MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson David Corbin at 10:00 a.m. on January 19, 1994 in Room 423-S of the Capitol.

Chairperson Corbin called on Lee Hamm, Director, Grain Inspection Department.

Mr. Hamm introduced Tom Meyer the new Assistant Grain Director. He requested an amendment to K.S.A. 34-103A, which regulates their fee schedule. The change would strike edible beans in each instance and insert: The following fees shall be charged for the services rendered by this department under the United State Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946 as amended (Attachment 1). A motion was made by Senator Wisdom that the request be accepted and the bill be introduced. Senator Morris seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Senator Steffes and Senator Downey recommended a bill be introduced concerning watershed structures. The statutes provide for 20 year exempt and they recommended this be amended to extend the exemptions of watershed projects from taxation. Committee discussion followed. Chairperson Corbin stated he had talked with Senator Langworthy, Chairperson, Assessment and Taxation, and she did not object to the Agriculture Committee considering this proposal. A motion was made by Senator Steffes to introduce a bill that would extend the tax exemption on watershed projects. Senator Frahm seconded the motion. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Sallee that legislation be introduce to exempt from taxation a berm or property around a hazardous material site in order to comply with the Environmental Protection Regulations. Senator Morris seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The Committee discussed an invitation from Larry Woodson inviting the Committee to tour the Weights and Measures Facilities. Committee consensus was to accept the invitation and staff was instructed to contact Mr. Woodson to arrange the tour.

A motion was made by Senator Frahm to correct the minutes of January 13 and they be approved as corrected. Senator Morris seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 10:28.

The next meeting is scheduled for January 20, 1994.

(b) Where any service is performed in a business community where the department does not regularly maintain an inspection station, the department may charge for subsistence and transportation of personnel and equipment from the headquarters of such personnel to such point and return. Such charges shall be set by adoption of rules and regulations as provided by law. The director may fix the manner in which the charges are collected.

(c) If any person, warehouse or railroad corporation or any of their agents or employees refuses or prevents the officers of the department from having access to their scales, elevators, warehouses and other places in the regular performance of their duties in inspecting, sampling, sampling for inspection and weighing grain or other property in accordance with the tenor and meaning of this act or any law now in force or that may be enacted in relation to the same, such persons or corporations shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

(d) The department is authorized to provide up to a 20% discount of fees of services rendered through a contractual agreement in which the applicant agrees to have all services performed by the department. The number and type of services shall be listed in the contractual agreement and may include, but are not limited to: (1) Carlot, trucklot, barge lot, in or out inspections; (2) weights including submitted samples, protein, aflatoxin; and (3) other tests that may be requested or are provided by the department.
