Secretary Edwards appeared before the committee to submit the first Annual Report of the Kansas Department of Transportation since enactment of the highway program. He said the progress had been excellent in all phases of the program. They are presently ahead of schedule and he said this was due to the number of talented people in KDOT. A copy of the Annual Report is attached. (Attachment 1).

Secretary Edwards answered questions from the committee. He was asked about new concepts for improving and upgrading building materials. He said KDOT is constantly exploring new materials and are very much involved in the process. He was specifically asked about groundup tires. Secretary Edwards said this had received a lot of attention but the results were not too great.

He was asked what might jeopardize the road projects for Southeast Kansas. He said only future action by the legislature might endanger any of these projects. Short of this kind of legislation they would get done.

Secretary Edwards was asked about a surface in Haskell County that had to be redone and how much did it cost. Secretary Edwards said he did not have the figures but would submit them to the committee.

He was questioned about signs that some felt were deteriorating too soon and whether any research was being done for new material. The Secretary said he was unaware of any problems with signs.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:00 a.m.





State Highway Fund Fast Track Projects









State Highway Fund Revenues




