The meeting was called to order at 9:07 a.m. by the chairman, Rep. Anthony Hensley. Chairman Hensley announced the committee agenda for next week and informed members about the public hearing on a proposed increase in workers' compensation insurance rates to be held in the Insurance Commissioner's office at 10:00 a.m., next Tuesday, February 26th. He said the National Council on Compensation Insurance has proposed a 30.9% rate increase in rates. He urged committee members to attend at least some part of the public hearing.

The chairman recognized Rep. Denise Everhart to give a status report on the progress of the subcommitte's work on House Bill No. 2076, the Family and Medical Leave Act. Rep. Everhart reported that the subcommittee will be meeting today and should be prepared to submit its recommendations to the full committee tomorrow, February 22nd.

The chairman entertained a motion to approve the minutes of the February 12th and 13th meetings. Rep. Sam Roper moved, seconded by Rep. Richard Edlund, that the minutes of the February 12th and 13th meetings be approved. Motion carried.

The chairman announced discussion and final action on <u>House Bill No. 2087</u>. He asked committee revisor Jim Wilson to explain the purpose of the bill. Mr. Wilson aid that the bill was needed to correct a technical error in the final draft of 1990 Substitute for <u>House Bill No. 3069</u>. He explained that the words "conversation camp" were inadvertently omitted from the draft.

Rep. Everhart moved that House Bill No. 2087 be reported favorable for passage. Motion was seconded by Rep. Edlund. Motion carried.

Chairman Hensley announced discussion and final action on House Bill No. 2278, the prevailing wage bill. He informed committee members that he asked Mr. Wilson to draft a substitute bill. Mr. Wilson explained that the substitute bill changes the term "public works" to "capital improvements." He also explained the substitute bill provides that the contracting state agency or state division of architectural services be responsible for monitoring compliance that prevailing wage rates will be paid by the contractor.

Mr. Wilson answered questions from several committee members. Rep. Dorothy Flottman suggested that the hearings on House Bill No. 2278 be re-opened to allow comments on the substitute bill draft from interested persons.

The chairman announced that he would entertain comments on the substitute bill draft from persons in the audience at tomorrow's committee meeting.

George Gomez moved to introduce a bill substantially similar to 1989 House Bill No. 2156, a bill repealing the requirement that public employees have the consent of their employer to be recognized under the Kansas public employer-employee relations act. Rep. Everhart seconded the motion. Motion carried.
