Substantial Maintenance

A program sufficient to arrest and reverse the decline in the surface condition of highways and bridges

Major Modification

A program sufficient to address the top 16 percent of the existing State Highway system needs

Priority Bridge

A program sufficient to increase the number of Priority Bridge projects by 20 percent

System Enhancements

A limited number of projects to improve safety, relieve congestion, improve access, or enhance economic development

All major modification, priority bridge and system enhancement projects are anticipated to have contracts for construction by June 30, 1997

Physical construction will continue for several years following the awarding of the construction contracts

Fully Funded

- 1. Program is funded through FY 1997
- 2. Construction projects let in FY 1997 and before are funded through the end of construction

The Program, <u>as enacted</u>, requires a decision before the end of FY 1997.

Revenues could be increased or the level

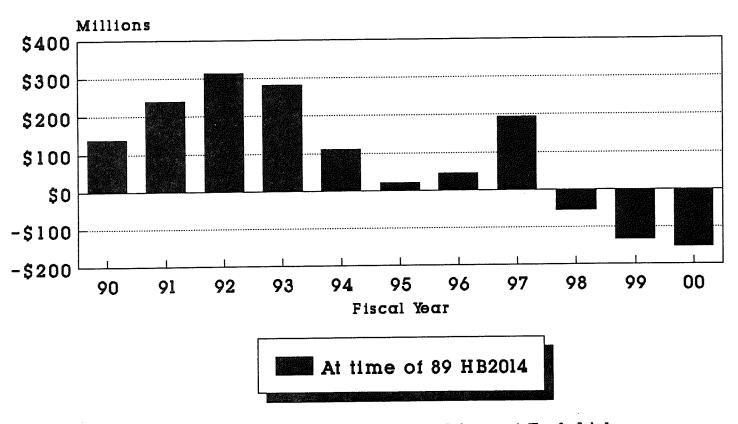

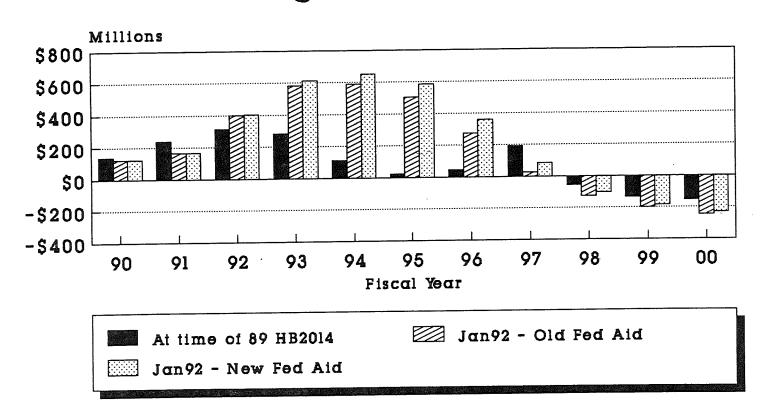

STATE HIGHWAY FUND Ending Cash Balance



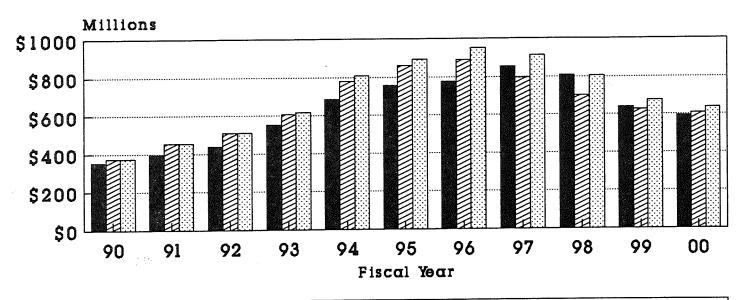

STATE HIGHWAY FUND Ending Cash Balance



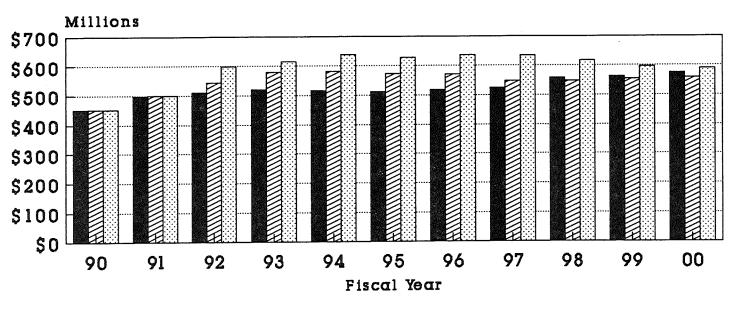

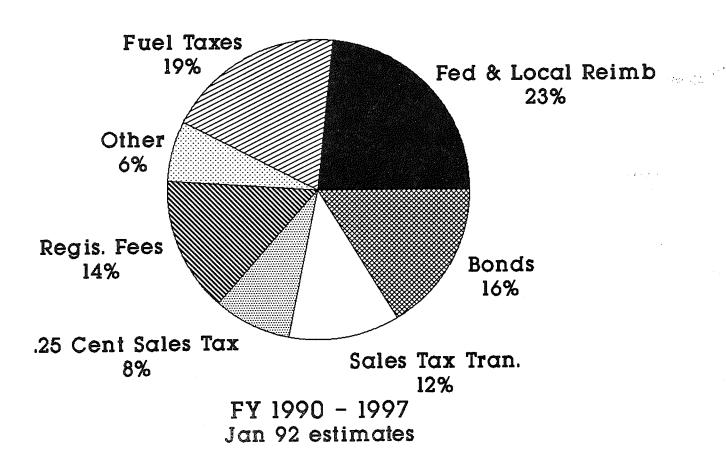
STATE HIGHWAY FUND Total Revenues



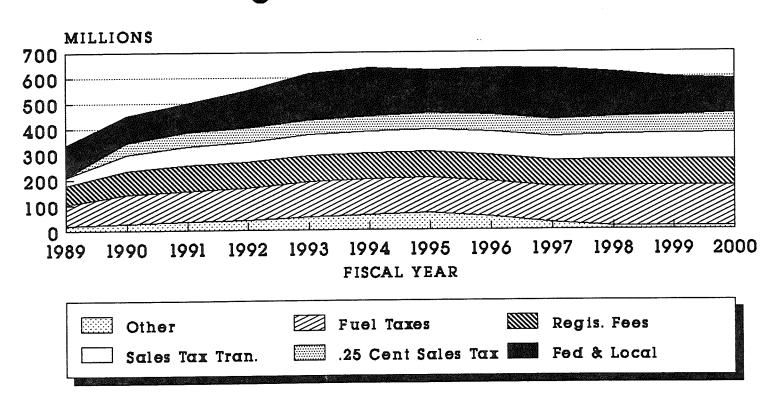

State Highway Fund Total Revenues Including Fed. & Local Reimb.

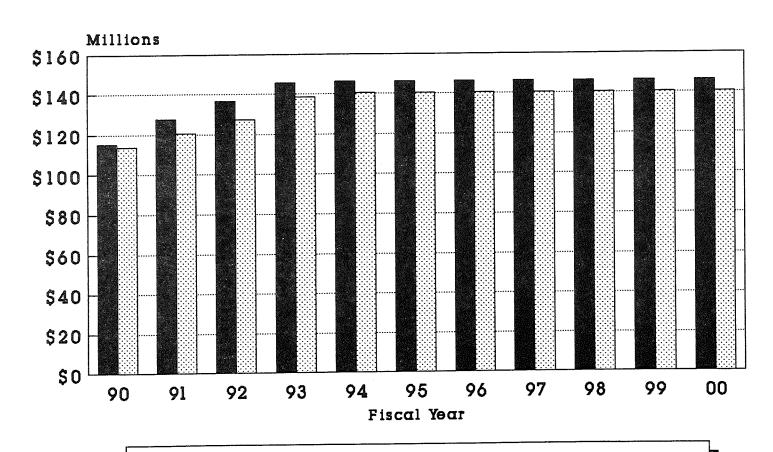


State Highway Fund State Revenues Including Fed. & Local Reimb.

