MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS.

The meeting was called to order by Senator August "Gus" Bogina, Chairperson at 1:41 p.m. on May 2, 1991, in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

The Chairman called the meeting to order for the purpose of reviewing budget reductions proposed by the subcommittees, <u>Attachment 1</u>. The Committee agreed to reduce budgets of the agencies in accordance with the recommendations contained in <u>Attachment 1</u> with the following exceptions:

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

- 2. Salaries & Wages Pool Because \$450,000 of the \$650,000 was appropriated for security personnel, the Committee agreed with Senator Brady's suggestion to cut the budget by only \$200,000.
- 3. 10.0 FTE parole officers Staff noted that 10.0 FTE parole officers were included in the agency's appropriation bill which had been signed by the Governor. The Committee agreed not to recommend this cut.

CORRECTIONS OMBUDSMAN BOARD

1. 3.0% reduction - Senator Salisbury and Parrish noted that this agency was operating under a tight budget and had been denied additional funding although it was requested. The Committee agreed not to recommend this reduction.

KANSAS SENTENCING COMMISSION

1. Reduce budget by \$64,535 - Senators Parrish and Gaines expressed concern about the possibility of furloughs with this recommendation and emphasized the importance of this agency's role in addressing prison overcrowding. The Committee agreed with Senator Rock's suggestion to reduce this agency's appropriation by \$32,000.

STATE BOARD OF REGENTS

2. Nursing Scholarships - The Committee agreed to examine all higher education issues together. No recommendation was made at this time.

REGENTS' INSTITUTIONS

1. Additional tuition increase - Senator Salisbury expressed concern that the institutions had raised tuition to stay within their budgets and now the Legislature was taking that money from them. The Committee agreed to reexamine this issue along with other higher education issues. No recommendation was made.

KANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY

2. EDIF funding of extension program - The Committee agreed to shift the funding of \$1. million from the state general fund to the EDIF and to delete \$400,000 from the agency's budget.

INDIGENTS' DEFENSE SERVICES

1. Legal Services for Prisoners at ElDorado - Senator Winter noted the constitutional requirement to provide legal services for prisoners. The

Committee agreed not to recommend this reduction.

2. 2.5% salary increase for Legal Services employees - There was discussion about whether the legal service employees should receive automatic 2.5% salary increases or whether the contract should be negotiated. The Committee agreed to not recommend this cut.
