Representative Praeger moved that HCR 5035 be favorably passed, seconded by Representatively Hensley. Representative Lane made substitute motion to amend bill to include language suggested by Kay Coles from KNEA, between lines 24 & 25; seconded by Representative Lahti. Both motions withdrawn.

Chairman Bowden appointed Representatives Praeger, Reinhardt and Lane to report to the committee Tuesday on acceptable change in the language of the bill.

Hearing and action on HB 208:

Chairman Bowden handed out a bill draft from interim Education Committee work as a substitute bill for \underline{SB} 208.

Representative Larkin made motion to table SB 208, seconded by Representative Amos. Motion passed. Representatives Pottorf, Reardon and Harder asked to be recorded Nay.
