major German bank, which earned good public coverage and excellent ratings.

In May of this year, a delegation of high level government officials and business executives from Baden-Wuerttemberg, West Germany, visited the state at the invitation of the Governor. In addition, representatives of four European companies visited 14 Kansas communities seeking site location information. One of these firms, an Italian aircraft manufacturer, announced in October a decision to locate its U.S. manufacturing facility in Wichita.

2. Marketing Programs

For the second year in a row, the KDOC staff participated in the Hannover Industrial Fair, the world's largest trade fair, with more than 5,600 exhibitors and 500,000 visitors during the week. Prior to the visit, letters from the Governor were sent to key companies in West Germany inviting them to visit with Kansas representatives at the fair.

In support of a proposed plastics industry target effort, the Kansas European Director visited the state in November. His trip included visits to five Kansas communities and a total of 14 companies and two universities to discuss the resources available in the state to support the plastics industry.

3. Kansas Visits to Europe

The delegation attending the Hannover Fair also met with economic development officials in Stuttgart and called on contacts in the banking industry. In addition, a visit to Champagne-Ardenne, France was included to continue the development of the state's economic cooperation relationship with this region. The visit included discussions with five local firms with interest in the U.S. market.

In addition, many executives from Kansas companies visited the KEO to discuss their international business plans and to get assistance in doing business with European companies.

4. Lublic Relations

The Kansas European Office is in regular contact with major European business newspapers and magazines and keeps them informed on economic issues in Kansas. The director of the KEO has frequently been invited for speaking engagements at business organizations and universities. Also, the KEO actively supports international activities like sister city relationships and student exchange programs between Kansas and Europe. Through active involvement in the American Chamber of Commerce, the KEO has established good relationships within the American business community in Europe, which also reflects the international commitment of the State of Kansas.

5. Future Programs

A new German language data book providing detailed information on the Kansas business climate and investment incentives will be available at the beginning of 1990. This publication will complement the existing German language material that is currently used in the KEO's direct mail program. Efforts will be concentrated on the plastics industry, with additional promotional materials to be developed in support of this target market plan. In addition, investment missions from Kansas are planned for the spring of 1990.

Japan Office

Interest from Japan continued to grow this year, as the international division participated in a variety of programs and hosted numerous Japanese visitors to the state. In addition, two dedication ceremonies and one groundbreaking involved the participation of top-level executives from Japan.

The Kansas Japan Office (KJO) continues to represent the state's trade and investment interests in Japan, expanding the network of key business contacts. A November investment and trade mission to Asia involving Kansas political leadership and business executives capped the year's activities in this area.

1. Prospect Activity

At the close of the year, there were 3 prospects and 20 suspects from Japan. Significant additions to the suspect list resulted from the targeted promotion to the pharmaceutical sector in the second half of the calendar year. Direct mail was used to maintain contact with the suspect lists provided by Kansas' communities during the year. The Japan Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association agreed to distribute information on Kansas to its eighty largest members. The Tokyo office also participated in three seminars/presentations during the year, providing the opportunity to make contact and distribute literature to key business executives and political leaders with business interests.

After extensive research on the area, Pack Corporation, a Japanese paper product manufacturer, announced a decision to locate its first U.S. manufacturing facility in Lenexa. Two other Japanese companies, Yuasa and Settsu, demonstrated their commitment to their Kansas locations with dedication ceremonies attended by key executives from the firms' headquarters in Japan. Certificates of appreciation were presented to all three of these firms by the Lt. Governor during the November mission to Asia.

Under JETRO sponsorship, a group of Japanese executives visited Kansas City for briefings on the area's investment potential. Lt. Governor Walker and Secretary Priddle gave the state's presentation and showed the Japanese-language Kansas investment video.

JETRO executives made several visits to the state to learn more about the state's efforts to market in Japan. The JETRO staff was also briefed on the biological/pharmaceutical research capabilities in the state and the plan to target this area specifically in Japan.

