BUDGET REFORM GOALS

- 1. Create measurable outcomes and encourage long term planning.
- 2. Reduce the number of full time state employees and increase pay for those remaining.
- 3. Increase privatization of service delivery
- 4. Increase customer (citizen) satisfaction with services delivered.

Initial Areas to be Examined

A. Social and Rehabilitation Services

- 1. Reduce welfare roles
 - a. everyone who can work does
 - b. no one under 18 who is unmarried receives an AFDC check who is not living with parent or guardian
 - c. Welfare limited to 2 years unless permanent mental or physical impairment
 - d. During 2 years intensive vocational training.-Day care & medical card continue for time after work begins sliding scale help.
- 2. Examine pay differential between income maintenance and social workers.
- 3 Continue examination of KanWork program
- 4. Consensus agreement between SRS/Budget & Legislative Research on caseloads.
- 5. Pre-admission screening of nursing homes does it work?
- 6. MH/MR Hospitals Examine possibility of making all 6 hospitals dual diagnosis

B. Juvenile Offenders - Costs

Corrections and SRS Combined

- 1. Juvenile offenders must learn there are consequence for their action, i.e. if you break parole something happens besides being put back on parole to break it again.
- 2. Parents must take responsibility for their children's actions financially or in other ways
- 3. Truancy first indication of a potential offender.

 Send parents to school with children for several days?
- 4. Create boot camps for juveniles in some of our minimum security prison sites Stockton, Winfield, El Dorado, etc. Costs
- 5. Examine placing Youth Centers under Corrections
- 6. Youth centers at Topeka and/or Atchison only for major felony offenders
