<u>SB 653 - Bill by Joint Committee on Special Claims Against the State (Attachment 1)</u>

Dr. Bill Wolff told the Committee that the first six pages of <u>SB 653</u> were persons who had not timely filed for the refund of nonhighway use of motor fuels. He stated that the Legislature had granted a grace period beyond the one year deadline, but in no circumstances is there a recommendation that any refund for any purpose be allowed beyond 3 years.

Dr. Wolff said that the Thomas P. Lamb claim (Sec. 3[a], line 4, page 7) was disputed by the Department of Corrections, noting that the claim is due to an escape attempt and the properties damaged were probably not worth \$1,000. It was noted that the Claims Committee believed that protection was due Mr. Lamb as he had been an informer.

Senator Rock moved, Senator Hayden seconded, that SB 653 be amended to require that the claims contained in Sections 4, 5, 6, and 7 be designated as charged to the institutions where the property loss or damage occurred. Senator Salisbury questioned whether a central claims pool within the Department of Corrections would help eliminate keeping track of inmates in order to process the claims. In response to a concern regarding the amount of time it would take in Claims Committee to determine which institution is responsible for the loss, Dr. Wolff stated that a draft of the claims bill could be submitted to Mr. Johnson to make the changes before the bill is printed. The motion carried.

Senator Hayden moved, Senator Harder seconded, that Sections 8, 9 and 10 of SB 653 be amended to require that the claims contained therein be designated as charged to the institutions where the property loss or damage occurred. The motion carried.

<u>Senator Parrish moved, Senator Feleciano seconded that the claim in Section 5, line 14 be amended to read \$546.14. The motion carried.</u>

Dr. Wolff told the Committee that claims in section 11 are for sales tax paid for materials for a tax exempt project. <u>Senator Gaines moved, Senator Allen seconded, that Section 11 (b) be deleted. The motion failed on a show of hands.</u>

Robert Meinen appeared before the Committee in opposition to the claim of Nathan Ochs, Section 14 (c), and reviewed <u>Attachment 2</u>. <u>Senator Gaines moved that Section 14 (c) be deleted. Senator Allen seconded, and the motion carried.</u>

Dr. Wolff, in explaining the claim in Section 15, stated that the statute directs how a contested election is to be resolved, but does not direct who pays for the cost of the resolution.

Senator Doyen moved, Senator Hayden seconded, that the claim in Section 14(a) be amended to \$250,000 to be paid in one sum. The motion carried.

<u>Senator Salisbury moved that Section 18 be deleted.</u> It was noted that if this claim were allowed, it would be paid from the operating fund rather than from the prize fund. <u>The motion failed for a lack of a second.</u>

Senator Hayden moved, Senator Rock seconded to conceptually amend Section 19 by allowing the claim to be paid from the State General Fund. The motion passed with Senator Johnston voting no. Senator Johnston explained his vote by noting that many grocery stores throughout the state may be absorbing the loss, and allowance of this claim will set a precedent. Senator Johnston moved that Section 19 be deleted from the bill. Senator Harder seconded, and the motion carried, with Senator Rock voting no.

It was moved and seconded that a claim of \$472 by a dentist who was hired by the Dental Board to provide testimony be allowed. The motion carried.

Chairman Bogina announced that additional claims will be heard by the Claims Committee, and warranted items will be amended into the bill during Senate debate.

Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Gaines seconded, that SB 653 as amended be recommended favorable for passage. The motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:35 P.M.

AN ACT concerning certain claims against the state; making appropriations, authorizing certain transfers, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Albers, Bob, d/b/a Dug Out Ranch, 1624 E. Cloud, Salina, KS

Section 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

Sec. 2. The department of revenue is hereby authorized and directed to pay the following amounts from the motor-vehicle fuel tax refund fund, for claims not filed within the statutory filing period prescribed in K.S.A. 79-3458 and amendments thereto, to the following claimants:

History of Flood Claims by Nathan Ochs

Mr. Ochs land was flooded in 1981, as were Great Bend, Hoisington and other surrounding areas. Mr. Ochs filed a claim against the Fish and Game Commission in October, 1981 which was denied by the Joint Committee on Claims on July 8, 1982. Mr. Ochs again filed another claim for the same flood against the Department of Wildlife and Parks on May 22, 1989. This time the claims committee awarded Mr. Ochs flood damages in the amount of \$20,000, which is more than originally requested by Mr. Ochs in 1981. This claim is set out in Senate Bill 653, section 11(c).

Damages claimed in 1981

110 acres of four year old growing alfalfa at \$150 per acre.

52 tons of baled alfalfa with water damage and

26 tons destroyed at \$50.00

per ton.

Total: \$1,300.00

The 1982 claims committee, after visiting the site of the flooding in this and several other claims, denied all seven claims. Committee minutes from July 8, 1982 alludes to the committee's belief that the farmers could go to court to recover their damages. This in fact did occur by all but Mr. Ochs, who chose not to pursue his claim in court. The other individuals prosecuted their claims and received a decision from the judge in 1986 which led to a favorable settlement by the department.

I would point out the differences in the claim amounts including the differences in land damaged, prices and total amounts claimed. Further, I would point out that Mr. Ochs had the opportunity to go to court, refused to do so, and was, in a sense, rewarded for not pursuing legal action. Also for your information, the statute of limitations would have expired for pursuing this in the courts over six years ago.

Personally, I am worried that this action by the claims committee could set dangerous precedent allowing the reconsideration of many long-denied claims in the hopes that a change in committee membership could mean a change in the final decision. I am also uneasy that claims can be considered so many years after the fact. Evidence can be hard to ascertain within months, let alone years, after an incident and memories seldom improve with age.