2. Marketing Programs

The Tokyo Office, together with the KDOC, planned a targeted pharmaceutical effort in the first half of the calendar year, and initiated execution in the second half of the year. During August, Kansas Tokyo Director Bob Hitchner visited the state to examine the Kansas business and university resources to attract investment. A marketing plan was prepared and, in November, a mission to Japan was led by Lt. Governor Walker and Speaker of the Kansas House Jim Braden. This effort has shown tremendous success, resulting immediately in the identification and approach to a number of significant new suspects.

In February, KDOC staff and representatives from five Kansas communities attended the annual JETRO seminar/conference in Chicago to discuss U.S.-Japanese investment issues. Eleven Midwestern states and executives from Japanese corporations with ongoing operations met in Chicago to learn about the state's current business programs to attract international investors and to hear about the on-site experiences of newly established Japanese manufacturers. Kansas investment literature was distributed to attendees.

KDOC staff attended the annual conference of the Midwest U.S.-Japan Association in Indianapolis. Over 200 business executives from Japan were in attendance to discuss investment in the U.S. Kansas distributed Japanese-language materials to conference attendees and discussions on Kansas investment potential were held.

In a joint effort with the WI/SE group, KPL Gas Service, Southwestern Bell, and Kansas Gas and Electric, staff called on Japanese prospects in Southern California during October. A total of 20 companies were contacted on the mission.

3. Kansas Visits to Japan

In conjunction with the marketing program targeting the pharmaceutical industry, a ten-day, ten-member mission led by Lt. Governor Walker implemented the formal marketing activity. Private presentations and courtesy visits were made to government and private organizations, influential academics, Japanese scientists who had studied at KU, and top executives at twelve pharmaceutical-related firms identified for their interest in overseas investment.

The mission also provided opportunities for state leadership to reiterate Kansas' commitment to current industry through visits to four recent Japanese investors. In addition, a special reception was hosted by Lt. Governor Walker to strengthen ties and communicate economic development objectives to a key group of alumni representing the Regents institutions around the state.

During the year, the Tokyo office also met with and provided special briefings to 19 leaders from Kansas government, business, and academia. This included seven faculty members of the KU Business School who visited Japan for three weeks under a special grant from the Fulbright Commission.

4. Public Relations

A number of interviews with the Japanpress were arranged by the Tokyo Office during the Asia mission. These consisted of a discussion with Lt. Governor Walker, Speaker Braden, and Secretary Priddle with the *Japan Economic Journal*, interviews with Dr. Michaelis and Dr. Brundage by the *Japan Industrial Journal* and the *Pharmaceutical Daily*, and plans for an article by Dr. Michaelis to appear in PharmTech. Other press druing the year included an interview by the *Japan Industrial Journal* with Bob Hitchner and the publication of a speech by Secretary Priddle in the *LTCB Research Journal*.

Mr. Sato of the *Mainichi Shimbun Newspaper*, Tokyo, Japan, was escorted in Kansas to conduct interviews of Kansas government officials, business exectuives, and to view cultural attraction. A series of seven Kansas articles appeared in the Japanese press following the visit.

5. Future Programs

A key priority for the Tokyo Office will be to build on the new pharmaceutical marketing program. Intensive business meetings are planned for 1990 in which presentations of specific proposals will be undertaken together with the executive scientific personnel from the Higuchi Biosciences Centers.

Currently KDOC and the Tokyo Office are in the process of selecting new target industries for calendar year 1990. Based on perceived interests of Japanese industry and strengths in the Kansas economy, candidate industries include veterinary medical products and food processing. In addition to these targeted marketing activities, the Tokyo Office maintains regular excellent relationships with key "contact multipliers" and influential friends of Kansas as a means of developing the state's economic interests in Japan.

Canada Program

Interest from Canada continues to grow, with the international staff now handling 8 suspects and 4 prospects, mostly concentrated in Ontario and British Columbia. In addition, approximately 80 Canadian firms are included in the ID division's target industry direct mail program.


