Subject: Proposed Legislation

The Department of Revenue, Division of Vehicles, proposed legislative package consists of two bills. Bill drafts have been provided to the Revisor of Statutes Office. We respectfully request that the bills be introduced and given favorable consideration by your committee. A brief of synopsis of each of the proposed bills is given below.

- Proposed Bill No. 1. (1) Amends K.S.A. 1992 Supp. 8-2404 subsection (i) denying further appeal or administrative action once initial appeals have been heard by a court of competent jurisdiction and judgement has been rendered, and the director of vehicles has ruled that their judgement is final. This clarification precludes the aggrieved party from re-opening or re-appealing a final judgement of the court and final action of the director of vehicles. (2) Certificates of Deposit and Irrevocable Letters of Credit must be held on deposit with the state treasurer for a period of five from the date of the last vehicle transaction.
- Proposed Bill No. 2. (1) Amends K.S.A. 8-2401, changing "salesman" to "salesperson". (2) Includes among the violations punishable by suspension or revocation of a dealer's license K.S.A. 79-3601 et seq, and K.S.A. 79-3294 et seq, and deletes K.S.A. 79-1019. These statutes relate to non-payment of sales and withholding taxes. (3) A vehicle salesperson may receive only one temporary license in during any twelve-month period. This change is requested to assure that a person does not become gainfully employed as a vehicle salesperson without eventually receiving a valid salesperson license.
