MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Nancy Brown at 1:30 p.m. on January 13, 1993 in Room 521-S of the Capitol.

Committee member, Representative Bryant, and Committee Staff Member, Theresa Kiernan, described their backgrounds and interests pertinent to the work of the committee.

The Chairman then stated the purpose of the meeting was to present an overview of the structure of local units of government.

Michael Heim, Legislative Research Department, described the number and types of local governmental units in Kansas. He distributed reprints "Think Globally, Act Locally," and U.S. Department of Commerce's "Government Organization," (Attachment 2) to aid in the description.

Chris McKenzie, League of Kansas Municipalities, described the basic forms, organization and functions of city governments (<u>Attachments 3 and 4</u>). He also distributed copies of the League's "Handbook for the City Governing Body, copy of which was given to each member.

John Torbert, Kansas Association of Counties, described the basic forms, organization and functions of county government. He offered the services of his organization as a research tool for members of the committee.

The Chairman described the organization and functions of township government and stated she has some historical materials in her office for anyone interested.

Theresa Kiernan, Revisor's Office, briefly described the statutory and common law limitations on city governments, and the Kansas Open Records Act, Incompatability of Office, Conflicts of Interest and Governmental Ethics (<u>Attachments 5 through 7</u>).

Gerry Ray, Johnson County Commission, discussed the opportunities of intergovernmental cooperation and provided examples of cooperative agreements between variousl units of government (<u>Attachment 8</u>).

Throughout the presentations members raised questions about situations they had encountered in their own areas.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:48 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for 1:30 p.m., January 14, 1993, in Room 521-S of the State Capitol.

Think globally, act locally

City & State 2000 part of worldwide economy

America's local governments today have become players in a global market-place.

The economies of today's American jurisdictions are inextricably linked with those abroad, just as the residents of those jurisdictions often are ethnically tied to far-flung countries of the world.

"Think globally, act locally" is the theme of City & State's second annual City & State 2000, the exclusive listing of the country's largest 2,000 units of government, ranked by gross revenues.

Local governments — states, cities, counties, townships, and parishes — wield enormous financial strength in today's world. The economies of these jurisdictions export and import, and are linked to one another and to economies throughout the world.

In the United States, there are more than 24,000 units of government. Taken together, those jurisdictions spend more than \$700 billion annually.

And yet, City & State's 2,000 governmental units make up the lion's share of governmental economic strength; they're responsible for 93% of all local government spending done in any given year. These 2,000 are the units of government that take in the most revenue, spend the most, and keep many local economies afloat.

Government operations are mammoth. If states were private companies competing in the global marketplace, California would be No. 4 on the Fortune 500 list of the largest industrial corporations.

According to a survey by Robert D. Behn of the Governors Center at Duke University, Durham, N.C., in an integrated ranking of the 50 states and Fortune's ranking, every state is "larger" than such well known American corporations as Data General; Gerber Products; William Wrigley, Jr.; Wheeling-Pittsburgh Steel; Cooper Tire & Rubber; Harley Davidson or Bell and Howell.

And, Mr. Behn uses general revenue funds as his measure, an even smaller number than the governmental funds figures used in the City & State 2000.

As we found in the first survey of this type, some cities are larger than states. New York City, for instance, is No. 3 on the list, smaller only than California, No. 1, and New York, No. 2.

Los Angeles, Chicago, Philadelphia, San Francisco, Detroit, Baltimore, Boston, Houston, Memphis and Nashville are all larger than the lowest-ranking state, South Dakota.

And the same is true for counties. Los Angeles County, at No. 22 the nation's largest county, has more revenue than 30 of the states. Dade County, Fla.; Fairfax County, Va.; Orange County, Calif; San Diego County, Calif.; and Montgomery County, Md., are all larger than either Vermont or South Dakota.

Much of the information here is not surprising, although the size of the revenue numbers may be. America's jurisdictions are large economic entities, many even larger than some countries, and they play an important role in the global economy.

Use of 1990 census numbers

This year's City & State 2000 is an up-to-date listing with both revenue and population numbers taken from the 1990 U.S. Census.

The financial numbers are taken from what the Census Bureau calls "fiscal year 1990 total revenues," the funds each government took in during the fiscal period that ended between July 1, 1989, and June 30, 1990.

The only exceptions are Texas, ending August 1990; and Alabama, Washington, D.C. and Michigan, with years

ending September 1990.

The revenue amounts include taxes, charges, federal and state payments, special assessments and interest earnings. By definition, the data "contains revenues from all parts of a government, as the Census Bureau defines that government."

That means that revenue includes enterprise funds, governmental fund money and "charges earned by water and electric utilities and other proprietary-like operations."

Unlike last year, state revenue in this list is solely the revenue for the state, not the cumulative numbers of the state and its cities.

In response to our readers, this year we have been much more inclusive, including townships, many of which, on the East Coast in particular, are larger than towns or cities. Similarly, we have included consolidated parishes, boroughs and parishes that act as counties in various sections of the nation.

Credits, comments

Based on the response we received last year, we're certain government managers will pore over this issue. That's not only because it has interesting trivia about governmental jurisdictions, but because the list gives a hard-hitting, informative look at the business of government.

Particular thanks is given to Henry Wulf, of the U.S. Census Bureau, who once again gave us the necessary help and data to make this project come to life.

We hope you enjoy the *City & State* 2000. We know it will be a useful resource.

INTRODUCTION

A census of governments is taken at 5-year intervals as required by law under title 13, United States Code, Section 161. This 1987 census, similar to those taken since 1957, covers four major subject fields—government organization, taxable property values, public employment, and government finances.

Volume 1, Government Organization, is the first volume of the 1987 Census of Governments to be released. It contains the official counts of the number of State and local governments. It also includes tabulations of governments by State, type of government, size, and county location.

The Government Organization phase of the census, which provides these data, also produces a universe list of governmental units, classified according to type of government, for use in the remaining phases of the census.

ORGANIZATION OF THIS REPORT

In this introductory text, the number, organization, and characteristics of governments are discussed and compared with prior census data. Summary tables and charts accompany the text, followed by a description of census methodology, data sources, and limitations of the data.

After the introductory text are the main tables. Tables 1-4 provide summary data on the number of governments by type and State in 1987 and in prior census years.

Tables 5-20 provide data on the numbers and characteristics of specific types of governments: general-purpose governments, (i.e., counties, municipalities, and townships) in tables 5-10; special district governments in tables 11-15; and public school systems (both school district governments and dependent school systems) in tables 16-20.

Data for designated geographic areas are provided in tables 21-23. Table 21 contains summary data on the numbers and characteristics of local governments inside and outside metropolitan statistical areas (MSA's); table 22 shows the number of intercounty local governments; and, finally, table 23 gives the number of local governments in each of the 3,139 county or county-type areas.

Following the tables is appendix A "Individual State Descriptions," which briefly describes the various local governments authorized in each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. This section is preceded by an explanation of the procedures used to develop the descriptions and an outline of their content and organization.

Appendix B contains the criteria for classifying governments and definitions of various concepts used in this report. Appendix C contains a list of county-type areas without county governments.

A list of the consultants who reviewed the individual State descriptions appears in appendix D.

Changes in Content

This edition of volume 1 reflects some changes in content since the 1982 publication. For the first time, data on selected types of public services owned and operated by general-purpose governments were obtained from all municipal and township governments regardless of population size. Also, information on public facilities was expanded to include those owned and contracted out by county, municipal, or township governments. These data are shown in tables 8-10. Information on the type of operations performed by special district governments and their revenue powers are presented for the first time in tables 14 and 15. Data on the number of intercounty school district governments were not published in volume 1 in 1982 but are included in this report in table 22.

FINDINGS

There were 83,237 governmental units in the United States at the beginning of 1987. In addition to the Federal Government and the 50 State governments, there were 83,186 units of local government. Of these, 38,933 are general-purpose local governments—3,042 county governments, 19,200 municipal governments, and 16,691 township governments. The remainder (over one-half of the total) are limited-purpose local governments, including 14,721 school district governments and 29,532 special district governments.

The average number of local governmental units per State is 1,663 but Illinois has 6,627 while Hawaii has only 18. The following 10 States had more than 3,000 governments each: Illinois, Pennsylvania, Texas, California, Kansas, Minnesota, Ohio, New York, Nebraska, and Missouri. Together these 10 States account for nearly one-half (49 percent) of all governmental units in the Nation. Table 3 shows the number of governments in each State by type of unit.

The total number of governmental units in 1987 was 1,406 more than that reported for the 1982 census, an overall increase of 1.7 percent. Virtually all of the increase is in special district governments, which increased 5.2 percent over the 5-year period.

As shown by summary table A, there has been little change in the number of general-purpose governments compared with the previous five censuses. The number of county governments has remained relatively constant; the

nun f municipal governments continues to increase sligh, while the number of township governments continues to record small declines. Limited-purpose governments, on the other hand, have had dramatic changes: School districts have decreased significantly, although the rate of decline has slowed in recent years; in contrast, there has been a substantial rise in the number of special district governments, which now comprise 35.5 percent of all governments, compared to 20 percent in 1962.

On a State-by-State basis, 34 States recorded increases ranging from 235 to 3 in their number of governments from 1982 to 1987. Three States—California, Montana, and Texas—gained 200 or more governments. These States combined accounted for an increase of 678 governments—48 percent of the total 5-year rise of 1,406 governments. The remainder of the increase was apportioned among 4 States that gained from 100-199 governments, 5 States that gained from 50 to 99 governments and 22 States that showed increases of government units ranging from 1 to 49. Decreases ranging from 242 to 2 occurred in 15 States. Two States had a decrease of more than 100 governments—Pennsylvania with 242 and Nebraska with 172.

