Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee.

I appreciate the opportunity to come before you this morning. Having served on the House side, this process is new to me, as it may be to some of you. I do want to express my appreciation for the dedication and sacrifice that you, as legislators, make to all the process.

The Kansas Grain Inspection Department plays a very important and necessary part in helping to promote production and quality of one of Kansas' largest industries, that of grain production. We also are given the charge to protect the depositors of grain in our public warehouses.

I am convinced that we have one of the best, if not the best, warehouse divisions in the country. I intend to do all I can to keep it that way.

The challenges are certainly before us, we live in a fast-moving age. Tremendous changes have and are taking place in agriculture and the grain business. We in the Grain Inspection Department realize we have to make changes to keep up with what is going on around us.

I believe the life-long experience in the grain business as a producer and also as a board member of a local cooperative has prepared me well to fulfill the duties of Director. As a legislator, serving on the Agriculture Committee all 20 sessions, I have been associated with the workings of the Kansas State Grain Inspection Department on a number of occasions. I served on the interim committee which thoroughly studied the Grain Inspection Department. And, if I remember correctly, as a result of that study six bills were introduced and passed, which in my judgement were a great help in improving the effectiveness of the Department.

I do understand the futures market. If used properly, it is a good tool for risk reduction. As used in the businesses we oversee, if they have a lot of company-owned grain, we like to see this hedged on the futures with a selling hedge. Because cash prices and futures normally move in concert, if they have taken the opposite position in futures as they have in cash, it does limit the risk associated with large amounts of company-owned grain on hand. We particularly watch those companies whose balance sheet is very narrow and could not handle a big drop in grain prices without the hedge.

My experience with the department since May 12th of last year has been exciting and rewarding. I serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Our agency is a service agency. I try to emphasize this to all our people at every opportunity. We are in existence to serve the grain industry and the producer. I pledge to do what I can to keep it that way.

Thank you again for the opportunity to make these remarks. I look forward to working with you in the future.
