MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lana Oleen at 11:05 a.m. on February 10, 1993 in Room 254-E of the Capitol.

Sen. Oleen introduced Robert Londerholm and explained the committees' policy regarding confirmations. Mr. Londerholm made a statement (Attachment 1) and emphasized important points. He considers it important that the integrity of racing be continued; that the county fair racing circuit be developed as it has been in other states; and that simulcasting be continued and expanded. He also emphasized that parimutuel has contributed \$6 million to charities and that Kansas' citizens should remember these funds have helped relieve property taxes. Mr. Londerholm then answered questions from the committee; in particular, he discussed simultaneous races and the number of days the horses run at The Woodlands and the fact that the greyhounds may now run the year around. He stated The Woodlands is known as an excellent track throughout the world; that increased simulcasting would raise amounts in the purses; and that the law would have to be changed to allow development of the county fair racing circuit. Sen. Vidricksen recalled the horse people labored hard to receive approval for parimutuel racing and the dog people came on the scene later. He said the horse racing industry wanted equal days for horse racing. Mr. Londerholm stated the commission is making a strong effort to promote the horse track, and that he believes parimutuel is in danger, since Missouri is trying to stay a step ahead on the gambling issues. Consequently, The Woodlands is more threatened than Wichita Greyhound Park. He again emphasized the need for revenue in Kansas.

Sen. Oleen asked Mr. Londerholm to "stand at ease" for a few minutes, since some committee members have to leave the meeting shortly. She called attention to two appointees who have previously appeared before the committee and asked the committee for action. Sen. Tillotson made a motion the committee recommend Dr. Denise Kobuszewski be recommended for confirmation to the Racing Commission; it was seconded by Sen. Vidricksen. The motion passed. Sen. Hensley made a motion the committee recommend Alyce Hayes Brown be recommended for confirmation as chairperson of the Human Rights Commission; the motion was seconded by Sen. Jones. The motion passed.

Sen. Oleen announced that the committee will meet jointly with the Judiciary Committee next Tuesday and Wednesday to hear the Indian Gaming issue.

The committee then returned to questioning Mr. Londerholm on his appointment. Sen. Oleen asked, since the Executive Director has resigned, who will be speaking for the Racing Commission, regarding legislative issues being heard. Mr. Londerholm answered that Janet Chubb has been appointed as executive director, and she will be the Racing Commission's primary spokesperson. He added that he will also be available to assist the committee in order to ensure a smooth transition. Sen. Hensley questioned year-round dog racing and asked if the Wichita facility is also year-round and if the new Pittsburg track will be year-round. Mr. Londerholm answered the Wichita track is year-round and the Pittsburg track will also be year-round. Mr. Londerholm added that Mike Jones is available for any Racing Commission statistics the committee might need.

Tuck Duncan presented a proposed draft (<u>Attachment 2</u>) to the committee and briefly explained provisions. Sen. <u>Vidricksen made a motion the committee introduce it as a bill; and it was seconded by Sen. Jones. The motion passed.</u>

Meeting adjourned at 11:45.

Kansas Racing Commission Appointment

Robert C. Londerholm, Sr., has served over 2 and one-half years as a member of the Kansas Racing Commission, having been first appointed by Governor Hayden in the summer of 1990 to serve an unexpired term. He was reappointed by Governor Finney last summer to a full three year term commencing July 1, 1992. He was elected as Chair of the Commission by the other four Commissioners last July.

Londerholm has previously served state government as Attorney General for two terms in the 1960s, and prior to that as General Counsel of the Kansas Corporation Commission and Chief Attorney of the Department of Revenue, as well as service as an Assistant Attorney General. After leaving state government, he joined the law firm of Hackler, Londerholm, Hinkle, Corder, Martin and Hackler in Olathe as a senior partner, recently retiring from the firm. He is a Colonel in the United States Air Force, now retired.

Londerholm has also served as a member and Chair of the Federal Home Loan Bank of Topeka and, at the request of the federal agencies involved, as a member and later Chair of a consolidated group of failed financial institutions in Eastern Oklahoma, assisting in their return to profitability.

He is married, with four grown children and ten (soon to be 12) grandchildren. He and his wife, Beverly, reside in rural southeast Johnson County. He has also been active in local volunteer groups and government commissions, including service on the Blue Valley School Board in Stanley.



DRAFT SENATE BILL NO.

By Committee on Federal and State Affairs

AN ACT concerning employment; prohibiting certain acts by employers and providing a remedy for violations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section, "lawful consumable products" means products the use or enjoyment of which is lawful and which are consumed during use or enjoyment, including food, alcoholic or nonalcoholic beverages and tobacco.

(b) No employer shall:

: (:

- (1) Discharge or refuse to hire any individual, or otherwise disadvantage any individual with respect to compensation, terms, conditions or privileges of employment, because the individual uses lawful consumable products off the premises of the employer during nonworking hours; or
- (2) require as a condition of employment that any employee or applicant for employment abstain from using lawful consumable products off the premises of the employer during nonworking hours.
- (c) It is not a practice to disadvantage any individual pursuant to this section for an employer to offer, impose or have in effect a health or life insurance policy that makes distinctions between employees for the type of coverage or the cost of coverage based upon the employees use of lawful consumable products.
- (d) The provisions of this section shall not be deemed to protect any use of a lawful consumable product which materially:
- (1) Threatens an employer's legitimate conflict of interest policy reasonably designed to protect the employer's trade secrets, proprietary information or other proprietary interests; or

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- (2) relates to a bona fide occupational requirement and is reasonably and rationally related to the employment activities and responsibilities of a particular employee or a particular group of employees rather than to all employees of the employer.
- (e) Violation of this section shall render the employer liable to the aggrieved individual for the payment of a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$2,500, as fixed by the secretary of human resources. Such penalty shall be imposed only after notice and opportunity for hearing in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act, to the extent applicable. Any order of the secretary of human resources imposing such penalty shall be subject to review in accordance with the act for judicial review and civil enforcement of agency actions.
- (f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit an employer from making available to employees who use lawful consumable products, programs, free of charge or at reduced rates, which encourage the reduction or cessation of the use of lawful consumable products.
- (g) The provisions of this section shall not be construed to prohibit unified school district policies that forbid use of legal consumable products by district employees at official school district events or at any time when the employee is performing duties as an employee.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