Table 1 shows the national count of State and local governments by State and the changes that have occurred in the number of governments over the past 45 years. In addition, table 4 shows the changes that have occurred for each type of government.

TYPES OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

The following paragraphs summarize the findings of the 1987 Census of Governments concerning each of the five major types of local governments.

County Governments

Organized county governments are found throughout the Nation except for Connecticut, Rhode Island, the District of Columbia, and limited portions of other States where certain county areas lack a distinct county government. (See appendix C for a listing of county-type areas

without county government.) In Louisiana, the y governments are officially designated as "parish" governments, and the "borough" governments in Alaska resemble county governments in other States. Both are classified as county governments for census statistics on governments.

The increase from 3,041 in 1982 to 3,042 in 1987 reflects the creation of a new borough in Alaska (Northwest Arctic Borough) and a new county in Arizona (La Paz) which were partially offset by the consolidation of Terrebonne Parish with Houma city in Louisiana. Such city-county consolidations are counted for census statistics on governments as municipal governments.

The number of county governments per State ranges widely, from the Texas total of 254 down to fewer than 20 in several States. This is shown by the following distribution of county governments among the 50 States:

As shown in table 5, there are 167 county governments, located in 38 States, that serve populations of at least 250,000. These 167 county governments, constituting 5.5 percent of all county governments, account for 52 percent of the population served by all county governments in the Nation. The overwhelming majority of county governments (74 percent) each serve fewer than 50,000 persons, and the counties that have fewer than 10,000 inhabitants serve altogether only 4 million persons, a decline of 14 percent since 1977. Summary table B shows the population of areas served by county governments in 1977, 1982, and 1987. Comparison of these figures with earlier size-class distributions of counties reveals a tendency toward increased concentration of population in relatively urban counties and loss of population by numerous rural counties.






Figure 1. Local Governments by Type: 1957 to 1987

Forms of Municipal Government in Kansas

During the first 46 years of statehood, the residents of cities in Kansas had no choice as to the form of government of their cities. By law there was only one form of city government—the mayor-council plan. However, the legislature in 1907 enacted two laws providing for the commission form of government in cities of the first and second class, when approved by popular vote. Six years later, in 1913, the legislature extended this same authority to cities of the third class.

A third option for cities was provided in 1917 when the legislature authorized the commission-manager form of government. Since then, three variations of the manager plan have been authorized by the legislature. The differences among them are not reflected in the powers and duties of the city manager, but rather in the composition and election of the governing body. Further, since 1961 cities have been empowered to provide for their form of government by a constitution-based home rule charter ordinance, such as has occurred in Derby and Kansas City.

The commission form of government reached its peak of popularity in Kansas in 1915, when 43 cities operated under the plan. Since 1926 the commission plan has steadily lost favor and today, only 15 cities have the plan. Since 1921, only one city has adopted the plan—that being Augusta in 1946. Four years later, Augusta abandoned the commission plan.

The manager plan was first authorized in 1917—10 years after the commission plan. The manager plan grew much more slowly than did the commission plan. While 43 cities adopted the commission plan in a seven-year period between 1908 and 1915, it was not until 1969 that an equal number of cities (43) had adopted the manager plan. However, manager plan cities now include nearly 64% of the population of Kansans living within cities.


The three basic forms or plans of city government (mayor-council, commission, and manager) have various modifications, provided for by state law or by home rule charter ordinance. For example, the manager plan includes such variations as council-manager, mayor-council-manager, and commission-manager; in Kansas City it is called the mayor-council-administrator plan, included in this article under the manager plan because of the broad powers of the city administrator. The mayor-council plan includes such variations as the "modified mayor-council plan," used in Greensburg.

Many Kansas cities with the mayor-council or commission form have a city administrator, chief administrative officer or city clerk/administrator, as an office established by ordinance. However, these offices, except in Kansas City, do not meet the common definition of a "full" manager city and are thus not listed as under the manager plan. An article in a future issue of Kansas Government Journal will review the growth of city administrative offices in Kansas cities.







Preface

This is a reference book. It identifies 4,025 governmental taxing units in Kansas, as of 1991. Part I presents a narrative summary of local governments, by type. Part II presents a statistical summary table of governments by county. Part III presents detailed information as to the number and type of units located in each of the 105 counties.

The information in this report is based on League records, a review of county tax levy sheets (1990 for 1991 purposes) and other sources. In most all instances, the information as to tax levying units was verified by county clerks. The information as to active, operating units is believed to be highly reliable. Some difficulty was encountered in obtaining accurate information as to special districts which may be in legal existence but do not currently levy taxes. In addition, reliable information as to local units which cross county lines was difficult to obtain, often as a result of the absence of a consistent common name for the same special district operating in more than one county. This is especially true as to cemetery and fire districts.

The League expresses appreciation to the many county clerks and to the representatives of several agencies and associations who assisted in providing data or statewide information for this report.

SUMMARY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IN KANSAS--1991

1. Introduction

Kansas has a lot of governmental units--some 4,025. In addition to the state and national government, there are 2,146 general purpose local units and 1,879 limited purpose school and special districts with taxing powers. These totals exclude many special districts that do not have property tax powers.

The average number of governmental units per state is 1,663, according to a 1987 survey by the Bureau of the Census. Only the states of Illinois, Pennsylvania, Texas and California, in that rank order, have more local governments than Kansas. However, if special districts without property tax powers are excluded from the Bureau's figures, Kansas ranks 2nd highest in the nation, exceed only by Illinois. (For other Kansas rankings, see section 8, below, entitled "Local Units--How Kansas Compares Nationally".)

3. What's a Government?

For the purpose of this report, a governmental unit is a public agency with the power of taxation. Such a governmental unit has a defined jurisdiction, an elected or appointed governing body, the power to raise and spend public funds, and the legal authority to perform one or more public functions or services. A governmental taxing unit may be distinguished from that which is commonly called a "political subdivision". A political subdivision has a territorial jurisdiction, usually has a governing board, may spend public funds for one or more purposes, may have authority to raise revenue by levying special assessments, fees or service charges, but lacks independent authority to levy property or other general taxes. Sometimes, the distinction is not clear, such as a recreation commission or library board which may legally certify a tax, but are not considered a separate governmental taxing unit for the purpose of this report. Kansas has many political subdivisions that are sometimes called governments but are not taxing units--see Section 7, below, entitled "Political Subdivisions."

4. Cross-county Districts.

While most local units in Kansas are either countywide or are located entirely within a county, there are 398 units of government which have parts in two or more counties. These 398 cross-county units collectively constitute 1,054 taxing districts. Except for county government, townships, conservation districts and a few other types, most of the different types of local units in Kansas are sometimes found in two or more counties. For example, only 103 of the 304 school districts in Kansas have boundaries totally within one county. The remaining 201 districts are formed from 540 county "parts". Fire districts, drainage districts, watershed districts and regional libraries are other examples of special districts which frequently cross county lines.

5. Summary of Governmental Types

Following are brief descriptions of the various local governments operating in Kansas. As noted above, these do not include political subdivisions or other agencies lacking tax authority.

5-A. County Governments

The 105 county governments in Kansas were created by state law, and the current total has remained constant since 1893, with only minor changes made in boundaries. The total population of the 105 counties is 2,477,574. Counties vary in population from Greeley with 1,774 to Sedgwick with 403,662. There are 32 counties with a population of less than 5,000 and nine with a population of over 50,000. The median size county (Russell), has 7,835 residents.

State laws applicable to counties are found primarily in K.S.A. Chapter 19. The principal, general public service functions common to all counties are law enforcement and road maintenance. Counties serve as an administrative agency of the state as well as a local government, and some county officers perform state assigned functions. For example, the county treasurer is involved in county government financial procedures, but also collects and distributes tax moneys of the state and local governments in a trust capacity. Kansas counties spend about \$1 billion annually and employ about 15,450 full-time employees.

5-B. City Governments

The 627 cities in Kansas are municipal corporations, incorporated by the residents of a defined area under certain minimum state standards. Most Kansans live within cities (79.3

percent of the total), which have a combined population of 1,963,658. Cities vary in population from 8 in Freeport to 304,011 in Wichita. There are 26 cities with less than 50 people and 50 with over 5,000. The median size city has a population of 1,870. The average county has about six cities. The number of cities per county varies from one each in Grant, Lane, Scott and Wichita up to 18 complete cities and two parts of cities in both Johnson and Sedgwick.

There are 24 cities of the first class (usually over 15,000), 88 cities of the second class (usually 2,000 to 15,000), and 515 cities of the third class. However, the legal classification of a city is not very relevant to its powers. The principal statutes affecting cities are found in Chapters 12 through 15 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated. Cities, like Kansas state government, have powers conferred on them directly by the people through the Constitution (Article 12, Section 5, the "Home Rule Amendment"). Cities provide a wide variety of public services, spend about \$2 billion annually, and collectively employ about 16,700 full-time employees.

5-C. Township Governments

Kansas has 1,414 townships, some of which are not active. Townships, found in 20 of the 50 states, have existed in Kansas since the beginning of statehood. The number of townships increased from 365 in 1870 to a peak of 1,552 in 1930, and has gradually declined since then-by 124 since 1970. All the geographical area of Kansas is within a township or within a city of the second or first class. The number of townships varies from a minimum of one in Kiowa and Wichita counties to a high of 31 in Reno county. The average county has about 13.5 townships.