Kansas Trade Fair Assistance Program (KTSAP)

Foreign trade shows are a proven way for Kansas companies to develop international trade opportunities, promote products and services, and have face-to-face contact with foreign buyers. In recognition of the importance of trade shows, the 1989 Kansas Legislature appropriated \$100,000 for the Kansas Trade Show Assistance Program. Under this program, the Trade Development Division will reimburse up to one-half of a company's approved expenditures not to exceed \$3,500 per trade show or \$7,000 per fiscal year.

In the first half of FY 90, the program has been very well received. The Division committed ninety-four percent of the allocated funds the first five months of the program alone. The Trade Fair Assistance Program is presently assisting 31 companies in 18 different counties. Seventy percent of the approved firms have less than 100 employees, and almost 80 percent of these companies currently attribute less than 20 percent of their sales to export. According to the participating companies, the shows will have produced \$78 in sales for every Trade Show Assistance Program dollar they received. This program has expanded the division's ability to reach a greater number of Kansas companies. The program has been so successful that the appropriated funding lasted only six months.

As a result of the Kansas Trade Show Assistance Program, new firms are exporting, and interest remains high with over 100 firms in 34 different counties asking about the program.

The Governor has recommended an increase from \$100,000 to \$150,000 for the Kansas Trade Show Assistance Program for FY 91. Total program cost would be \$150,000.

For eligible borrowers, SBA will guarantee up to 90 percent of a private lending institution's loan.

Funds may be used to purchase equipment or materials necessary for the manufacture and sale of products overseas or for working capital. They may not be used to establish a joint venture abroad. SBA may also assist a commercial bank to provide a manufacturer with working capital required to perform an already-secured export sales contract(s).

The request for SBA to participate in the financing must come from the bank or lending institution. If the bank should turn the applicant down, the SBA may be approached for a direct loan. However, the amount of direct loan money available from SBA is limited.

Export Revolving Line of Credit:

This revolving line of credit loan guarantee can be used to finance labor and materials needed for manufacturing or wholesaling for export or to penetrate or develop foreign markets. It cannot be used to pay debt or to acquire fixed assets.

International Trade Loans:

Loan guarantees issued under this loan program can be used to acquire, renovate, or expand productive facilities or equipment that is to be involved in international trade. Eligible businesses are ones in a position to expand existing or develop new export markets or businesses that have been adversely affected by import competition.

The Regional Advocate can assist Kansas firms with problems they encounter dealing with Federal agency rules and regulations which are overly burdensome or which are barriers to their competitiveness. The Chief Counsel and Advocacy represents small business before Federal agencies and Congress. The Office of Advocacy also ensures the Federal agencies comply with the Regulatory Flexibility Act of 1987 which requires Federal agencies to weigh the impact of their regulations on small businesses and to reduce the regulatory burden whenever possible. The Chief Counsel is authorized to intervene in regulatory preceding to ensure adherence to the principles of the Act. The Office of Advocacy also works with small business to identify emerging issues, and solutions to problems. Advocacy has participated in GATT discussions to examine the relationship to small business set asides, and has worked on procedures to protect data rights, patents, etc. in the international market. Regional Advocates are an extension of Washington's Office and provide a direct link to the small business community.

ACCEPTANCE: An agreement to purchase goods at a stated price and under stated terms.

ADVISORY CAPACITY: A term indicating that a shipper's agent or representative is not empowered to make definitive decisions or adjustments without approval of the group or individual represented.

ALL-RISK CLAUSE: An insurance provision that all loss or damage to goods is insured except that of inherent vice (self-caused).

ALONGSIDE: A phrase referring to the side of a ship. Goods to be delivered "alongside" are to be placed on the dock or barge within reach of the transport ship's tackle so that they can be loaded aboard the ship.

BARTER: Trade in which merchandise is exchanged directly for other merchandise without use of money. Barter is an important means of trade with countries using currency that is not readily convertible.

BILL OF LADING: A document which provides the terms of the contract between shipper and the transportation company to move freight between stated points at a specified charge.

BONDED WAREHOUSE: A warehouse authorized by Customs authorities for storage of goods on which payment of duties is deferred until the goods are removed.

