Senator Corbin made a motion to approve the minutes of the meetings of January 27 and 28 as submitted. Senator Praeger seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Ray Shepherd, Ft. Scott, KS, Gubernatorial Appointee to the State Banking Board, appeared before the committee for confirmation hearing. (Attachment #1.) Chairman Bond welcomed Mr. Shepherd and asked him to share his impressions of the Board and give a brief personal background. Mr. Shepherd stated that the State Banking Board has a wonderful and hard working staff and feels Kansans have reason to be proud of the banking structure. The Chairman expressed the committee's appreciation to Mr. Shepherd for appearing before the committee and for serving on the Banking Board.

Oren Windholz, Hays, KS, Gubernatorial Appointee to the State Savings and Loan Board, appeared before the committee for confirmation hearing. (Attachment #2.) Mr. Windholz provided a brief personal background as well as a history of his involvement with the Golden Belt Banking and Savings of Ellis, KS and the State Savings and Loan Board. Mr. Windholz acknowledged the limited activity of the S&L Board due to the reduced number of state-chartered savings and loan institutions and advised that Golden Belt Banking and Savings has currently applied for a federal charter. Chairman Bond thanked Mr. Windholz for appearing before the committee.

The resume and questionnaire for <u>A. Lee Williams, Gubernatorial Re-appointee to the Credit Union Council</u>, was distributed to committee members. (<u>Attachment #3.</u>) The chairman requested committee members' input on whether they felt it was necessary to request that Ms. Williams to appear before the committee since she is a reappointee.

The hearing was opened on <u>SB 70</u>, health care provider group definition, peer review. <u>Chip Wheelen, Kansas Medical Society</u>, appeared before the committee as a proponent of this legislation. <u>(Attachment #4.)</u> Mr. Wheelen proposed an amendment, a new subsection (f) on page 3, line 37. At Bill Wolff's request, Mr. Wheelen clarified that the amendment was necessary to clarify the difference between peer review and utilization review. In response to Senator Petty's question, Mr. Wheelen advised that insurance companies do not have access to the information kept on physicians by the National Practitioners Data Bank.

<u>Tuck Duncan, Medevac, (Attachment #5.)</u> requested that the bill be amended to include, under health care provider section, "attendant as defined by K.S.A. 65-6112." Paragraph (4) would be include, "...or appointed by an operator of an ambulance service." There were no further questions and no other conferees on <u>SB 70</u>; the hearing was closed.

Senator Petty made a motion to amend the bill by adding subsection (f) as requested by Mr. Wheelen. Senator Lawrence seconded the motion. The motion carried.

<u>Senator Petty moved to adopt the amendment requested by Mr. Duncan with regard to "attendants." Senator Hensley seconded the motion. The motion carried.</u>

The hearing was reopened on <u>SB 37</u>, which was originally heard on January 26, 1993. The problems with language and definition have now been reconciled with the State Banking Department and the Kansas Banker's Association. <u>Kathy Taylor, KBA</u>, explained the proposed changes and Jim Maag, KBA, noted that the changes have been reviewed by the Bank Commissioner's staff and found to be acceptable. (<u>Attachment #6.</u>) The hearing on <u>SB 37</u> was closed. <u>Senator Steffes made a motion to adopt the proposed amendments.</u> <u>Senator Praeger seconded the motion. The motion carried.</u>

<u>Senator Steffes made a motion to move SB 37 favorably as amended.</u> Senator Lawrence seconded the motion. The motion carried.

<u>Senator Praeger moved to recommend confirmation of Ray Shepherd to the State Banking Board.</u> <u>Senator Petty seconded the motion.</u> The motion carried.

<u>Senator Petty moved to recommend confirmation of Oren Windholz to the Savings and Loan Board. Senator Lee seconded the motion. The motion carried.</u>

Senator Lawrence made a motion to recommend confirmation of A. Lee Williams to the Credit Union Council without an appearance before the committee since this is a reappointment. The motion was seconded by Senator Lee. The motion carried.

The committee adjourned at 9:57 a.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for February 3, 1993.

SUBJECT: SB 70 as Introduced

Thank you for the opportunity to express our support for the provisions of SB 70. This bill was requested by the Kansas Medical Society in order to protect privileged information that is often requested of physicians in order for them to be credentialed by an insurer prior to entering into a participation agreement. information is frequently required in order to become a preferred provider and may include details of litigation in progress as well as the physician's liability history.