The population of Kansas townships, net of all cities, is 513,916--equal to 20.7 percent of the state total. There are 101 townships with a population of less than 50 and seven with more than 5,000 people, the largest being Riverside (14,364) in Sedgwick county. Most larger populated townships are located adjacent to cities. The average Kansas township has a population of about 363, excluding cities of the third class.

Like counties, townships in Kansas were created largely on the basis of straight line geographic areas (survey townships). The basic legal authority of township governments is found in K.S.A. Chapter 80. The principal township officer is the trustee. Many Kansas townships are inactive; some are effectively dormant, with no active officers. The principal function of many townships (in the 35 counties using the township road system) is road maintenance. A few townships provide library, fire protection and cemetery service, but these same functions are often provided by special districts, of which the township is a part. The total expenditures of all townships is about \$25 million annually.

5-D. Unified School Districts

The 304 unified school districts in Kansas (including Fort Leavenworth) cover the entire state. The first state legislature of Kansas in 1861 directed county superintendents to divide their counties into a convenient number of school districts. The number of school districts peaked at 9,284 in 1896. Voluntarily and mandated consolidations occurred since that time, with a 1963 law and subsequent legislation providing for the creation of unified school districts throughout the state.

Many school districts are large in area, with Comanche, Greeley, Hamilton and Stanton counties having either one district or constituting a part of only one district. The county with the largest number of school districts is Sedgwick with five full districts and parts of 15 others.

There are 103 districts with territory entirely within one county, with the remaining 201 districts including areas (540 parts) in more than one county.

Basic state laws governing school districts are found in K.S.A. Chapter 72. School districts provide an education program for students from kindergarten through 12th grade and often participate in area vocational schools and special education cooperatives. The state board of education has general supervision over local public schools. Unified school districts employ about 50,000 employees (FTE) and spend about \$2 billion annually.

5-E. Community College Districts

There are 19 community college districts in Kansas, each of which is located in a different county except in Montgomery which has two (Coffeyville and Independence). Community colleges, formerly called junior colleges, date back to 1919 (Fort Scott and Garden City). Existing community college districts operate under K.S.A. Chapter 71. They provide comprehensive and diversified programs of two-year post secondary education and some are involved in area vocational school programs. Community college districts operate under the general supervision of the state board of education. Property taxes levied for community college purposes for 1991 totaled about \$51 million.

5-F. Regional Libraries

There are seven regional library systems in Kansas, established pursuant to K.S.A. 75-2547 et seq. All or parts of 81 counties participate in these systems. Any taxing district within a participating county which regularly levies 1/4 mill or more for a public library may be excluded from the tax. A governing body of representatives of cooperating libraries administers the services provided to its participating libraries, and may levy a property tax for this purpose.

There are other library districts in Kansas. These are reported below under the heading "Other Special Districts."

5-G. Cemetery Districts

There are 728 active cemetery districts in Kansas, organized to establish and maintain local cemeteries. Some counties have no cemetery districts; the largest number is found in Clay county, with 30 cemetery districts and seven parts. Such districts are normally established under K.S.A. 15-1013 et seq., 17-1330 et seq., or 17-1342 et seq. Frequently, a cemetery district includes a township and a city of third class. Some districts appear to be essentially township cemeteries, but function as districts. The 728 cemetery districts levied about \$2 million in property taxes for 1991 purposes.

5-H. Fire Districts

There are 323 active fire districts in Kansas. The number by county varies from none in 14 counties to Morris county with 11 full districts and two parts. There are at least 44 fire districts which cross county lines.

There are several state laws under which fire districts are created, primarily in article 36 of K.S.A. Chapter 19 and in Article 15 of K.S.A. Chapter 80. Usually, they are created by petition of the residents, with formal action by the board of county commissioners or a township board. As in the case of cemeteries, it is sometimes difficult to distinguish whether a fire department

operation is a township government function or whether a separate district exists; the latter is commonly found in those townships in which there is located a city of the third class. Most fire department operations in Kansas are city departments, many of which contract with districts or townships to provide fire protection service.

5-I. Hospital Districts

There are 32 hospital districts in Kansas, with such districts covering all or parts of 26 different counties. This total excludes city hospitals, and county hospitals not on a district basis. Of the 32 districts, at least three are inactive, one operates a clinic, two operate a nursing home and one provides an ambulance service. Hospital district laws, recodified in 1984, are found in K.S.A. 80-2501 et seq. and 80-2550 et seq.

5-J. Drainage Districts

There are at least 77 drainage districts in Kansas. There are probably more in legal existence, some of which are currently dormant. The 77 known districts are located within 31 counties, primarily in the eastern part of the state. Most counties have none; three counties have six whole drainage districts. They are formed under K.S.A. Chapter 24, Articles 4, 5 and 6, and their principal function is flood protection. Such districts may levy special assessments as well as taxes and may issue bonds. Some of the drainage districts maintain Corps of Engineering flood protection works. A few have territory within cities, largely as a result of past annexations.

5-K. Sewer Districts

There are at least 74 sewer districts now operating in Kansas. Sewer districts are found in 18 different counties. Most counties do not have a sewer district since they are typically found in areas adjacent to larger cities or in residential areas adjacent to a lake. The principal act for the formation of county sewer districts is K.S.A. 19-27a01 et seq. Township sewer districts may be formed under K.S.A. 80-2001 et seq.

5-L. Conservation Districts

The 105 conservation districts in Kansas are organized along county lines. They operate under K.S.A. 2-1901 et seq., with the primary function of developing comprehensive soil conservation plans for landowners. County governments may allocate general fund money to the district or levy a special tax for this purpose. While a conservation district is often considered a political subdivision of the county, they have a separate governing body and the power to sue and be sued, make contracts and own property.

5-M. Watershed Districts

There are 95 watershed districts in Kansas, some of which are inactive. Only 35 of these are located entirely within one county, with the balance including parts of two or more counties, depending on the location of the watershed. Most of them are in eastern Kansas. These districts are formed under K.S.A. 24-1201 et seq., with the primary function of reducing erosion, controlling floods and reducing sedimentation through dams. State grants for such districts are administered through the state conservation commission and federal grants have also been available.

5-N. Special Improvement Districts

There are 26 improvement districts in Kansas, located in 12 counties, with nine of them in Sedgwick county. Most improvement districts are located in urban areas. Improvement districts are formed under K.S.A. 19-2753 et seq. Their board of directors is elected and such districts have power to levy taxes and special assessments and to issue bonds for public facilities like streets, sewers and water service. The extent of their activity varies, some are inactive.

5-O. Other Special Districts

In addition to the units noted above, which are shown by county of location on the accompanying table, there are 89 other special districts found in 57 counties. These are reviewed below.

- 5-0-(1) Airport Authorities. There are four airport authorities in Kansas, constituting separate governmental units. These include the Salina airport authority in Saline county organized under K.S.A. 27-315 et seq., the metropolitan Topeka airport authority in Shawnee county operating under K.S.A. 27-327 et seq., the Herrington airport authority located in Morris county and the newly formed Pratt airport authority in Pratt county. Separate property taxes were not levied for 1991 purposes by the Herington and Pratt airport authority. The Wichita airport authority, under K.S.A. 3-162 et seq., is not an independent governmental unit.
- 5-0-(2) **Ambulance Districts.** There are six ambulance districts located within three counties. These include two in Chautauqua county, one in Geary and three in Wabaunsee. K.S.A. 65-6118 authorizes the establishment of ambulance service taxing districts in any county, with the county board constituting the governing body of the district.
- 5-0-(3) **Community Building Districts.** There are three community building districts in Kansas: Udall in Cowley and Sumner counties, Portis in Osborne and Smith counties and Palmer in Washington county. K.S.A. 15-11b01 provides for the creation of such districts, on petition of the electors, by any city of the third class and the surrounding area of not more than six square miles. The district is governed by a seven-member board of directors elected at annual meetings, to manage, operate and maintain a community building.
- 5-0-(4) **County Rural Road Systems.** There are two county rural road systems in Kansas, found in Leavenworth and Pottawatomie counties. Such districts are authorized by K.S.A. 68-591 <u>et seq.</u> Under this arrangement, all the township roads in the county are turned over to the county, which levies a special tax on property within townships, outside of cities. Since the jurisdiction and taxing authority does not apply to incorporated cities, it is considered to be a special district.
- 5-0-(5) **Industrial Districts.** There are two industrial districts in Kansas, located in Finney and Reno counties. They are formed under K.S.A. 19-3801 <u>et seq.</u> Such districts have powers similar to cities to provide services and facilities and are effectively designed to give special tax breaks for industries.
- 5-0-(6) **Irrigation Districts.** There are seven irrigation districts in Kansas, each of which has territory in more than one county. There are 14 counties containing areas included within an irrigation district. Such districts may be formed under the provisions of K.S.A. 42-357 <u>et seq.</u>, enacted in 1891, or K.S.A. 42-701 <u>et seq.</u>, enacted in 1941. All of the existing districts were

created under the 1941 law, which provides for a three-member board of directors with authority to levy general property taxes and special assessments on property within the irrigation district.

The existing districts, including those inactive but apparently in legal existence, are Kirwin No. 1 in Osborne, Phillips and Smith; Kansas-Bostwick No. 2 in Jewell and Republic; Webster No. 4 in Osborne and Rooks; Almena No. 5 in Norton and Phillips; Cedar Bluff No. 6 in Ellis and Trego; Kanopolis No. 7 in Ellsworth, McPherson and Saline; and Glen Elder No. 8 in Cloud, Mitchell and Ottawa. Glen Elder No. 3 was abolished in 1955.

5-0-(7) **Library Districts.** There are 37 library districts in Kansas, in addition to the regional cooperating library systems noted above. This total <u>excludes</u> the many city libraries throughout the state, which are not considered to be an independent taxing unit for the purpose of this report.