CASH AGAINST DOCUMENTS (C.A.D.): A method of payment for goods in which the buyer pays the seller in advance of the shipment of goods. Usually employed when the goods are built to order, such as specialized machinery.

CASH WITH ORDER (C.W.O.): A method of payment for goods in which cash is paid at the time of order and the transaction becomes binding on both buyer and seller.

CERTIFICATE OF MANUFACTURE: A document sometimes used in lieu of bill of lading or other shipping receipt to support presentation of export draft for acceptance of payment.

CERTIFICATE OF ORIGIN: A certified document as to the origin of goods, used in foreign commerce.

C&F NAMED PORT: Cost and freight. All costs of goods included in the price quoted. Buyer pays insurance while aboard ship up to overseas inland destination.

C.I.F. DUTY PAID: The seller includes in the total price to the buyer, in addition to the cost of the goods, the insurance fee, the freight charge, and the estimated foreign duty.

C. & I.: The seller quotes a price including the cost of the goods, the marine insurance and all transportation charges except the ocean freight to the named point of destination.

C.I.F. NAMED PORT: Cost, insurance, freight. Same as C & F except seller also provides insurance up to named destination.

C.I.F.& C.: Price includes commission as well as C.I.F.

CLEAN BILL OF LADING: Document of receipt by a carrier when the goods are received in good order.

COLLECTING BANK: The bank of which remitting bank sends draft for collection (see Remitting Bank).

COLLECTION PAPERS: All documents (Commercial invoices, Bills of lading, etc.) submitted to a buyer for the purpose of receiving payment for a shipment.

COMBINATION EXPORT MANAGER: A firm which acts as an export sales agent for more than one U.S. manufacturer, all of which are noncompetitive with the others. Business is transacted under the names of the manufacturers and revenue is derived from sale commissions.

COMMERCIAL INVOICE: Bill rendered by exporter for goods shipped; it is one of the documents normally accompanying an export draft.

COMMERCIAL PAPER: In international trade (as distinguished from customary usage in domestic finance) any draft or other item to be presented in collection.

COMMERCIAL RISK: In export financing, the risk of the foreign purchaser's ability to repay.

COMPOUND (DUTY): The method of charging duty combining specific and ad valorem duties.

CONFIRM (A LETTER OF CREDIT): To assume an obligation to pay under the credit.

CONSIGNMENT: The method of payment for exports by which title to goods does not pass to importer, and goods are not paid for, until they are sold to a third party.

CONSUL: A government official residing in a foreign country who is charged with the representation of the interests of his country and its nationals.

CONSULAR DECLARATION: A formal statement describing goods to be shipped, made to the consul of the country of destination. Approval must be obtained prior to shipment.

CONSULAR INVOICE: A document required by some foreign counties showing exact information as to consignor, consignee, value and description of a shipment.

CONSULATE: The jurisdiction, term of office, or official premises of a counsul.

COOPERATIVE FINANCING FACILITY: A program of the Export-Import Bank providing funds to banks abroad for lending to foreign buyers of U.S. goods.

COUNTERTRADE: The sale of goods or services that are paid for in whole or in part by the transfer of goods or services from a foreign country. (See Barter.)

CREDIT RISK INSURANCE: A form of insurance which protects the seller against loss due to default on the part of the buyer. See FCIA and EXIM Bank.

CUSTOMS: The authorities designated to collect duties levied by a country on imports and exports. The term also applies to the procedures involved in such collection.

D/A SIGHT DRAFT: Documents against acceptance sight draft. A method of payment for goods in which documents transferring title and delivered to the buyer as soon as an acceptance is signed, a draft stamped, and payment of the draft guaranteed.

DEFERRED PAYMENT CREDIT: Type of export letter of credit providing for payment some time after presentation of shipping documents by exporter.

DEMURRAGE: Excess time taken for loading or unloading of a vessel not caused by the vessel operator, but due to the acts of a charterer or shipper.

