SB 655 - establishing the Kansas information resources council and the office of chief information architect.

Representative Farmer made a motion to pass favorably SB 655. Representative Mills seconded.

Representative Farmer made a motion to amend SB 655 by the balloon submitted by Senator Tiahrt, which would remove council members from the court system and the board of regents, remove representation of Chairman of Joint Committee on Computers and Telecommunications, and reduce from 4 to 3 representatives from the private sector. It would also narrow the scope of the bill to administrative policies and exclude Lottery, Board of Regents and Information Network of Kansas. Representative Mills seconded. Motion carried.

Representative Macy made an amendment that would review the effectiveness of the Council by utilizing a K-GOAL audit rather than abolishment July 1, 1997, and to also have SB 655 become effective upon entry in the Kansas Register rather than publication in the statute book. Representative Majure seconded. Motion carried.

Representative Dawson made a motion that SB 655 be passed as amended. Representative Ballard seconded. The motion carried.

SB 609 - state shared leave program, modification.

Representative Bradley made a subcommittee report stating it was their recommendation that the management and direction of the expansion of the shared leave program be left up to the Department of Administration.

Representative Scott made a motion to change the wording in the amendment offered to SB 609 to "immediate relative living in the household". Representative Benlon seconded. (Attachment #1)

Representative Dawson made a substitute motion to delete the words "relative or household" in the amendment and add word "family". Representative Majure seconded. The motion carried.

Representative Ballard made a motion to pass SB 609 as amended. Representative Gilbert seconded. The motion carried.

AN ACT relating to state shared leave program.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. The leave share review committee established pursuant to K.A.R. 1-9-23 shall make all determinations by a majority vote of the three members of the committee, and this act shall apply to all determinations made by such committee since the committee's establishment.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

Section 1. The secretary of administration, upon recommendation of the director of personnel services, is hereby authorized to adopt rules and regulations as provided by 75-3706, and amendments thereto, establishing a program for the sharing of leave between employees of the state of Kansas. Employees authorized to share leave pursuant to such rules and regulations shall be authorized to donate annual and sick leave to other state employees who are suffering from, or who have a relative or household member suffering from, an extraordinary or severe illness, injury, impairment or physical or mental condition which has caused, or is likely to cause, the employee to take leave without pay or terminate employment. As used in this section "extraordinary or severe" means serious, extreme or life threatening.