There are several statutes under which library districts are formed, including K.S.A. 12-1215, 12-1218, 12-1223, 12-1231, 12-1236, 72-1623, 75-2547 and their successive sections of the statutes. The library districts in Hutchinson, Salina and Topeka are considered separate taxing districts, since they have clear independent taxing power and the authority to own property. There are 19 county libraries which are considered to be special library districts, since the tax levied for library purposes is not necessarily applied countywide. County libraries are found in these counties: Coffee, Finney, Graham, Grant, Gray, Greeley, Hamilton, Johnson, Kearny, Kiowa, Lane, Lyon, Morton, Pawnee, Scott, Stanton, Stevens, Wichita and Wyandotte. Most county libraries are located in the more rural, western counties. Pottawatomie and Wabaunsee counties have a regional library district. A common form of library district is one that involves a township and a city of the third class. There are 14 township, city-township or non-county library districts, found in Comanche (2), Doniphan, Geary, Leavenworth (2), Linn (3), Lyon, Marion, McPherson, Meade and Miami.

- 5-0-(8) Lighting Districts. There are nine street lighting districts in Kansas, located in seven counties. Those include Garland in Bourbon county, Neal in Greenwood, Centerville in Linn, Bucyrus and Hillsdale in Miami, Ada and Wells in Ottawa, Pauline in Shawnee, and Piqua in Woodson county. Such districts are formed under K.S.A. 19-2716 et seq., to provide lighting in platted but unincorporated areas. An annual tax is levied on property within the district. The "governing body" is either the township board or county board of commissioners. Since a township or county tax levy must be townshipwide or countywide, absent a special district, it appears such lighting districts constitute a governmental taxing unit.
- 5-0-(9) Municipal University, Vocational School Districts. In addition to unified school districts and community college districts, only the Cowley County Area Vocational Technical School and Washburn Municipal University of Topeka in Shawnee county are considered, for the purposes of this report, to be a separate governmental taxing unit.
- 5-0-(10) Park and/or Recreation, Museum Districts. There are three park and/or recreation districts operating as governmental units. The Johnson county park and recreation district operates under K.S.A. 19-2859 et seq. A recreation district operates in Lyon county; the West Smith county recreation district includes parts of Smith and Phillips counties. For the purpose of this report, a recreation commission organized under K.S.A. 12-1902 et seq. is not considered a governmental taxing unit. In addition, a historical museum within U.S.D. 499 in Cherokee county is reported as a special taxing district.

- 5-0-(11) **Township Zoning Districts.** There are nine township zoning boards which levied a property tax for 1991 and are therefore considered to be governmental taxing units. These are all located in Miami county and may be abolished at the end of 1991. Township zoning boards are created under K.S.A. 19-2901. Under K.S.A. 19-2911, the zoning board prepares an annual budget and may certify a property tax.
- 5-0-(12) **Transit Authorities.** The metropolitan transit authority of Topeka in Shawnee county is the one taxing unit of this type in Kansas. The authority in Wichita is not generally considered to be a separate governmental unit. The Kansas City area transportation district and authority is not considered a governmental unit since it does not levy a property tax in Kansas. Transit authorities are created under Article 28 of K.S.A. Chapter 12.
- 5-0-(13) Water and/or Sewer Districts. In addition to the various water and sewerage districts noted above, there are three other water/sewer districts operating in Kansas. These include one water district in Geary county, and two sewer and water districts in Riley county.

6. County Comparisons

The accompanying table shows the number of governmental units by county. The average Kansas county has 38.3 units. The number of units tends to increase with population, with several exceptions. Wichita county has the fewest, with five full units within the county and parts of three other units. Sedgwick has the most, with 78 full units and 26 parts.

Counties with a gross total (whole units plus parts) of less than 20 include Cheyenne (18), Comanche (17), Grant (12), Greeley (12) Hamilton (18), Haskell (14), Kiowa (16), Morton (17), Scott (16), Seward (19), Stanton (11), Stevens (18), Trego (19), Wallace (15), Wichita (8), and Wyandotte (19).

Counties with a gross total of 80 or more units include Clay (81), Dickinson (87), Jefferson (84), Johnson (78), Marion (83), Marshall (83), Reno (97) and Sedgwick (104).

7. Political Subdivisions

While a governmental unit or a governmental-taxing unit is sometimes called a political subdivision, not all political subdivisions are governmental units or taxing units. The discussion under the heading "What's a Government?", above, attempts to distinguish the two types. However, the distinguishing line is sometimes thin. An example is the county cooperative extension council and the county conservation district--public agencies which exist in every county and which have a "governing body" separate from the board of county commissioners. For the purpose of this report, a conservation district is considered a governmental unit, but an extension council is not. While conservation districts do not have independent taxation power, they are recognized by law as distinct local governments. With a few such exceptions, a public agency must have independent taxing power to be classified as a governmental unit.

Some libraries are clearly governmental units and some are clearly political subdivisions, and some seem to fall in between. For the purpose of this report, a city library board (even though it has a governing body and some other attributes of a governmental unit) is not considered a governmental unit, except for the library systems in Hutchinson, Salina and Topeka which are clearly separate taxing units. Some county libraries are clearly separate governmental districts, when the library tax is not spread countywide, while others seem to be more of a subordinate

agency of the county government. Since this distinction is not always apparent, all known county public libraries, for which a tax is levied, are considered to be taxing units.

Kansas has hundreds of political subdivisions and special districts without independent power of taxation. (In addition, there are many hundreds of boards, commissions and associations, like a city planning commission or library board, which are sometimes identified as public agencies.) While some of the agencies listed below do not constitute a legal "political subdivision," they are listed here primarily for the purpose of showing examples of public agencies which are excluded from this report.

8. Local Units--How Kansas Compares Nationally

The following presents comparative information as to local governments in Kansas and in the 50 states. The numbers applicable to Kansas are based on this study. Data for other states is based on the report "Governmental Organization, Volume I," 1987 Census of Governments, issued by the Bureau of the Census of the U.S. Department of Commerce in September 1988.

<u>Local Taxing Units.</u> Nationally, excluding Kansas, there are 62,766 local taxing units. With the addition of the 4,025 Kansas units identified in the report, there would be a national total of 66,791, an average of 1,336 per state. If only taxing units are compared, Kansas ranks 2nd, exceeded only by Illinois.

<u>Counties.</u> Kansas has 105 of the 3,042 U.S. counties. There are two states (Connecticut and Rhode Island) that do not have counties. The average of the 48 states with counties is 63.4 per state. Kansas ranks 5th, with only Georgia, Kentucky, Missouri and Texas having more counties.

<u>Cities.</u> The 627 cities in Kansas are part of a national total of 19,200 incorporated municipalities, which include villages and towns in some states. Kansas ranks 8th highest. The average state total is 384.

<u>Townships.</u> The 1,414 townships in Kansas are part of a total of 16,691 (The Bureau report includes only 1,360 active townships in Kansas). However, only 20 states have townships and the average number in these states is 834.6. Kansas ranks 4th, exceeded in total only by Illinois, Minnesota and Pennsylvania.

<u>School Districts.</u> The 324 school districts in Kansas, including 304 USDs, 19 community colleges and Washburn Municipal University of Topeka, are part of a national total of 14,721. (There are also 1,492 "dependent" public school <u>systems</u> in the U.S., for a total of 16,213). There are five states that do not have separate school districts, resulting in an average number of 327.1 districts per state in the remaining 45 states. Of the 14,721 public school districts in the nation, Kansas ranks 18th.

Special Districts. The Bureau of Census' 1987 survey reported that Kansas had 1,387 special districts, excluding school districts, of which 639 had property taxing powers and 748 did not. The League study identifies the existence of 1,556 such special districts, with taxing powers. Using only the Bureau report of 639 taxing special districts in Kansas, as part of a similar 12,167 U.S. total, still leaves Kansas ranked 7th highest. The Bureau's reported 1,387 total of special districts in Kansas, including those with and without taxing powers, is part of a national total of 29,532 such special districts. Using these totals, Kansas ranks 5th in the nation. If the League total of 1,556 special district taxing units (excluding schools) is used, Kansas ranks 2nd, exceeded only by California with 1,677. (Some of the principal differences in the League vs. Bureau of Census counts relate to fire districts (League-323; Bureau-apparently 0) and cemetery districts (League-728; Bureau-???).

GOVERNMENTAL TAXING UNITS IN KANSAS BY COUNTY

The accompanying table lists each Kansas county, its 1991 state-certified population and the number of governmental units therein by type.

When a county has only part of a unit, this is shown after a plus (+) mark. A single number indicates that number of units of the column type that is wholly located therein. For example, if a county has one city entirely within its boundaries, and part of another city which crosses its county line, it would be listed as "1+1." In the case of regional library systems, each of which cover more than one county, the existence of part of a regional library is shown by a "P," for part.

Since some units operate in two counties or more, the net total cannot be calculated from the table. Only 3,627 units of the total of 4,025 are located entirely within a county. The remaining 398 units are made up of 1,055 parts.

PART III

COUNTY INVENTORY OF GOVERNMENTAL TAXING UNITS

Explanation of Data

The following sheets present information as to the governmental taxing units located in each Kansas county, listed alphabetically.

The population figures listed after each county, and the cities and townships therein, is the 1991 population certified by the state in July, 1991. The listed individual township population includes the population of any city of the third class located within the township, in accordance with U.S. Bureau of the Census practices. Thus, the population data in the right hand column as to cities and townships will not add up to the total population of the county if there is any city of the third class located in that county. The <u>net</u> total population of townships in each county, exclusive of cities of the third class, is shown within parenthesis (e.g., 4,153 in Allen County).

