MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Jerry Moran at 8:15 a.m. on April 2, 1993 in Room 514-S of the Capitol.

Senator Bond moved that the minutes of March 10, 11, 12, 15 and 19, 1993 be approved as presented. Senator Feleciano seconded. Motion carried.

Senator Rock moved to amend HB 2355 to delete the provision for a BAC of .08. Senator Emert seconded. Motion carried. Senator Rock moved to recommend HB 2355, as amended, favorably for passage. Senator Bond seconded. Senator Brady made a substitute motion to change the "shall" to "may" in the language of HB 2355 pertaining to the judge's authority to revoke a person's license plate and to report HB 2355, as amended, favorably for passage. Senator Rock seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Moran took up SB 10 which was ruled materially changed and referred to the Judiciary Committee for reconsideration. The bill now includes provisions that will create a plea of guilty but mentally ill for use in criminal cases. It was noted that to adopt the House version of SB 10 with the guilty but mentally ill verdict will increase the state's need for psychiatric facilities for prisoners. Senator Bond moved that SB 10 be amended to the form it left the Senate. Senator Emert seconded. Motion carried.

CONFIRMATION

Senator Bond moved to recommend confirmation of the reappointment of C. William Ossmann to the Crime Victims' Compensation Board for a term of four years expiring June 30, 1996. Senator Martin seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 a.m.
