Discussion began on HB 2016:

Rep. Amos offered an amendment (Attachment No. 1). He stated after hearings during Interim on end stage renal disease (ESRD), it is apparent to him some priorities need to be listed. He detailed changes proposed in balloon copy presented. Rep. Amos moved to have balloon amendment incorporated in HB 2016, seconded by Rep. Samuelson. Lengthy discussion ensued, i.e., perhaps the list of priorities needs to be re-arranged in order of their importance to the patient's treatment and needs.

Rep. Amos and Rep. Samuel withdrew their motions to amend HB 2016.

Discussion continued and it was suggested by Revisor Mr. Furse that to strike language, "with highest priorities listed first", might answer concerns of members in regard to Sec. 5, on page 3 of balloon.

Rep. Amos made a motion to amend HB 2016 as proposed in balloon, except to change page 3, Sec. 5, after the word "act", to strike, "with the highest priorities listed first". Rep. Samuelson seconded motion, motion carried.

Rep. Neufeld offered Attachment No. 2), balloon amendments on $\underline{\tt HB}$ 2016.

Rep. Neufeld moved to adopt balloon amendments on HB 2016, seconded by Rep. Love.

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Rep. Neufeld gave a detailed explanation of proposed amendments section by section. Rep. Neufeld then answered numerous questions, i.e., there should be no increased fiscal impact from amendments proposed by Rep. Neufeld; no additional staff will need to be hired; the KU Med Center has not been informed of these amendments; no there aren't any other commissions operating under a separate entity, operating separately from KU; concerns expressed about giving rules and regs. authority to any one person in a program of this magnitude.

It was noted on line 36, listing priorities should be stricken since it was already amended into ${\tt HB}$ 2016.

It was noted further, page 3 (e), line 13, language should read, "Commission is payor of last resort." Further concerns raised, i.e., Commission would be last indefinitely unless a sunset is stipulated. It was noted there would be additional fiscal impact.

Chair requested that since there were numerous concerns and the draft of the balloons is difficult to read, that Mr. Furse draft a single balloon incorporating changes discussed this date and present it to committee as soon as possible. At that time, discussion will continue on HB 2016.

Chair requested that Ms. Correll contact KU Med Center and request that a representative from the Med Center could attend committee when $\underline{\mbox{HB 2016}}$ is again discussed. Ms. Correll ageed to do so and will contact Mr. Marlin Ryan.

Chair then requested Mr. Furse to outline options available to committees when making requests, and or to make their wishes known, other than legislation in House Bills, or Concurrent Resolutions. He detailed options, i.e., House Resolutions. He gave a detailed explanation of Resolutions, noting they do not have the force of law as do House Bills and Concurrent Resolutions.

Rep. Amos, when asked for comments, replied he looks forward to continued disussion on $\underline{\text{HB 2016}}$, and what the representative from KU Med Center will have to say in regard to amendments to $\underline{\text{HB 2016}}$.

Chair adjourned meeting at 2:46 p.m. Next meeting will be Monday, February 11, 1991.

AN ACT establishing an advisory commission on end stage renal disease and a program for the care and treatment of persons suffering from end stage renal disease.

A enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, an end stage renal disease program shall be established under the auspices of the university of Kansas medical center. This program will be staffed with an executive director, who shall be an employee of the university of Kansas medical center, and such support staff as deemed necessary for the efficient performance of the duties prescribed by this act.

- Sec. 2. (a) The university of Kansas medical center shall establish an advisory commission on end stage renal disease. The commission shall consist of 11 members: (1) Nine members appointed by the chancellor of the university of Kansas as follows:
- (A) One member who is knowledgeable in renal medicine and the treatment of end stage renal disease shall be a physician licensed ractice medicine and surgery in Kansas and actively engaged in rivate practice of medicine in the state;
- (a) one member who is knowledgeable in renal medicine and the treatment of end stage renal disease shall be a physician licensed to practice medicine and surgery in Kansas and who is engaged primarily in institutional practice of medicine;
- (C) one member who is a transplant surgeon licensed to practice medicine and surgery in Kansas and actively engaged in the private practice of medicine in the state;
- (D) one member shall be a person engaged in hospital administrative activities;
- (E) one member shall be a consumer or family member of a consumer, who has a demonstrated interest in the treatment and cure of end stage renal disease;
 - (F) one member shall be a licensed social worker who works with tage renal disease patients;