The number of each type of governmental unit located within the county is shown in parentheses (e.g., 9 cities in Allen County). If all of the geographic territory of the unit is located entirely within the county, a single whole number is given. If a part of a unit is also located in another county, the number is shown following a plus mark (+).

For unified school districts, the fact that a district is located in two or more counties is shown by identifying such counties. For example, in Allen County, the following appears: "No. 258 Humboldt -- also Woodson". This means that a part of District No. 258 is located in Allen County and a part in Woodson County. Where the "home county" of the district is another county, this is shown by parenthesis. For example, in Allen County, the following appears: "No. 413 - (Neosho)". This means that while No. 413 has some area in Allen County, the official home of the district is in Neosho County.

Where the information was available, the "other county" of location is noted for those units that cross county lines. An exception is watershed districts and the regional library systems where cross county districts are so common as to require disproportionate space if individually listed.

Re: Kansas Open Records Act

The Kansas open records act (KORA) located in K.S.A. 45-215 et seq. declares it to be the public policy of the state that public records shall be open for inspection by any person. The act gives the public the right to inspect and copy public records unless specifically provided otherwise by law or court order.

Which local units of government are subject to KORA?

KORA applies to any political or taxing subdivision of the state and any office, officer, agency or instrumentality thereof and any other entity receiving or spending and supported in whole or in part by public funds which are appropriated by the state or a political or taxing subdivision of the state.

KORA does not apply to an officer or employee of a political or taxing subdivision of the state if the political or taxing subdivision does not provide the officer or employee with an office which is open to the public at least 35 hours a week.

Records subject to KORA.

KORA defines "public records" as any recorded information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is made, maintained

or kept by or is in the possession of any public agency.

There are 38 exemptions listed in KORA (K.S.A. 45-221). There is no statutory duty to provide access to the records exempted under the act, but the exemption may be lost by the public distribution or public reference to a record.

Some of the exemptions include:

- (a) Records which are made, maintained or kept by an individual who is a member of the governing body of the public agency;
- (b) correspondence between a public agency and a private individual, unless it gives notice of some action or is widely distributed to the public or discussed in an open meeting;
- (c) governing body records pertaining to proposed legislation; and
- (d) governing body records pertaining to research prepared for a governing body member.

Access to Records.

Any person may inspect public records during the regular office hours of the public agency and during additional time provided by the office. Written requests containing the name and address of the requestor and enough information to ascertain the records sought may be required. A disclaimer of commercial use of a list of names also may be required.

If possible, access to records shall be immediate and no later than the end of the third business day following the date of request. A detailed explanation is required for delays beyond three days along with a statement when the record will be made available.

A person has the right to have copies of the records made upon advance payment of any required fee.

If a record contains material not subject to disclosure, the public agency is required to delete such material prior to release of other information.

Requestors do not have the right to require a public agency to create a report to satisfy their request.

Duties of local units of government under KORA.

KORA requires a public agency to:

- (a) Adopt procedures for public inspection of records consistent with KORA;
- (b) provide "suitable facilities" to be used by the public for inspecting records;
- (c) appoint record custodians;
- (d) see that requests for records are handled "as soon as possible" (generally within three business days of the date of the request);
- (e) allow copying of public records, with some limited exceptions; and
- (f) prohibit the use of public records to derive lists of names to be used for commercial purposes.

Penalties for violation of KORA.

Failure to comply with the provisions of KORA constitutes nonfeasance or misfeasance of office and serves as the basis for recall and ouster.

Attorneys fees may be awarded.

It is a class C misdemeanor to knowingly sell, give or receive, for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any property or service to persons listed therein, any list of names and addresses contained in or derived from public records.

Re: Incompatibility of Office

There is no general prohibition against dual office holding. One person may hold more than one office at the same time unless there is a constitutional or statutory prohibition or unless the offices are deemed incompatible under the common law doctrine of incompatibility of office.

Incompatibility test.

Since it is difficult to define incompatibility the court has established certain tests for determining incompatibility of office. Incompatibility occurs when:

- (a) The performance of the duties of one office in some way interferes with the duties of the other i.e. an inconsistency in the function of the two offices;
 - (b) one office is subordinate to the other; or
- (c) one office operates as a check and balance upon the other.

Kansas constitutional provisions prohibiting dual officeholding.

Justices of the Kansas Supreme Court and judges of the district court shall not hold "any other office of profit or

trust under the authority of the state, or the United States, except as may be provided by laws or practice law during their continuance in office" (Article 3, Section 13).

Members of Congress or civil officers or employees of the United States are not eligible to a seat in the legislature and if a state legislator is elected to Congress or appointed to any office under the United States his acceptance vacates his or her seat (Article 12, Section 5).

Kansas statutes prohibiting dual officeholding.

City governing Body: Commissioners and mayors in cities of the first and second class shall not hold any office of profit or trust under state or federal law or hold any county or other city office (K.S.A. 13-1802 and 14-1302).

Civil Service Commissioners: Commission members in cities of the first class cannot hold or be a candidate for "any office or public trust" (K.S.A. 13-2201, 13-2204).

Library Board: No person holding office in a municipality shall be appointed a member of the library board (K.S.A. 12-1222)

Cemetery Board: No person holding "any official position under the city" shall be appointed a director of the cemetery board (K.S.A. 12-1420, applicable to cities of the second and third class).

<u>Urban Renewal:</u> Commissioners or officers of any urban renewal agency, board or commission exercising urban renewal powers shall not hold "any other public office under the municipality" (K.S.A. 17-4758).

County Commissioners: No person holding any state, county, township or city office shall be eligible to the office of county commissioner. Appointments may be made to state boards, etc., established pursuant to statute (K.S.A. 19-205).

County Attorney: A county attorney cannot hold any judicial or other county office (K.S.A. 19-705).

County Treasurer: No sheriff, probate judge, county attorney, county clerk, clerk of the district court, or the deputy of any of them, nor any member of the board of county commissioners can hold the office of county treasurer (K.S.A. 19-505).

Metropolitan Transit Authority: Members of the board or employees of the authority cannot hold any other office or employment under the federal, state or any county or municipal government except an honorary office without compensation (K.S.A. 12-2815). The secretary of the transit authority "shall not be

engaged in any other business or employment during his or her tenure" (K.S.A. 12-2820).

State Classified Service: Any officer or employee in the state classified service shall resign from the service upon filing as a candidate for an elective office, unless the elective office filed for is a township elective office, a county elective office, an elective office in the judicial branch of government or is elected on a nonpartisan basis (K.S.A. 75-2953(2)).

Highway Patrol: No member of the patrol shall hold "any other commission or office, elective or appointive, except in the Kansas National Guard or in the organized reserves of the United States Army, Air Force, or Navy, or accept any other employment while he is a member of the patrol" (K.S.A. 74-2113(d)).

Penalty.

If a person accepts an incompatible office, it is deemed that such person has vacated the first office automatically.

Attached are lists of compatible and incompatible offices compiled by the League of Kansas Municipalities in "Legal Aspects of Public Office" (October 1990).

Compatible Offices

The following combinations of offices have been declared compatible by decisions of the Kansas Supreme Court or by opinions issued by the Attorney General of Kansas.

City clerk and clerk of district court (Abry v. Gray, 58 Kan. 148).

City engineer and county engineer (AG 3/29/63).

Re: Conflicts of Interests and Governmental Ethics

The purposes of the Kansas conflicts of interest act, K.S.A. 75-4301 et seq. is to require disclosure of substantial interests of government officials and to prohibit any public officer or employee from participating in the making of a contract on behalf of the government or business in which the employee has a substantial interest.

Which local units of government are subject to the act?

The act applies to any governmental subdivision of the state, all candidates for local office, local government officers (elected or appointed), and certain employees. A governmental subdivision is a subdivision of the state having the authority to receive or hold public moneys or funds.

Substantial interest.

K.S.A. 75-4301a defines substantial interest as follows:

(a) "Substantial interest" means any of the following: (1) If an individual or an individual's spouse, either individually or collectively, has owned within the preceding 12 months a legal or equitable interest exceeding \$5,000 or 5% of any business, whichever is less, the individual has a substantial interest in that business;

- (2) if an individual or an individual's spouse, either individually or collectively, has received during the preceding calendar year compensation which is or will be required to be included as taxable income on federal income tax returns of the individual and spouse in an aggregate amount of \$2,000 from any business or combination of businesses, the individual has a substantial interest in that business or combination of businesses:
- (3) if an individual or individual's spouse, either individually or collectively, has received in the preceding 12 months, without reasonable and valuable consideration, goods or services having an aggregate value of \$500 or more from a business or combination of businesses, the individual has substantial interest in that business or combination of businesses;
- (4) if an individual or an individual's spouse holds the position of officer, director, associate, partner or proprietor of any business, other than an organization exempt from federal taxation of corporations under section 501(c)(3), (4), (6), (7), (8), (10), or (19) of chapter 26 of the United States code, the individual has a substantial interest in that business, irrespective of the amount of compensation received by the individual or individual's spouse; and
- (5) if an individual or an individual's spouse receives compensation which is a portion or percentage of each separate fee or commission paid to a business or combination of businesses, the individual has a substantial interest in any client or customer who pays fees or commissions to the business or combination of businesses from which fees or commissions the individual or the individual's spouse, either individually or collectively, received an aggregate of \$2,000 or more in the preceding calendar year.

As used in this subsection, "client or customer" means a business or combination of businesses.

The act does not define the term "conflict of interest" but implicitly equates such term with "substantial interest."

