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


STATE FREEWAY FUND ENDING FUND BALANCE

SPECIAL CITY AND COUNTY HIGHWAY FUND REVENUES BY SOURCE








KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REVENUES BY SOURCE (WITHOUT BONDS)




KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REVENUES BY SOURCE (WITH BONDS)




DISTRIBUTION OF MOTOR FUEL TAX RECEIPTS




KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION DISTRIBUTION OF MOTOR FUEL TAX RECEIPTS




KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REDUCTION IN MOTOR FUEL TAX ESTIMATES










FREEWAY AND HIGHWAY BONDS DEBT SERVICE


KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION DEBT SERVICE COVERAGE



State Highway Fund Highway Contract Expenditures








KANSAS HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

THIS MAP REPRESENTS 5 YEARS OF THE 8 YEAR HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM




State Highway Fund Revenues




