The Chairman announced the appointment of a subcommittee on privatization. The subcommittee will be composed of Senator Ranson, Chairman; Senator Burke; Senator Vidricksen; Senator Kerr; Senator Feleciano; and Senator Downey.

Report on Kansas-Training Information Program

Ferman Marsh, Assistant Commissioner of Education, Lifelong Learning Division, testified the Kansas-Training Information Program (K-TIP) was established by K.S.A. 72-4451. The State Board of Education publishes the K-TIP report each year, as required by statute, which includes enrollments, placement rates and earnings for persons completing a vocational education program within each postsecondary educational institution, see attachment 1. He stated they have to follow federal mandates which are substantially the same as state law. Area Vocational Technical schools (AVTS) and community colleges are quite different in the way they offer technical education. A vocational school offers programs. In a community college the students enroll by semester hours. Students are classified as postsecondary if they He stated they have to follow federal mandates which are have completed or left high school and are enrolled in an organized program of study for which credit is given towards an associate degree or vocational certificate.

Mr. Marsh stated the federal law requires each student be shown the information in the K-TIP report before getting federal help. Following the student through one year of employment is also a federal requirement. Schools give the students aptitude and specific skill tests. The state of Kansas law is the same as the federal law.

Bob Paxon, Dean of Instruction, Cowley County Community College and Area Vocational-Technical School, testified the Kansas State Board of Education has done an outstanding job holding area vocational technical schools and community colleges accountable for providing students with workplace and lifelong learning skills, however, these institutions should be held accountable to provide more extensive training in Total Quality Management. He said the K-TIP document data is incomplete and misleading in some cases. Cowley County Community College has not utilized the document as effectively as they should. Better documentation is needed to help accomplish this goal. There is a lack of comparative data and the utilization of this book by advisory committees. He recommended each college and area vocational-technical school be required to: 1) Produce and distribute a placement study, including a minimum of three year follow up study of students that list employment, further education, or change of employment; salary; employers; advisory committee members with phone numbers; and state and national employment trends. 2) The State Board of Education revamp K-TIP to include three year composite of placement and salaries by occupation. 3) The State Board of Education provide comparative data by college for the consumer to review. 4) Provide incentives for area vocational-technical schools and colleges to enter into contract relationships for apprenticeships and placement opportunities. 5) Mandate stronger minimum skill requirements and courses be integrated in the curriculum based on business and industry needs. He also recommended colleges and

schools develop strong relationships with business and industry in their service areas, see attachment 2.

Ed Bowden, Counselor, Council Grove High School, testified he uses the K-TIP report extensively and likes it just the way it is. Using the K-TIP report and the Occupational Outlook handbook, the students explore what careers will help them earn the kind of money they need to live. They also use K-TIP in conjunction with a computer program called career link.

Mr. Marsh stated there are employers who feel the Department of Education should set up state supported programs for their specific businesses. The Department of Education's job is to teach basics and entry level skills. They will work with a company as they bring their employees back for specific training. He said a lot of programs are going to competency-based education. A counselor can order a profile on a particular program. Under the new competency system, each program has to have an advisory council.

It was suggested by a Committee member there are three levels of information needed for the report. 1) student's educational background, 2) locations of the programs and success rates and 3) where the occupational need is.

Senator Steffes moved and Senator Ranson seconded to approve the minutes of January 19, 1994. The motion carried on a voice vote.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 9:00 a.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for January 21, 1994.

FOREWORD

This report was prepared in response to K.S.A. 72-4451 that establishes the Kansas-Training Information Program (K-TIP). As required by the statute, the State Board of Education publishes the K-TIP report each year which includes enrollments, placement rates and earnings for persons completing a vocational education program within each postsecondary educational institution.

TE/DSVOCPROGS

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INTRODUCTION

Vocational education programs included in the Kansas-Training Information Program (K-TIP) report are postsecondary programs offered by area vocational-technical schools, community colleges, Kansas College of Technology, and Washburn University.

The information in this report was compiled from two major sources: 1) program completers, and 2) placement and earning figures as submitted to the State Board of Education.

The programs are grouped by classification of instructional program clusters. Data is presented for the twelve-month period July 1, 1991, through June 30, 1992, for those persons who completed a vocational program the previous year.

LIMITATION OF REPORT

The figures in this report should be considered as indicators and not as an absolute for placement and/or earnings for any given program. The salaries are averages; actual individual earnings may be considerably lower or higher than those published in this document. Many other factors influence actual annual earnings; for example, average earnings will likely vary from one region of the state to another. In addition, some completers are self-employed in established, successful businesses.

TE\DSVOCPROGS

PROGRAMS, PLACEMENT, AND EARNINGS

The information appearing on pages 3-38 lists the placement rate and average earnings of those placed by instructional programs. Terms used in the report are defined as follows:

Enrollments

The number of postsecondary students in a program. The students are classified as postsecondary if they have completed or left high school, are enrolled in organized program of study for which credit is given towards an associate degree or vocational certificate.

