Senator Rock reported the Subcommittee recommended adoption of technical amendments and to recommend favorable for passage as amended.

Senator Bond moved to adopt the Subcommittee report and to recommend SB 171 favorable as amended. Senator Martin seconded the motion. The motion carried.

SB 144 - transfer of offenders to Topeka correctional facility.

Senator Rock reported the Subcommittee had no recommendations.

<u>Senator Martin moved to recommend SB 144 favorable for passage.</u> <u>Senator Gaines seconded the motion.</u> The motion carried.

SB 146 - creating the employed parolees fee fund; funds used to hire people to assist parolees in obtaining and maintaining gainful employment.

Senator Rock reported the Subcommittee recommended an amendment so there is a provision exempting people who would be placed under undo hardship, and that <u>SB 146</u> be recommended favorable with the amendment.

Senator Rock moved to adopt the Subcommittee report and to recommend SB 146 favorable for passage as amended. Senator Martin seconded the motion. The motion carried.

SB 148 - limiting payment for housing certain state inmates in county jails.

Senator Rock reported the Subcommittee recommended <u>SB 148</u> be killed.

<u>Senator Rock moved to recommend SB 148 adversely.</u> Senator Bond seconded the motion. The motion carried.

<u>SB 12</u> - security interests in oil and gas production.

SB 13 - interest on proceeds from oil and gas production.

Senator Rock reported the Subcommittee was holding the bills until additional information was received.

 $\underline{SB\ 206}$  - disposition of moneys credited to the juvenile detention facilities fund.

Senator Rock reported the Subcommittee recommended SB 206 favorable for passage.

<u>SB 246</u> - increased penalties under Consumer Protection Act; violations against senior citizens and disabled persons.

Senator Moran reported the Subcommittee recommended <u>SB 246</u> be amended by striking all but Section 3 and that the bill be passed as amended.

Senator Moran moved to adopt the Subcommittee report to amend SB 246 and to recommend SB 246 be recommended favorable for passage as amended. Senator Rock seconded the motion. The motion carried.

<u>SB 247</u> - prohibits sellers from requiring a consumer to respond to a notice in order to avoid purchasing goods.

Senator Moran reported the Subcommittee recommended <u>SB 247</u> favorable as written.

<u>Senator Moran moved to recommend SB 247 favorable for passage.</u> <u>Senator Morris seconded the motion.</u> The motion carried.

SB 248 - allowing cancellation of health spa or buying club sales for three days after sale.

Senator Moran reported the Subcommittee recommended SB 248 be killed.

Senator Moran moved to recommend SB 248 adversely. Senator Rock seconded the motion. The motion failed.

A brief Committee discussion followed. <u>Senator Feleciano moved to recommend SB 248 favorable for passage</u>. <u>Senator Martin seconded the motion</u>. <u>The motion carried</u>.

SB 249 - prohibits solicitations disguised as bills or invoices.

Senator Moran reported the Subcommittee recommended SB 249 favorable as written.

<u>Senator Moran moved to recommend SB 249 favorable for passage.</u> <u>Senator Petty seconded the motion.</u> The motion carried.

SB 131 - habitually giving worthless checks.

Senator Moran reported the Subcommittee recommended the Judiciary Committee Chairman contact the Kansas Judicial Council and request their study and recommendations on <u>SB 131</u>.

Senator Moran moved to adopt the Subcommittee report and request the Judicial Council study the topic of SB 131, a copy of the request to Ben Coates of the Kansas Sentencing Commission, and to hold the bill in Committee. Senator Rock seconded the motion. The motion carried.

SB 136 - investigations of violations of odometer fraud statutes.
