Discussion noted this subsection (b), was designed to prevent unions, corporations, etc. making contributions to individuals.

Item 16 - Discussion centered on contributions from federal candidates and staff noted all PAC contributions could be banned but you could not single out federal PACs.

Senator Brady moved, with a second from Senator Lee, to prohibit those who come under the campaign finance act from receiving federal contributions. The motion carried.

Item 17 - Passed over.

Item 18 - New Section 16 would prohibit the use of time, people and machinery. Current law addresses only the misuse of public funds. The item was passed over pending further consideration. Item 19 - This would prevent those who neglect payment of fines from filing for office. Item 19 was approved.

Item 20 - Passed over.

Item 21 - Senator Bond, with a second by Senator Martin, moved to strike Section 25. The motion carried.

Item 22 was approved.

Item 23 was approved.

Item 24 was passed over following discussion.

Item 25 - It was noted that the same regulations should apply both to the legislature and state employees allowing them to take the job providing disclosure reports were filed.

Staff was requested to change language, possibly using "disclosure statement". A statutory cite would not be used since it was applicable to representation cases and would not apply to employees.