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(G) one member shall be a licensed professional nurse who works with end stage renal disease patients;

(H) two members shall be other professionals who work with end stage renal disease patients; and

(2) two members appointed as follows:

- (A) One member from the senate public health and welfare committee of the Kansas legislature appointed by the president of the senate; and
- (B) one member from the house public health and welfare committee of the Kansas legislature appointed by the speaker of the ouse of representatives.

(b) Members appointed from subparagraphs (a)(2)(A) and (a)(2)(B) shall not be from the same political party.

- (c) (1) In making the initial appointments to the advisory commission, the terms shall be designated as follows:
- (A) To expire on January 1, 1992, the members representing subparagraphs (a)(1)(A), (a)(1)(D), (a)(1)(E), (a)(1)(F) and (a)(1)(G);
- (B) to expire on January 1, 1993, the members representing sub-paragraphs (a)(1)(B), (a)(1)(C), (a)(1)(H), (a)(2)(A) and (a)(2)(B).
- (2) Successors shall be appointed for four-year terms to expire on January 1 of the member's fourth year of the appointive term.
- (3) Members of the commission shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. In the event a vacancy occurs on the commission, such vacancy shall be filled by an appointment of a person eligible for the initial appointment for the remainder of the unexpired term of such member.
- Sec. 3. The advisory commission on end stage renal disease shall annually elect one of its members as chairperson. The commission shall meet as designated by the commission's chairperson.
- Sec. 4. The executive director shall have the following functions, duties and powers:
- (a) To establish a program to assist persons suffering from end stage renal disease in obtaining care and treatment. Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts, such program shall provide financial assistance for persons suffering from end stage renal disease and shall help to obtain for such persons medical, nursing, pharmaceutical, transportation and technical services.
- (b) To institute and carry on educational programs among physicians, hospitals, renal professionals, patients and family members, and the public concerning end stage renal disease, including the issemination of information and the conducting of educational programs concerning the prevention of end stage renal disease and the methods for the care and treatment of persons suffering from this

The executive director hall look at the availability of third-party insurance and any governmental coverage as well as the income and assets of such persons for the purpose of establishing standards for eligibility for financial assistance in defraying the cost of such care and treatment from funds appropriated to the university of Kansas medical center for end stage renal disease treatment purposes.

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- (f) To accept gifts, grants and donations from private sources, from municipal and county governments, and from the federal government to be used for the purposes of this act in defraying costs incurred by persons suffering from end stage renal disease. Such noneys shall be placed in the state end stage renal disease fund established in section 7.
- (g) To assist in the development of programs which focus on the prevention of end stage renal disease.
- (h) To adopt rules and regulations as are necessary to carry out this act.
- Sec. 5. In developing rules and regulations to determine standards for eligibility for financial assistance to persons suffering from end stage renal disease and in carrying out the duties and functions, the executive director shall consult with the advisory commission on end stage renal disease and the national kidney foundation of Kansas, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state.
- Sec. 6. The executive director may enter into contracts and agreements with persons, colleges, universities, associations, corporations, municipalities, and other units of government as necessary carry out the end stage renal disease program.
- Sec. 7. There is hereby established in the state treasury the state end stage renal disease fund. The executive director shall remit all moneys received by or for the fund at least monthly to the state treasurer, who shall deposit such moneys in the state treasury and

- Sec. 5. The following shall constitute priorities for the expenditure of moneys under this act, with the highest priorities listed first:
 - (a) Transportation assistance;
 - (b) payment of premiums of medicare and supplemental private insurance;
 - (c) administration and staff education; and
 - (d) medications.
