## MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson George Teagarden at 9:30 p.m. on April 26, 1991 in room 514-S of the Capitol.

Conferees appearing before the committee:

Ed Ahrens, Chief Fiscal Analyst, Kansas Legislative Research Department, reviewed a staff memorandum on the status of the State General Fund (House action) with no tax increase in FY92 (<u>Attachment 1</u>). Mr. Ahrens stated in FY92 assuming present estimate of receipts, no new taxes, and assuming an ending balance of 5 percent, the Legislature could spend \$2,445,200,000. This amount is \$201.5 million less than the current House status on spending including the House versions of the omnibus bill and pay bill.

Chairman Teagarden advised the Committee that the goal in cutting budgets is \$180-\$200 million depending on the passage of <u>SB 442</u>, which would reduce the ending balance requirement from 5 percent to 4 percent. The Chairman instructed the subcommittees to meet tomorrow whenever possible depending on the House schedule to compile a list of programmatic cuts in the budgets they reviewed this session. A combined list will be adopted by the full Committee. In response to a question, the Chairman stated he wanted the initial recommendations considered in subcommittee so that staff could be informed and input could be received from the agencies. A member suggested the Committee could pass a revenue measure as was done in the past in conjunction with cutting budgets. It was also suggested that a change in policy on the investment of idle state funds could generate significant revenue.

In response to a question, the Chairman stated his position would be to pass the omnibus bill on to the Senate and introduce a new bill of budget reductions. The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 p.m. The Committee will meet tomorrow at a time to be announced.