DOCK RECEIPT: A receipt given for a shipment received or delivered at a steamship pier. When delivery of a foreign shipment is completed, the dock receipt is surrendered to the vessel operator or his agent and serves as basis for preparation of the Ocean Bill of Lading.

DOCUMENTS AGAINST PAYMENT (D/P): A type of payment for goods in which the documents transferring title to the goods are not given to the buyer until he has paid the value of a draft issued.

DRAFT: Instrument by which one party directs another party to make payment.

CLEAN DRAFT: One with no accompanying documents.

SIGHT DRAFT: One payable on presentation. See sight draft.

TIME DRAFT: One payable a specified number of days "after sight" (after presentation) or "after date" (date draft is drawn).

DRAWBACK: Articles manufactured or produced in the United States with the use of imported merchandise and later exported are entitled to a refund of 99 percent of the duty paid. The refund of duty is known as "Drawback."

DUMPING: Attempting to import merchandise into the United states at a price which is less than the fair market value.

DUTY: The tax imposed by Customs on imported merchandise.

AD VALOREM DUTY: Tax imposed on imported merchandise based on a percentage of the value.

SPECIFIC DUTY: Tax imposed on imported merchandise based on a unit of weight, gauge or other measure of quantity (i.e., 10 cents per pound).

COMPOUND DUTY: Tax imposed on imported merchandise based on a percentage of value and also on the new weight or number of pieces, etc.

EXIMBANK: The Export-Import Bank of the United States.

EX MILL (EX WAREHOUSE, EX MINE, EX FACTORY): The seller is obligated to place the specified quantity of goods at the specified price at the mill loaded on trucks, railroad cars or any other specified means of transport. The buyer must accept the goods in this manner and make all arrangements for transportation.

EXPORT BROKER: One who brings together the buyer and seller for a fee and then withdraws from the transaction.

EXPORT COMMISSION HOUSE: An organization which, for a commission, acts as a purchasing agent for a foreign buyer.

EXPORT LICENSE: A government document that permits the "Licensee" to engage in the export of designated goods to certain destinations.

F.A.S. VESSEL: The seller quotes a price including delivery of the goods alongside of overseas vessel and within reach of its loading tackle.

F.O.B.: This price quote applies only at inland shipping point, and the seller arranges for loading of the goods on, or in, railway cars, trucks, barges, aircraft, or other conveyance furnished for transportation.

F.O.B. FREIGHT ALLOWED: The same as F.O.B. Named Inland Carrier, except the seller pays the freight charges of the inland carrier.

F.O.B. FREIGHT PREPAID: The same as F.O.B. Named Inland Carrier, except the seller pays the freight charges of the inland carrier.

F.O.B. NAMED POINT OF EXPORTATION: Seller is responsible for placing the goods at a named point of exportation at the seller's expense. Some European buyers use this form when they actually mean F.O.B. Vessel.

F.O.B. VESSEL: Seller is responsible for goods and preparation of export documentation until actually placed aboard the vessel.

FOREIGN FREIGHT FORWARDER: The Foreign Freight Forwarder acts as an agent for the exporter in moving cargo to the overseas destination. It is recommended that a Freight Forwarder, licensed by the Federal Maritime Administration, move this cargo from U.S. Port of Export. These agents are familiar with the import rules and regulations of foreign countries, methods of shipping, U.S. government export regulations and with the documents connected with foreign trade.

FOREIGN TRADE ZONE: A free port in the United States divorced from Customs authority but under Federal control. Merchandise, except that which is prohibited, may be stored in the zone without being subjected to the United States tariff regulations.

FOUL BILL OF LADING: A receipt for goods issued by a carrier bearing a notation that the outward containers or the goods have been damaged.

FREE ALONGSIDE (F.A.S.) (OR FREE ALONG-SIDE STEAMER): The seller must deliver the goods to a pier and place them within reach of the ship's loading equipment. The buyer arranges ship space and informs the seller when and where the goods are to be placed.

FREE PORT: Port where merchandise may be stored duty-free while awaiting reshipment or while on consignment awaiting sale.

