Senator Bond moved to introduce a bill as explained by the Chairman. Senator Kerr seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The Chairman turned the Committee's attention to the Kansas Sentencing Commission's final report, Recommendations of the Kansas Sentencing Commission. Legislation will be drafted directly from the recommendations, but due to the amount of time required for the drafting, Chairman Winter noted that public hearings will begin this week on the recommendations without the bill draft available. Additional hearings addressing precise language will be held when the Bill(s) is/are introduced.

Ben Coates, Executive Director of the Kansas Sentencing Commission, began reviewing for the Committee the philosophy, action and recommendations of the Kansas Sentencing Commission. (ATTACHMENT 1)




Prison Admissions, Inmate Population, Crime Offense Trend Percentage Change - Base Year=1980



Fiscal Years 1980 - 1990






Fiscal Years 1980 - 1990