Disclosure requirements.

All candidates for local office must file statements of interests at the times specified in K.S.A. 75-4302a. Such statements are filed in the office where declarations of candidacy for the local office sought or held by the individual are required to be filed.

Local government officers and employees must file before acting on any matter which will affect any business in which the officer or employee has substantial interest.

Limitations on making contracts and other matters.

Public officials are required to abstain from making or participating in the making of a contract with a business in which the official is employed or has a substantial interest. Further, no person or business may enter into any contract if a local government officer or employee, acting in that capacity, is a signatory to or a participant in the making of the contract and is employed by or has a substantial interest in the person or business. This prohibition applies regardless of whether the substantial interest has been disclosed as required under the law.

The above rules do not apply if either (1) the contract is let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice or (2) the contract is for property or services for which the price or rate is fixed by law.

No local government officer or employee may act on any matter affecting a business in which such person has a substantial interest unless a written report of the nature of the interest is filed with the county election officer of the subdivision.

Penalties.

Failure to file the required substantial interest statements or acting on contracts in violation of the law are class B misdemeanors. Further, any local official convicted of violating the contract provisions forfeits his or her office or employment.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION OPPORTUNITIES FOR ACTION IN A CHANGING ENVIRONMENT

The lives of governments, in this dynamic age we live in, like the lives of individuals, are growing more complicated and interrelated. The social, economic and technological changes of recent years; urbanization and the mobility of people, the continuing squeeze on public resources, especially the property tax; expanding and pervasive state and federal rules and regulations; and the growth in the number and complexity of the functions and activities of governments have ended the day -- if that day ever existed -- when governments could operate wholly apart, independently and separately from each other. These kinds of developments have ended the day when we could view our federal system -- our national-state-local intergovernmental system -- as a layer cake, as clearly separate and independent levels. They have also ended the day when the constituent units called local government can operate unchanged, under a framework created under conditions existing a century ago. This is especially true in Kansas, with about 4,000 separate local taxing units, plus a host of other boards and commissions.

Thus we seek solutions, to make our fragmented local government structure more effective, more efficient, and more responsive, in these changing times and in the future. One approach is interlocal cooperation.

What is intergovernmental Cooperation?

Intergovernmental cooperation is the device by which two or more units voluntarily work together for some public purposes. It involves a variety of procedures and methods, including the establishment of a joint agency to perform a service, the joint construction of a public facility, the contracting of one unit for a service provided by another, the coordination of the activities of two or more governments to achieve a common objective, and similar formal or informal arrangements. It may be interlocal, horizontal cooperation, including only governments at the local level, such as between cities or between cities and counties. Or it may be vertical cooperation among different levels of government, such as between counties and the state. It varies from the simple exchange of ideas and information to the creation of a complex organization to provide a public service.

Principles of Cooperation

There are at least three essential criteria necessary to make an activity a matter of intergovernmental cooperation:

- * it must be voluntary.
- * The basic control must be vested in the elected governing bodies of the units involved.
- * It must preserve the identifies of the existing units of government.

If an agreement or action does not meet these criteria, it should be called something else, not cooperation.

Why should governments cooperate? The following general reasons may be cited.

- * Cooperation is advisable where a governmental problem does not recognize political boundaries -- where an area or regional approach is advisable. For example, water supply and flood protection are regional problems in some areas.
- * Cooperation is sometimes necessary simply for economic reasons. For example, many small units simply cannot afford to provide certain services or own certain equipment, but collectively they an.
- * Cooperation can be desirable for reasons of efficiency. For example, even if all the units in an area could afford to own separately an item of equipment or a facility for special, seldom-used purposes, it could be more efficient to provide for its joint use.
- * Cooperation may promote the more equitable distribution of the cost of providing certain services. For example, when one unit provides a service used substantially by the residents of a nearby unit, cooperation may provide a means of fairly sharing the costs.
- * Cooperation is advisable in some instances to prevent state or federal assumption of a function or activity which should be kept on a local government basis.
- * Cooperation is advisable to prevent the growth of those special purpose districts which are not directly responsible to the public they serve or whose activities are not coordinated with general governments.
- * Cooperation is sometimes necessary simply because of the interdependence of local units in an area. The lives and economic and social welfare of individuals, and governmental units are effected by what happens in their neighboring communities. While maintaining healthy competition, there may also be the need to work together with the mutual benefit of all.

Indeed, with all of this, perhaps the basic question is not "Why cooperate?" Perhaps the real question is "Why not cooperate?"

Legal Authority

Kansas statutes grant very broad authority for interlocal cooperation. There are five kinds of statutory authorization for formal cooperative ventures in Kansas.

- 1. The interlocal cooperation statute (K.S.A. 12-2901 et seq.).
- 2. The interlocal service statute (K.S.A. 12-2908 and 12-2909).
- 3. The functional consolidation statute (K.S.A. 12-3901 et seq.).
- 4. The general highway and public works statute (K.S.A. 19-4501 et seq. and K.S.A. Supp. 68-169).
- 5. Specific cooperation statues found in numerous state laws.

A summary of these statutes and a listing of related state statutes is included in the League's Research/Information Bulletin No. 520, issued February 4, 1991.

As a general rule, if two or more governmental units are empowered to do something separate, they may do the same thing cooperatively. If the will exists, a way can be found.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION An Inventory of Legal Authority in Kansas

Kansas local governments have broad legal authority to cooperate as to the performance of public functions and services. The purpose of this article is to identify and briefly summarize those Kansas statutes relating to intergovernmental cooperation. It deals primarily with the legal aspects of formal interlocal cooperation actions, rather than the more informal type of cooperation, such as occurs through organizations typified by the League of Kansas Municipalities.

The article is divided into the following parts, based on the kind of legal authorization required for formal cooperative ventures:

- 1) Interlocal Cooperation Statute
- 2) Interlocal Service Statute
- 3) Functional Consolidation Statute
- 4) General Highway and Public Works Statutes
- 5) Specific Cooperation Statutes

It should be noted that there are sometimes three or more laws which may be used to accomplish the same objective. In some cases, there are lengthy state laws which specifically authorize local units to do something cooperatively as to a certain function or service which is also covered by a general state law. In this case, local units presumably have an option as to which statutory procedure they choose to follow.

Interlocal Cooperation Statute

Probably the single most important general statute on intergovernmental cooperation is found in K.S.A. 12-2901 et seq. It essentially permits any two or more local units to do cooperatively or jointly that which they are empowered to do separately. In addition, the agencies involved in the intergovernmental cooperation venture may include this state, any other state, the United States or any private agency.

As a result of a number of amendments which have been made to the statute since its enactment in 1957, the purposes specified in the statute as permissible areas of cooperation have been expanded. In addition, a League-sponsored bill enacted in 1979 provided that the specified areas of such agreements include but are not limited to those mentioned functions. As a result, the present statute permits cooperation in such areas as "economic development, public improvements, public utilities, police protection, libraries, data processing services, educational services, building and related inspection services, flood control and storm water drainage, weather modification, sewage disposal, refuse disposal, park and recreational programs and facilities, ambulance service, fire protection, the Kansas tort claims act or claims for civil rights violations." However, it is again emphasized, these specified areas are illustrative, and agreements under this statute are not limited to these specified functions.

Written agreements entered into under this statute are to be reviewed by the attorney general to determine if they are in

proper form and compatible with the laws of the state. Agreements between two or more public agencies establishing a council or other organization of local governments for the promotion of intergovernmental cooperation need not be submitted for review by the attorney general. While the interlocal cooperation statute applies to all governments, K.S.A. 72-8230, relating to interlocal cooperation by school districts, contains supplemental provisions which apply when only such districts are involved in exercising their powers under K.S.A. 12-2901 et seq.

Interlocal Service Contracts

A second general law, passed in 1982 and amended in 1983, provides broad authority for any city or county to contract with any other city or county to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking, which each contracting city or county is authorized to perform by law. The statutes are found in K.S.A. Supp. 12-2908:2909. The approval of the attorney general is not required. The contract must be authorized by the governing bodies and must set forth the purpose, powers, rights, objectives and responsibilities of the contracting parties.

K.S.A. 12-2908. (a) Any city or county may contract with any other city or county to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which each contracting city or county is authorized by law to perform. The contract shall be authorized by the governing body of the city and county and shall state the purpose of the contract and the powers and duties of the parties thereunder.

(b) A contract entered into pursuant to this section shall not be regarded as an interlocal agreement under the provisions of K.S.A. 12-2801 et seq., and amendments thereto.

K.S.A. 12-2909. (a) The board of county commissioners of any county and the governing body of any city located within the county may enter into a contract providing for the enforcement of the city's ordinances by the sheriff of the county or other officers of the sheriff's department. Any contract entered into pursuant to this section shall be submitted to and approved by the county sheriff. Failure of the sheriff to approve a contract within 30 days of its submission shall constitute disapproval thereof. All monetary consideration paid by a city to a county as part of the contract shall be expended by the county solely for law enforcement purposes. The sheriff and any officers of the sheriff's department assigned responsibility for enforcing a city's ordinances under the contract shall be designated therein and shall have all the powers of any other police officer of the city by virtue of the existence of the contract.

(b) A contract entered into pursuant to this section shall not be regarded as an interlocal agreement under the provisions of K.S.A. 12-2901 et seq., and amendments thereto.

The approval of the attorney general is not required. The contract must be authorized by the governing bodies and must set forth the purpose, powers, rights, objectives and responsibilities of the contracting parties.

Because of its broad authorization and simplicity, this statute is being increasingly used when only cities and/or counties are involved in a service arrangement. When a joint public agency is needed, or where the joint or cooperative performance of a service is required, the interlocal cooperation act is commonly used.

