RE: Interim Study Requests

Dear President Burke:

The various subcommittees of the Senate Ways and Means Committee, during their review of the various appropriations for State Agencies, has requested the following topics for consideration by the Legislative Coordinating Council. The following are subjects for interim study by the special committees:

- 1. The roll of Community Corrections and its relationship with the sentencing guidelines statutes; the impact upon court service officers and parole officers should they be combined; who should set the agenda and priorities for the program; what will be the fiscal impact of Community Corrections.
- 2. Review the administration of the Child Support Program with particular emphasis on whether it is appropriate to continue the current bifurcated system; which agency should assume primacy; review the program for compliance with federal mandates.
- 3. Study the asset forfeiture regulations and statutes to determine if there is intentional circumvention of that criteria in order to cause ineligible individuals to qualify for unwarranted benefits.
- 4. Review the salary structure of employees of SRS and Corrections to determine the amount of any disparity that might exist between those agencies, especially where both agencies operate on the same campus.
- 5. Review any duplication that might exist between Washburn University and the Regents System; study the results of current practices; determine what conditions might cause suitable merger of Washburn into the system; the physical impact of that merger.

- 6. View the services provided by the various agencies for substance abuse and alcohol treatment including any perceived or actual duplication of effort; determine the total dollars spent in this endeavor and the source of those funds; evaluate the results of those efforts and determine the validity of the continuum of care for the patrons of these services; are their sufficient community based services to supplement or replace state institutions.
- 7. Determine the various components of the workmen's compensation costs and corresponding rapid escalation of premium rates; does the physical therapy statutory mandate component of workmen's compensation cause an undue cost to the system.

Each of the above items was included in the subcommittee report and approved by the full committee for submittal to the Legislative Coordinating Council for their consideration.
