Conferees appearing before the committee:

The Chairman called the meeting to order by informing the committee that the House Judiciary Commmittee had failed to act on SB 468 and SB 628 which resided in that committee. He reminded the members that SB 628 had passed the full Senate by a unanimous vote, and SB 468 passed the Senate with only one vote against.

- SB 468 concerning crimes, punishment and criminal procedure; relating to authorized dispositions.
- SB 628 concerning crimes and punishment; relating to desecrating a cemetery.

It was suggested that $\underline{\scriptsize HB\ 2782}$ be returned to the committee and used as a vehicle for passage of the Senate Bills.

HB 2782 - concerning controlled substances; relating to selling controlled substances near school property.

Senator Martin, having voted on the prevailing side, voted to reconsider the committee's actions on recommending HB 2782 favorable for passage. Senator Gaines seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Discussion followed on the interest of the committee members to have SB 468 and SB 628 pass the legislature during the 1990 Session. It was concluded that since the bills were languishing in a House Committee, HB 2782 would be an appropriate vehicle to amend the two Senate bills into.

Senator Morris moved to amend HB 2782 by including the provisions of both SB 468 and SB 628 as passed by the Senate. Senator Gaines seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Senator Gaines moved to recommend HB 2782 favorable for passage as further amended. Senator Kerr seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.
