- <u>HB 2376</u>- permissive joinder of parties. be amended to apply only to Chapter 61, further amended to strike House amendment which added claimants must "join in the original petition.", and to recommend favorable as amended;
- <u>HB 2099</u> limitations on amounts of disposable earnings subject to garnishment. be recommended for placement on the Consent Calendar;
- <u>HB 2384</u>- court fees for foreign judgments. be recommended for placement on the Consent Calendar;
- <u>HB 2056</u> amending what is on court documents and the duties of the court clerk. be amended by a retroactive clause so courts could dispose of duplicate copies currently in storage, and to recommend favorable for passage as amended;