If the physician refuses to provide the requested information, the insurer refuses to establish a participation agreement. that event, a hardship can be created for those patients who have an established relationship with the physician and are insured by the preferred provider plan. Physicians are, of course, reluctant to share information which could jeopardize a medical malpractice case or be otherwised misused. Unless a remedy is obtained, some patients will experience a lack of continuity in their medical care and could experience access problems as well.

Because the credentialing process is nearly identical to the peer review activities engaged in by hospital medical staffs and other similar health care providers, we elected to address the identified problem by amending K.S.A. 65-4915 in a manner that would define insurers which engage in peer review functions so that their peer review records and findings would be protected from legal discovery. It has been suggested, however, that this protection could be misapplied to interfere with a patient's ability to obtain information regarding payment of benefits under the insurance policy. For this reason we respectfully request adoption of a clarifying amendment as follows.

Insert new subsection after line 37 of page 3

(f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent an insured from obtaining information pertaining to payment of benefits under a contract with an insurance company, a health maintenance organization, administrator of a health benefits plan.

Thank you for considering our concerns. We urge you to recommend passage of SB 70 as amended in the manner we described.

Peer review is currently authorized for a variety of licensed, registered or certified medical professionals. Peer review affords these professionals the opportunity to improve the quality of the health care services rendered to patients, and should be extended to emergeny medical service personnel.

I offer for the Committee's consideration as the appropriate amendments Substitute for Senate Bill 273 from the 1991 session, a copy of which is attached hereto.

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### Substitute for SENATE BILL No. 273

### By Committee on Local Government

AN ACT concerning first responders and attendants; relating to peer review.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) When used in this act:

(1) "First responder" shall have the same meaning ascribed thereto by K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 65-6112, and amendments thereto;

(2) "attendant" shall have the same meaning ascribed thereto by K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 65-6112, and amendments thereto;

(3) "peer review" means any of the following functions:

(A) Evaluate and improve the quality of services rendered by first responders or attendants:

- (B) determine that services rendered were provided pursuant to law or written protocols approved by the local component medical society and were performed in compliance with the applicable standard of care:
- (C) evaluate the qualifications, competence and performance of first responders or attendants or to act upon matters relating to the discipline of any individual first responder or attendant;

(D) reduce morbidity or mortality;

- (E) review the professional qualifications or activities of first responders or attendants;
- (F) evaluate, review or improve methods, procedures or treatments being utilized by first responders or attendants.
- (4) "peer review officer or committee" means an individual employed, designated or appointed by, or a committee of or employed, designated or appointed by the operator of an ambulance service as defined by K.S.A. 65-6112, and amendments thereto, or a state or local association of ambulance services, attendants or first responders and authorized to perform peer review.
- (b) Except as provided by K.S.A. 60-437, and amendments thereto, and by subsections (c) and (d), the reports, statements, memoranda, proceedings, findings and other records of peer review committees or officers shall be privileged and shall not be subject to discovery, subpoena or other means of legal compulsion for their release to any person or entity or be admissible in evidence in any

civil, criminal or any administrative proceeding. Information contained in such records shall not be discoverable or admissible at trial in the form of testimony by an individual who participated in the peer review process. This privilege may be claimed by the legal entity creating the peer review committee or officer.

(c) Subsection (b) shall not apply to proceedings in which a first responder or attendant contests the revocation, limitation, modifi-

cation or suspension of certification thereof.

(d) A peer review committee or officer shall report to the emergency medical services board any disciplinary action or recommendation of such committee or officer and shall transfer to the board the records of such committee's or officer's proceedings. Reports and records so farnished shall not be subject to discovery, subpoena or other means of legal compulsion for their release to any person or entity and shall not be admissible in evidence in any civil, criminal or any administrative proceeding other than a disciplinary proceeding by the emergency medical services board.

(e) A peer review committee or officer may report to and discuss its activities, information and findings to other peer review committees or officers or operator of an ambulance service without waiver of the privilege provided by subsection (b) and the records of all such committees or officers relating to such report shall be privileged

as provided by subsection (b). 23