Functional Consolidation Statute

A third general state law, passed in 1974, gives counties, townships, cities, school districts, library districts, park districts, road districts, drainage or levee districts, sewer districts, water districts, fire districts, and other taxing subdivisions created under state law, broad authority to consolidate operations, procedures and functions in the interest of efficiency and effectiveness. It is found in K.S.A. 12-3901 et seq., and is entitled, Governmental Organization.

Consolidation under this statute can be effected within a single governmental unit (internal consolidation), or through joint action of two or more governmental units (external consolidation). The governing body or governing bodies must first find by resolution that duplication exists and that operations, procedures or functions can be more efficiently and effectively exercised, and then designate the office or agency to perform the consolidated function, and the time, form and manner of implementation of the consolidation. Identical resolutions must be passed by each governing body when more than one governmental unit is involved in a consolidation. A public hearing must be held before a governing body votes on the elimination of an elective office.

Elimination of an elective office must be approved by a majority of the electors voting at an election called and held in the manner provided by the general bond law (K.S.A. 10-120). An election is also required if a proposed consolidation is "protested" by a petition signed by 10 percent of the qualified electors. Provision is also made for state agency review and approval or disapproval of consolidations of those functions or operations which are subject to control by a state officer or agency.

General Highway and Public Works Statutes

In addition to the above three statutes, there are two general statutes relating to highways and to public works generally.

K.S.A. 19-4501, et seq., enacted in 1972, grants counties with departments of public works broad powers to provide a variety of public works services to local units within the county, under written agreement (see Public Works Services in the listing of specific statutes).

In addition, K.S.A. 68-169, relating to cooperation as to highways, roads and streets, was amended and enlarged in 1975. This statute is reproduced below. It would permit, for example, county expenditures for streets and roads even if the street or road is not under the county's legal jurisdiction.

K.S.A. Supp. 68-169. Any county, city or political subdivision of this state shall have the authority to enter into written agreements with each other or with the secretary of transportation with respect to the planning, designing, financing, constructing, reconstructing, maintaining, acquiring of right-of-way or establishing the controlled access facilities of any existing or proposed highway, road, street or connecting link, including bridges, traffic control devices and other such improvements located thereon. Expenditures made pursuant to such agreements shall be considered proper expenditures of public funds, including state funds, notwithstanding the location of such improvement or facility outside the boundary or jurisdiction of such county, city or political subdivision. This section shall not be construed as amending or repealing any existing law relating to the same subject but shall be construed as supplementary thereto.

Specific Cooperation Statutes

In addition to the four general acts reviewed above, there are many specific statutes which authorize two or more governmental units to cooperate as to a certain function or service. The following is a list of statutory authorizations based on an inventory of provisions of Kansas Statutes Annotated. Excluded from this list are interlocal cooperation practices and opportunities not specifically provided for by statute or law. Also excluded are references to those state laws which require local units to act together and prescribe the procedure to be followed; compulsory joint actions are not considered cooperation for the purpose of this report. With limited exceptions, this list does not show the statutory authority for local units to cooperate with the state, other states, or the federal government.

The inventory includes a brief description of matters subject to cooperation, in alphabetical form, together with a citation to the applicable statute of authority. The latest K.S.A. Supplement and session laws should be checked to insure the statutory authority is current. The statute should be referred to in all cases.


Agriculture; County Extension Agents. Counties may jointly employ an extension agent. 2-615.

Air Pollution. See Health.

Airports. Any city and county may jointly operate, own or lease airports. 3-119a, 3-120.

Airports; Federal Aid. Cities and counties acting jointly may submit project applications under federal airport act. 3-606.

Airports. See Port Authorities.



Armulances. Any municipality operating an emergency medical service may contract with any person or governmental entity for any emergency medical services. 65-6116.

Ambulances; Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on ambulance service. 12-2901 et seq.

Assessors; Appraisers. Any county may unite with another county or counties to employ an appraiser. 19-428.

Audits. Authorizes local units other than cities, schools and other counties to contract with county to have audit done at time of county audit. 12-150.

Bonds. Two or more public agencies may enter into interlocal agreements to create a joint and separate legal entity to issue bonds for any purpose for which each of the units is authorized to issue bonds (e.g. highways, buildings, disposal plants). 12-2904a.

Bridges. See Highways.

Buildings; City and School Community Buildings. Any city and the school district in which the city is located may jointly construct and operate community buildings. 12-1769.

Buildings; General City Authority. Any city may jointly provide and equip public buildings with any other city or county. (See also 19-15, 115 et seq.). 12-1769 et seq.

Buildings; General County Authority. Any county may jointly provide any public building with any other county or city. (Sea also 12-1736 et seq.). 19-15,115 et seq.

Buildings; General Public Improvements. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on public improvements. 12-2901 *et seq.*

Buildings; Joint Township Authority. Any two or more adjoining townships in the same county may construct and use a joint township hall. 81-107.

Buildings; Public Building Commission. Any city or county may create a public building commission to construct and operate buildings and issue bonds for county business, city business, school district offices, parking facilities for state or federal offices and property constituting a part of the campus of any state university. 12-1757 et seq.

Buildings; Inspection Services. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on building and related inspection services. 12-2901 *et seq.*

Bus Transportation. See School Bus Transportation.

Data Processing; Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on data processing services. 12-2901 et seq.

Data Processing; Joint School District Agreements. Any two or more school districts may enter into cooperative agreements

for operation and maintenance of data processing cer. 72-8227.

Disaster Emergencies. Authorizes creation of interjurisdictional disaster agencies upon certain findings by Governor. 48-930.

Economic Development. Any public agency may undertake programs to promote economic and area development. 12-2901 *et seq.* (Counties; also see 19-4101 *et seq.*)

Education. See School Districts.

Educational Services. Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may cooperate. 12-2901 *et seq.*

Educational Services; Interlocal Cooperation. Two or more boards of education may enter into agreements for interlocal educational services. 72-8230 and 12-2901 et seq.

Emergency Medical Services. See Ambulances.

Employees. See Intergovernmental Personnel.

Energy; Joint Municipal Energy Agencies. Any two or more cities may create a municipal energy agency for the purpose of securing electricity or other energy and transmitting the same to the cities belonging to the agency. 12-885, et seq.

Engineering; County Engineer. Any county may unite with adjoining county or counties for hiring a county engineer for highway district subject to certain limitations. 28-118.

Fire Protection; Emergency. During emergencies, city and township fire departments may go anywhere in state to assist. 12-111.

Fire Protection; County District. Any county, by board action or by petition of the residents, may organize one or more fire districts in the county. County may contract with cities for fire protection. Cities may be included in district. Contracts may be made with any township or city of adjoining county or with rural fire protection districts of adjoining counties of another state. Agreements between district and any city may be made for joint construction, equipping and maintenance of buildings for housing fire equipment. 19-3601 et seq.

Fire Protection; Interlocal Agreements. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating for fire protection by written agreement. 12-2901 *et seq.*

Fire Protection; Miscellaneous. In addition to general statutes above, see: Districts, 80-1501 et seq. 80-1512, 19-3613 et seq.; Townships, 80-1535 et seq., 80-1539.

Flood Control; Interlocal Agreements. Any unit of government may enter an interlocal agreement with any other governmental unit to provide for flood control. 12-2901 et seq.

Flood Control; Stormwater Drainage Districts. Any city and the county in which city is located may form a stormwater

drunge district including area inside city and in unincorporated areas. The district may construct and maintain main and lateral drains and provide for special assessments and bonds to finance the improvements. 12-6,102.

Garbage and Trash Disposal. See Refuse.

Health; Air Pollution. Any city, county, or combination thereof may conduct tests of air purity and establish local air quality conservation authority under state supervision. 65-3016.

Health; Board of. Any two or more cities and/or counties may establish a joint board of health. 65-205 et seq.

Health; Control of Contagious Disease. Joint action by counties and cities of the second or third class to control contagious diseases. 65-301.

Health; General. City-city, city-county and county-county agreements and contracts as to health services are generally authorized by 12-2901, 12-2908 and 12-3901; see part 1 of this report.

Health; Mental Health Centers. Counties may establish a community mental health center and/or facility for mentally retarded. 19-4001.

Health; Mental Health Clinic. Where joint health board exists, mental health clinic may be operated by such joint board. 65-211.

Health; Students; Inspections. The local health officer makes sanitary inspections of school buildings, provides certain tests and inoculations to students. 65-202, 72-5210.

Highways; Agreements for Arterial Highways. Counties may assume responsibility for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repair of city streets designated primary arterial highways, or secondary arterial highways if they are connecting cities between county roads. Counties and cities may agree upon the cooperative financing as to the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repair of city streets designated as a primary arterial highway, or as a secondary arterial highway if such streets are connecting links between county roads. 68-580 et seq.

Highways; Bonds for County-City Projects. Bonds issued by counties or cities issued for projects authorized by 68-584 may be used for county roads or city streets.

Highways; City-County Boundary Streets. A city and county may enter into an agreement to authorize the city to construct or reconstruct roads or streets on the city boundary limits and assess the cost against an improvement district which includes property both inside and outside city limits. 12-693, 68-506, 63-572.

Highways; County Line Roads. Where a road forms the boundary line between two counties, the counties may divide the work of maintaining and repairing. 68-507.

Highways; General Agreements. Any county, city or political subdivision of the state has the authority to enter into agreements with each other and with the state with respect to financing, construction, maintaining or acquiring right of way for highways, roads and streets whether within or without the boundary or jurisdiction of the county, city or political subdivisions. 68-169.