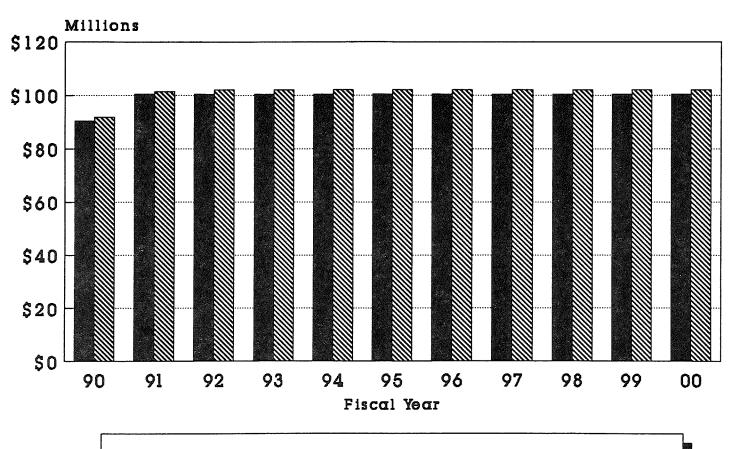
Motor Fuel Taxes

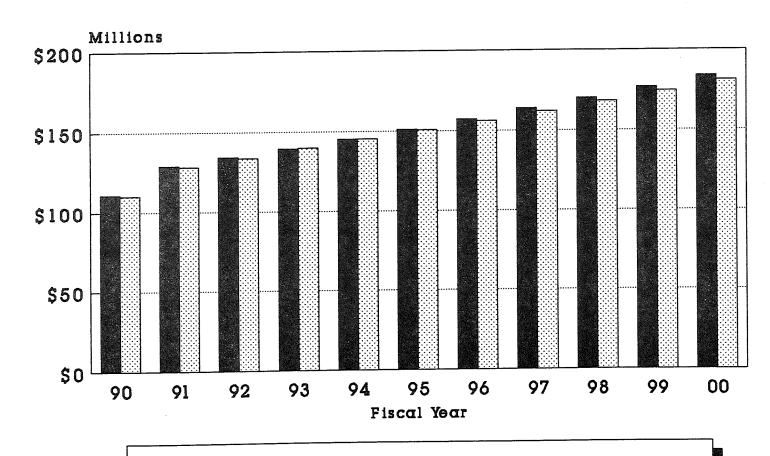
Registration Fees

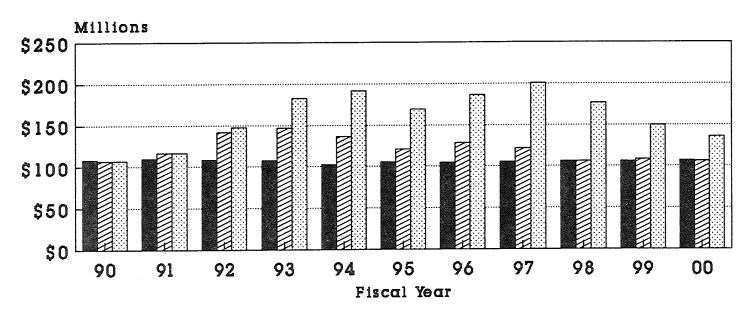

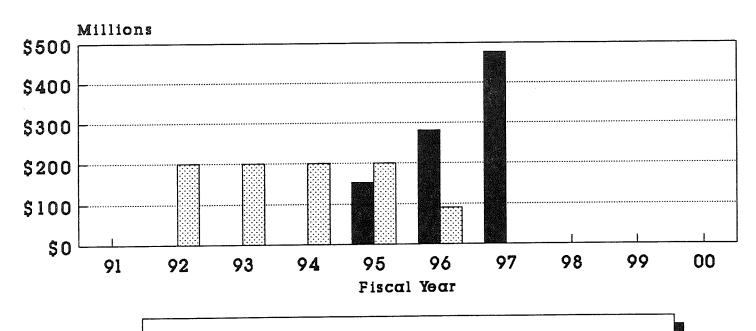
Federal Aid Reimbursement Including Local Contributions

