A motion was made by Representative Roenbaugh that a technical amendment be made in Section 2 of SB-790, which would reconcile a conflict with SB-484. The motion was seconded by Representative Fry. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Representative Dillon to amend SB-790 to use as a form of identification, a signed state and federal income tax form, showing a signature. The motion was seconded by Representative Dean. Motion carried.

A conceptual motion was made by Representative Dean to set a limit on the number of identification cards that could be issued. Motion died for lack of a second.

A motion was made by Representative Allen that SB-790 be recommended favorable as amended for passage. The motion was seconded by Representative Lawrence. Motion carried.

Senate Bill 790

Senate Bill 790 is the result of an Immigration and Naturalization Service request to curtail the problem of illegal aliens obtaining Kansas drivers' licenses or identification cards.

This bill would require an applicant for an original drivers' license or ID card to furnish the same forms of proof of identify as is currently required to obtain a duplicate license or ID card.

The bill further sets out the types of birth certificates acceptable as proof of identity.

The bill also defines "resident" for purposes of obtaining an ID card and specifies that only one card may be issued.