Highways; Agreements for Construction Maintenance. County, township, and/or city may enter into agreements for the construction, reconstruction or maintenance of any roads or streets. 68-572, 68-560.

Highways; General Bridge Agreement. Any two counties, cities or townships separated by a stream may join in the construction of a bridge and agree upon the share of the cost. 10-204.

Highways; Maintenance of County Connecting Links. Any county and city with population under 5,000 may enter into an agreement to maintain connecting links within the city. 68-506f.

Highways; Rental of Machinery and Equipment. Any county and any township is authorized to rent to each other or to a city located within the county. 68-141a et seq.

Highways; Miscellaneous. See also: Bridges, 13-1024b, 68-1410 *etseq.*, 68-1404, 68-1412 *etseq.*, 68-1122; line roads, 68-109, 68-716, 68-572, 68-582.

Hospitals. Permits two or more adjoining subdivisions to create a hospital district. 80-2503, see also 14-6,110, 19-4603 et seq.

Housing; Financing. Cities and counties may join together in issuance of bonds for residential housing. 12-5231.

Housing Authorities; Joint Operation. Any two or more cities or counties or combination thereof may join or cooperate in the financing, planning, construction or operation of projects under the public housing act. 17-2348.

Industrial Development. See Port Authorities.

Insurance; Group-Funded Risk Pooling. Any five or more municipalities may enter into agreements to pool their liability for various public risks, excluding accident, health or life insurance. 12-2616 et seq.

Insurance; Worker's Compensation. Five or more common interest employers may establish group worker's compensation pools. 44- 581. See also Tort Claims.

Intergovernmental Personnel. Authorizes voluntary interchange of employees among federal, state, and local government for periods up to two years with two-year extensions possible. 75-4401 et seq.

Jalls; Construction for Joint Usage: Any county may appropriate up to \$1,000 to assist in construction of a joint city-county jail in a city other than the county seat, with certain limitations. 19-1923.

• Contract for Usage. Any county may contract with any city for use of the city jail. 19-1929.

Jails. See Police Protection, Buildings.

Law Enforcement. See Police Protection.

Libraries; Board Contracts. Any county, city, school or township library board may contract with any other to furnish or receive library service. 12-1225, 12-1230, 72-1033, 72-1033a. See also School Libraries.

Librarles; Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on libraries. 12-2901 *et seq.* See also 75-2575.

Libraries; Regional Libraries. Any two or more adjoining counties or townships may establish and maintain a regional library, if approved by voters. 12-1231.

Libraries; Regional System of Cooperating Libraries. Any one or more library boards may petition the state library advisory commission for the establishment of a regional system of cooperating libraries. 75-2547 et seq.; 12-1234.

Machinery. See Highways, Interlocal Cooperation Act.

Mental Health. See Health.

Museums; Maintenance. Any county may maintain museums in any city, park district, or township used by county residents under agreements with the governing bodies thereof. 19-2801. **Oregon Trail.** The state will cooperate with cities and counties to mark the route of the Oregon Trail. 68-1032.

Parks and Recreation; City-School District. Any city or school may cooperate to operate a recreation program or create a joint recreation commission. 12-1922 *et seq.*

Parks and Recreation: Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on park and recreational programs and facilities. 12-2901 et seq.

Parks and Recreation: Cooperation by Counties. Counties may contract for services or cooperate with another governmental agency to provide recreation activities and acquire property for same. 19-2801.

Parks and Recreation: Programs for Aging. Counties may contract for services or cooperate with another governmental agency to provide recreational activities and programs for aging. 19-2801.

Parks and Recreation; Miscellaneous. See also: 19-2844a, 19-2833a, 19-2841 *et seq.* 13-1356 et seq, 15-914 *et seq.*

Planning; Area. Any two or more cities or counties having adjoining planning jurisdictions or any county or city or cities within or adjacent to the county may jointly cooperate in the exercise and performance of planning powers. 12-716 et seq. See also 12-2901 et seq.

Planning; Board of Zoning Appeals. Any two or more cities or counties which have established a joint planning commission under 12-716 are authorized to establish a joint board of zoning appeals. 12-722 et seq.

Planning; County Use of City Planning Commission.Counties adopting zoning regulations for the unincorporated area may use the planning commissions of the county or cities located therein. 19-2933.

Planning; Subdivision Regulations Outside City. Any county and any city located therein shall establish a joint committee for subdivision regulation for the land area outside the city and within three miles of the city limits, if both the city and county seek to regulate such land. 12-705a, 19-2918b.

Police Protection; Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on police protection. 12-2901 *et seq.*

Police Protection; Contracts for Service. Any city or county may contract with any other city or county to perform governmental services; 12-2908. Cities may contract with counties as to the enforcement of city ordinances; 12-2909.

Police Protection; Consolidated Agencies. A county and cities therein may form a countywide law enforcement agency if approved by referendum. (limited application). I'-4401 et seq.

Police Protection; Joint Police and Municipal Judges. Authorizes two or more cities or city and county to appoint the same person as a law enforcement officer. Except in cities of first class, two or more cities may appoint the same person as municipal judge. 13-2102, 14-205, 15-1502, 15-209, 15-1602.

Police Protection; Use of Vehicles and Equipment (Johnson County). The county and cities therein may enter into agreements for the use or joint purchase of vehicles, broadcast equipment and other machinery used by law enforcement agencies. 19-2644 et seq.

Port Authorities. Cities and counties may establish joint port authorities to promote industrial development and commerce. 12- 3401 *et seq.*

Public Improvements. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on public improvements. 12-2901 et seq.

Public Improvements. See also Buildings.

Public Works Services; County Department of. Any county public works department may provide public works services to political subdivisions in county under written agreements. Services that may be provided include: maintenance of public buildings, grounds, facilities, parks and recreation facilities; construction and maintenance of sewers, drainage and flood control, airports; solid waste; building, planning and related inspection services for land use purposes; maintenance and custody of machinery, equipment and other public works functions authorized by law. 19-4501 et seq.

Recreation. See Parks and Recreation.

Refuse Disposal; Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on refuse disposal. 12-2901 *et seq.*

Refuse; Solid Waste Disposal. All counties may provide for the disposal of refuse through contract with cities therein. County may provide site or use city site. 19-2658 et seq.

Refuse; Disposal in Sedgwick County. Authorizes joint county and city garbage and trash disposal. 65-204.

Refuse; Resources Recovery. Cities or counties or combinations may establish resource recovery facilities. 65-3418.

Refuse; Solid Waste Management. Any two or more cities, counties, or combination of cities and counties may jointly plan and provide for the collection and disposal of refuse. 65-3410.

Roads. See Highways.

Sales Tax; Joint County Vote. The boards of any two or more contiguous counties by joint resolution may submit the question of imposing a sales tax to the voters of the involved counties on the same date. 12-187(c).

School Bus Transportation. Boards of education may contract with other units and with recreation commissions as to use of school buses for various purposes. 72-8302(b). See also 72-8307.

School Census. Boards of education may use any reasonable method of obtaining the annual census of all children under the age of 21. 72-1110.

School Districts, General. Board of education of two or more school districts may cooperatively perform any services, duties or functions required by law. 72-8230.

School Districts; Bilingual Education. Two or more boards of education may enter into agreements as to bilingual education. 72-9503.

School District; Data Processing. Two or more school districts may enter into agreements as data processing. 72-8227.

School Districts; Elementary Guidance. Two or more boards of education may enter into agreements as to elementary guidance programs. 72-9301.

School District; Special Education. Two or more school districts may enter into agreements as to special education services. 72-968.

School Districts; Vocational Education. Two or more school districts may enter into agreements as to vocational education. 72-4421.

School Libraries. School boards may contract with library boards as to public use of school library facilities. 72-1033. See also Libraries.

Sewage Disposal; Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on sewage disposal. 12-2901 et seq.

Sewerage; Water Pollution Act. Any city, county, township, township sewer district or other political subdivision authorized to levy taxes may improve their sewer system through a joint contract with one another. 12-3101 et seq.

Sewerage; Storm Water. See Flood Control.

Sewerage, Miscellaneous. In addition to general statutes above see: 14-714, 13-10,107, 12-631g.

Sewer Districts. Governing body of county sewer districts (wastewater and storm water) may enter into interlocal agreements. 19-27a0l *et seq.*

Solid Waste. See Refuse.

Storm Water Control. See Flood Control.

Streets. See Highways.

Swimming Pools. See Parks and Recreation.

Taxes, Distribution. County board may enter into agreements with taxing subdivisions as to the distribution of taxes and interest thereon. 12-1678a(d).

Taxes, Delinquent Special Assessments. Cities and counties may agree on distribution of interest on delinquent special assessments. 79-2401a.

Tax Foreclosure. City may assist county in foreclosure action on delinquent tax liens or special assessments. 79-2801.

Tort Claims; Joint Insurance and Pooling. Any local unit through the interlocal cooperation act and the group-funded pool act may enter into agreements with other local units to provide for the purchase of insurance for the defense of employees and for liability claims under the tort claims act. 75-6111(b)(1) and (2); 12-2901 et seq.; 12-2616 et seq.

Township Roads. See Highways; also 68-560.

Traffic Control Devices. Any county, city, or other political subdivision may enter into agreements as to traffic control devices, even if outside their boundary or jurisdiction. 68-169.

Trash. See Refuse.

Utilities; Interlocal Cooperation. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on public utilities. 12-2901 *et seq.* See also Energy.

Water. See Flood Control, Utilities.

Water; Ports. See Port Authorities.

Weather Modification. Any public agency may join with any other in cooperating on weather modification. 12-2901 et seq.
