The Chairman opened the discussion on <u>Substitute for HB 2407</u> - concerning vehicle tires; relating to recycling and disposal; prohibiting certain acts and providing penalties for violations. The Chair stated a person in the industry had suggested an amendment that would allow them to be illegible to apply for grants. The information requested regarding the predicted amount that would be available to the State from the charge on new tires was distributed (<u>Attachment 1</u>).

John Irwin with the Department of Health and Environment, was called on to response to questions regarding the grant program. He stated the program would need one full time person and \$128 thousand to administer the program. He said the rules and regulations were in the process of being written.

 $\frac{\text{Senator Frahm moved to increase the amount paid to the Department}}{\text{5% to 9% with a cap of $130 thousand.}}$ Senator Lee seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Senator Sallee moved to conceptually amend the bill to included "companies in the industry" in all of the appropriate places. Senator Theissen seconded the motion. Discussion followed.

In responses to a question the Department spokesman said that local governments would be given priority when making grants, as they believe a commitment is necessary from them, and the Department will encourage them to work on regional programs. The motion carried.

Senator Frahm moved to adopted the minutes of March 26, 1991. The motion was seconded by Senator Sallee. The motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 8:56 a.m. The next meeting will be at 8:00 a.m., April 2, 1991.