- Increase earnings through legal arbitrage

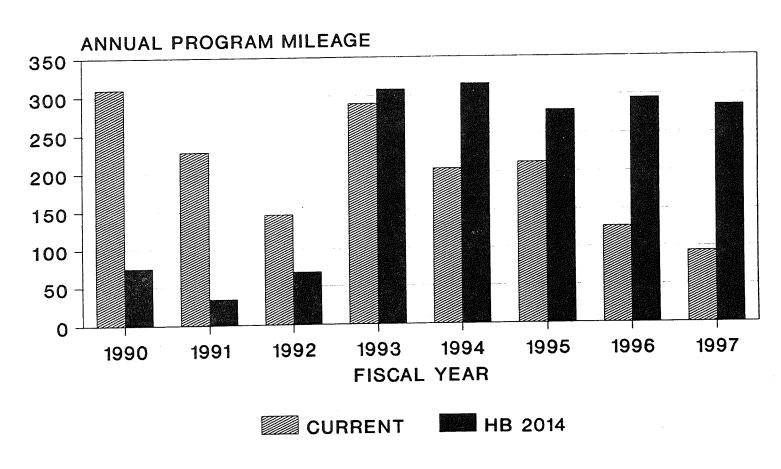
Legal Arbitrage

- Released State Revenue invested above Bond Rates

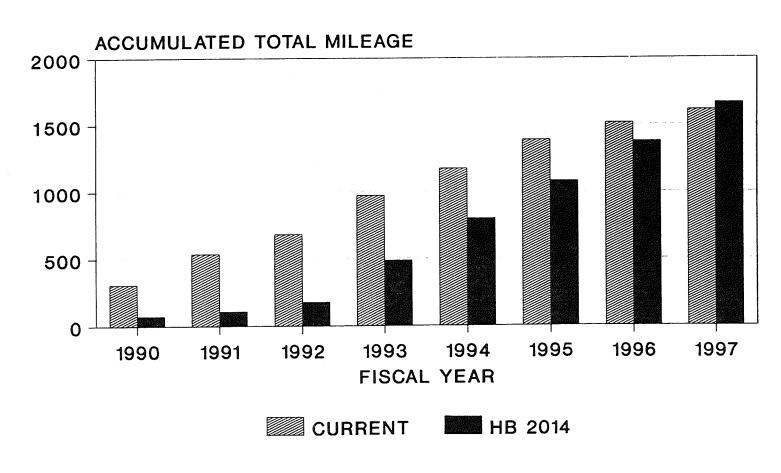

MAJOR MODIFICATION PROGRAM COMPARISON OF MILEAGE CURRENT* VS HB-2014

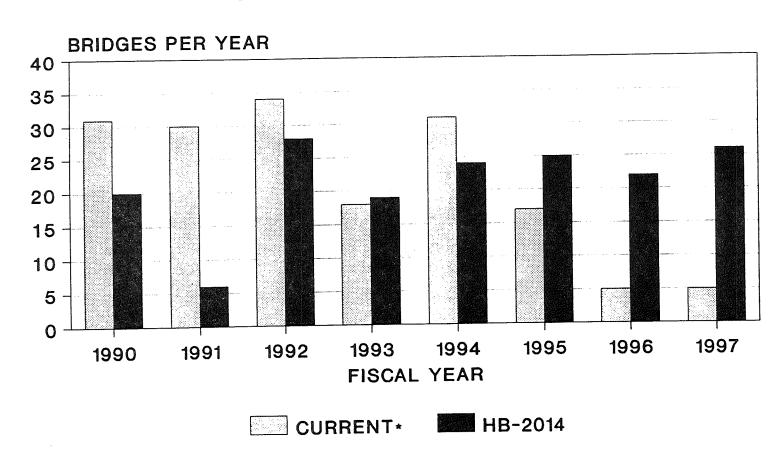


MAJOR MODIFICATION PROGRAM COMPARISON OF MILEAGE CURRENT* VS HB-2014

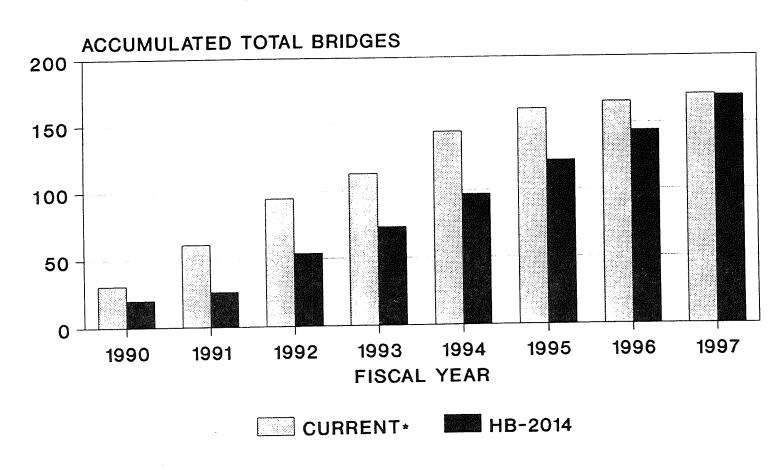

