Conferees appearing before the committee:

Senator Allen called the Committee to order and attention to $\underline{\rm HB}$ 2379. The Chairman called for action on $\underline{\rm HB}$ 2379 reminding the Committee of the earlier discussion suggesting that the bill be made effective upon publication in the Register rather than when published in the Statute Book.

Staff called attention to the need to remove '(a)' from Section 5 on line 9 of page 4 and to add 'and' in Section 5 on line 17 after 'retailer;'.

Senator Francisco made a motion that the Committee amend HB 2379 so that it would become effective upon publication in the 'Register', that the '(a)' be removed from Section 5 in line 9 on page 4 and that the word 'and' be added after 'retailer;' in Section 5 on line 17. Senator Sallee seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Senator McClure made a motion that the Committee recommend HB 2379 favorable for passage as amended. Seconded by Senator Sallee. Motion carried.

The Chairman turned attention to \underline{HB} 2360 and called on Senator Montgomery, Chairman, of the subcommittee for \underline{HB} 2360. Senator Montgomery gave the Committee copies of the suggestions proposed by the subcommittee (attachment 1). The suggestions include definitions of terms, the suggestion of \$10.00 for a registration fee for retailers and \$175.00 registration fee for wholesalers. Senator Montgomery requested that staff be allowed a day to write the suggestions into balloon form for the Committee to see before action is taken on \underline{HB} 2360.

The Chairman announced that the Committee would meet on the following day at which time action would be taken on \underline{HB} 2077 and \underline{HB} 2360; then action on Committee minutes was called for.

Senator Sallee made a motion that the Committee minutes of March 26 be approved. Seconded by Senator Doyen. Motion carried.

Senator Allen adjourned the Committee at 10:18 a.m.

Option C Revision 2 HOUSE BILL 2360 KANSAS SEED LAW

A maximum wholesaler registration fee of \$300; a maximum retailer registration fee of \$30 is hereby established. As of passage of this act, the current annual fee is established as \$175.00 and \$10.00 respectfully. Fees may be adjusted by rule and regulation as necessary to fund the inspection program.

Horticultural Seeds means those seeds generally classified as vegetable, fruit, flowers, tree and shrub and grown in gardens or on truck farms.

Grower of Agricultural Seed means an individual whose primary occupation is farming and offers, exposes or sells agricultural seed of his own growing, on his own premises without the use of a common carrier or a third party as an agent or broker. Seed shall be in compliance with noxious and restricted weed seed requirements and may advertise if the advertisement specifically states variety, bin run and if tested.

Wholesaler means any person who is in the business selling Agricultural Seed at wholesale to any person other than the end user.

A retailer means any person who sells Agricultural seed to the end user.

A wholesaler shall register and pay an annual registration fee of \$175.00.

A retailer selling Agricultural Seed shall register and pay a \$10.00 annual regustration fee.

A individual who conducts a wholesaler and Retailer business at the same location would be required to register as both a wholesaler and seed dealer.