FREIGHT FORWARDER: See Foreign Freight Forwarder.

GROSS WEIGHT: Entire weight of goods, packing, and container, ready for shipment.

INLAND SHIPPING DOCUMENT: Bill of lading or other receipt evidencing shipment from point of origin to port or other intermediate point rather than to final destination.

LETTER OF CREDIT: This is a document, issued by a bank at the buyer's request in favor of the seller, promising to pay the agreed amount of money upon receipt by the bank of certain documents within a specified time. With an irrevocable Letter of Credit you are guaranteed payment if you comply with all the terms and conditions of the Letter of Credit.

LETTER OF INSTRUCTIONS: Directions to be followed by bank presenting a draft for acceptance or payment.

LICENSING: A business arrangement in which the manufacturer of a product (or a firm with proprietary rights over certain technology, trademarks, etc.) grants permission to some other group or individual to manufacture that product (or make use of the proprietary materials) in return for specified royalties or other payment.

MANUFACTURER'S EXPORT AGENT: A firm which acts as an export sales agent for several non-competing manufacturers. Business is transacted under the name of the agent firm.

MARINE INSURANCE: An insurance which will compensate the owner of goods transported overseas in the event of loss which cannot be legally covered from the carrier.

MARKING: Every article of foreign origin, or its container, imported into the United States shall be permanently marked in a conspicuous place in a manner which would indicate to the ultimate purchaser the English name of the country or origin of the article.

OPEN (A LETTER OF CREDIT): To establish or issue.

OPEN ACCOUNT: Shipping your merchandise to the consignee in the foreign country with no guarantee of payment. Unless the buyer is of unquestionable integrity, an open account can be somewhat risky for the seller.

PARTICIPATION FINANCING: Program of the Export-Import Bank for financing large projects in foreign countries utilizing U.S. exports.

PARTICIPATION FINANCING: Program of the Export-Import Bank for financing large projects in foreign countries utilizing U.S. exports.

PEFCO: Private Export Funding Corporation; lends to foreign buyers to finance exports from U.S.

POLITICAL RISK: In export financing, the risk of loss due to such causes as currency inconvertibility, government action preventing entry of goods, expropriation or confiscation, war, etc.

KEMITTING BANK: Bank which sends draft to overseas bank for collection.

SCHEDULE B: Refers to Schedule B, Statistical Classification of Domestic and Foreign Commodities Export from the United States. All commodities exported from U.S. must be assigned a Schedule B Number.

SHIPPER'S EXPORT DECLARATION: A form required by the Treasury Department and completed by a shipper showing the value, weight, consignee, destination, etc., of export shipments as well as Schedule B (see above) identification number.

SIGHT DRAFT: A Sight Draft is used when the seller wishes to retain control of the shipment, either for credit reasons of for the purpose of title retention. Money will be payable at sight of the completed documents.

SPOT EXCHANGE: Currency bought or sold for immediate delivery.

STANDARD INDUSTRIAL CLASSIFICATION (SIC): A standard numerical code system used by the U.S. Government to classify products and services.

STANDARD INTERNATIONAL TRADE CLASSI-FICATION (SITC): A standard numerical code system developed by the United Nations to classify commodities used in international trade.

TARE WEIGHT: The weight of packing and containers without the goods to be shipped.

TENOR (OF A DRAFT): Designation of payment as being due at sight, a given number of days after sight, or a given number of days after date.

WAR RISK INSURANCE: Separate insurance coverage for loss of goods which results from any act of war. This insurance is necessary during peacetime due to objects, such as floating mines, left over from previous wars. War Risk Insurance in the United States is underwritten exclusively through the American Cargo War Risk Reinsurance Exchange, a group formed to share the extreme losses possible.

WHARFAGE: The charge assessed by pier personnel for the handling of incoming or outgoing cargo.

WITHOUT RESERVE: A term indicating that a shipper's agent or representative is empowered to make definitive decisions and adjustments abroad without approval of the group or individual represented.