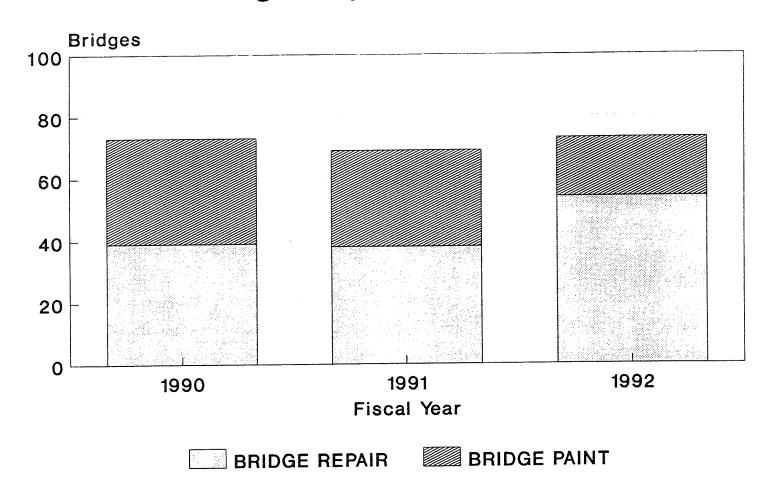
PRIORITY BRIDGE PROGRAM COMPARISON OF CURRENT* VS HB-2014



PRIORITY BRIDGE PROGRAM COMPARISON OF CURRENT* VS HB-2014

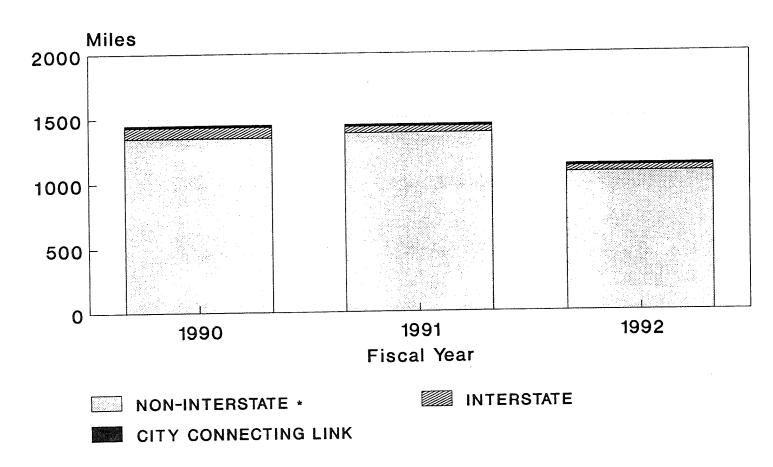


SUBSTANTIAL MAINTENANCE PROGRAM Bridge Repair and Painting



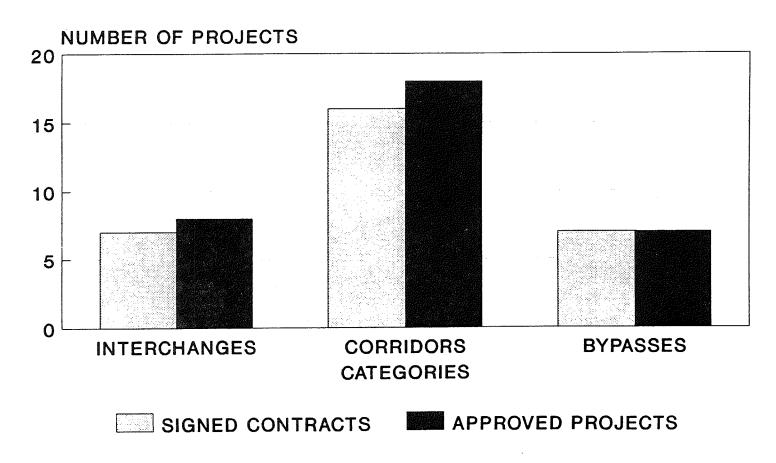

SUBSTANTIAL MAINTENANCE PROGRAM Resurfacing



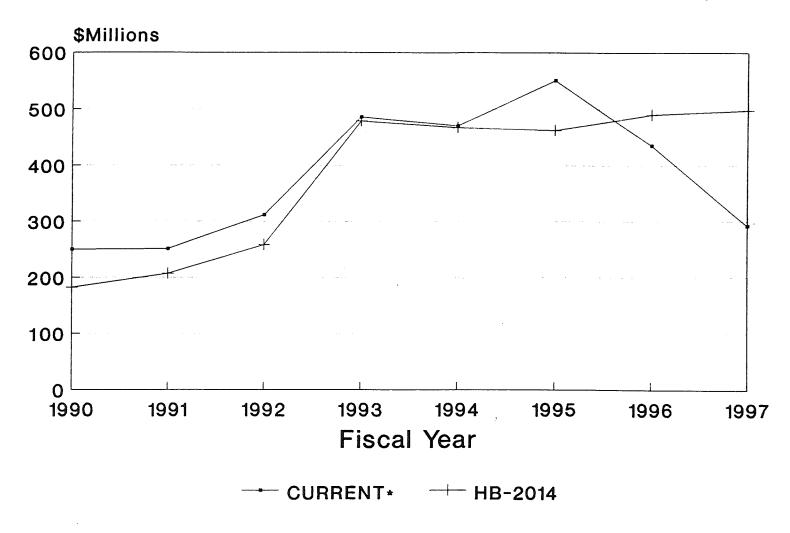
Resurfacing and Contract Maintenance