Continuing

The number of postsecondary students who were in the program the next school year.

Completers

The combined number of persons reported as completers and leavers by the responding schools. A completer is a student who finished a planned sequence of courses, services, competencies, or activities designed to meet a vocational occupational objective.

Leavers

A vocational program enrollee who has left the program and institution without completing the program, but who left voluntarily before its formal completion with sufficient occupational preparation (workable skills) to work in the field.

Average Percent of Completers with Earnings

The data was computed by dividing the number of those defined as placed by the total number of completers and leavers. The completers who are not considered placed are primarily those whose status is unknown or who were unemployed.

Average Annual Earnings

The average earnings were calculated on an annual basis for all program completers and leavers who had reported their earnings during the preceding year.

TE\DSVOCPROGS

JOB PLACEMENT AND EARNINGS OF PROGRAM COMPLETERS

The clearest way to measure the effectiveness of job placement is to look at the placement rate of program completers. While not feasible to expect a 100 percent placement rate, it certainly is desirable. The State Board of Education monitors the placement rate of vocational completers as one indicator of the effectiveness of vocational programs.

The data presented below summarize the enrollments, completer and placement rates for each instructional program cluster. According to the data, 8,008 vocational students completed a program or were employable leavers within the postsecondary institutions listed. The data also indicate that students completing vocational programs are able to secure employment at better than 78 percent (average) placement rate.

The clearest way to measure the effectiveness of job earnings is to look at the average salaries which vocational completers demand. The average annual salary figures for each cluster ranges from \$8,874 to \$24,615.

The individual local education agencies' programs are listed starting on page 3. Information not given to the State Board of Education has a (-) in place of a number.

Thank you for inviting me to discuss with you the Kansas Training Information Program. Both Dr. McAtee, President of Cowley County Community College, and myself believe that the future success of area vocational-technical schools and community colleges will be based on placement of graduates and the ability to improve the quality of the worker in Kansas.

Kansas, as every state, competes in a global society (Examples of General Electric Aircraft Engine Maintenance Center). We have to not only be concerned about the placement of students, but about their ability to assist their employer to compete on a world class level.

The Kansas Training Information Program, as I understand it, is a consumer information report. It is a report designed to assist consumers in making wise decisions about careers. The Kansas State Board of Education has done an outstanding job holding area vocational-technical schools and community colleges accountable for providing students with workplace and lifelong learning skills. I believe, however, we need to hold these institutions accountable to provide more extensive training in Total Quality Management.

Without straying further from the subject, let's look at the strengths, concerns, and recommendations with regard to the KTIP document.

Strengths

- 1. Provides students looking at particular colleges with a snapshot of the placement statistics of vocational and technical programs.
- 2. Provides salary and placement information on each program.
- 3. Information is placed in the hands of high school counselors.
- 4. Information is shared with the colleges and area vocational-technical schools of the State.
- 5. Provides a composite of initial placements within the State.

Concerns

- 1. Data is incomplete and misleading in some cases.
 - a. Lack of salary information
 - b. Lack of employer responses
 - c. Part-time students
 - d. Students already employed who are upgrading skills
 - e. A three year plan of action to improve the quality of each program
- 2. Booklet is not effectively utilized by public schools.
 - a. High school counselors
 - b. Current students
- 3. Booklet has not been made readily available to students by colleges and area vocational-technical schools.
 - a. Financial recipients see only one program in most cases
- 4. Lack of comparative data, and utilization of data by advisory committees.
 - a. Colleges and area vocational-technical schools are comparing apples and oranges
- 5. Lack of cooperation from business and industry.
 - a. Lack of strong relationships

Recommendations

- 1. Each college and area vocational-technical schools be required to produce and distribute a placement study with the following components: (I will provide you an excerpt of one such book.)
 - a. A minimum of three year follow up study of students that lists employment, further education, or change of employment.
 - b. Salary
 - c. Employers
 - d. Advisory committee members with phone numbers
 - e. State and national employment trends
- 2. The State Board of Education revamp KTIP to include three year composite of placement and salaries by occupation.
- 3. The State Board of Education provide comparative data by college for the consumer to review.
- 4. Provide incentives for area vocational-technical schools and colleges to enter into contract relationships for apprenticeships and placement opportunities.
- 5. Mandate stronger minimum skill requirements and courses be integrated in the curriculum based on business and industry needs.

Summary

We must realize we cannot change by remaining the same. Colleges and schools hold onto programs which are no longer viable due to tenure or political reasons. We need to acknowledge the certificate and degree programs of the 70s may not be needed in the year 2000.

Very few students are attending programs full time, and completing these programs in two years. However, that is how we attempt to gather the data. In fact, only 8% of the community college population will graduate or intend to graduate. Many are coming back for retraining or attending on a part-time basis.

It is an effort both business and industry and education must address. Tech Prep and School To Work are federal initiative to assist us.

My final recommendation is to hold each of us accountable to develop strong relationships with business and industry in our service areas.

For Kansas to work in the year 2000 we must improve education and industry relations today.




