### MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lana Oleen at 11:05 a.m. on January 19, 1994 in Room 254-E of the Capitol.

Sen. Oleen introduced Theresa Kiernan, who briefed the committee on <u>SB 509</u> (<u>Attachment 1</u>). Several committee members asked questions or voiced concern regarding confirmations. Sen. Oleen explained changing term expiration dates so that most terms would expire prior to or during the time when the Legislature is in session. Sen. Walker asked for clarification on those dates, and Sen. Vidricksen stated, if an appointee will serve half or less of the term, that appointee would not have to be confirmed. He thought that was excessive and should be changed. Sen. Tillotson asked for examples of boards or commissions which require appointments from someone other than the governor. Ms. Kiernan stated the Water Authority is a good example. She also stated that in drafting the bill, the terms were staggered so that more expire on December 31, but that no terms were shortened by more than two months. Sen. Oleen announced the committee will hold formal hearings on the bill tomorrow.

Sen. Oleen announced the confirmation hearing for Robert Mikesic, appointed to the Commission on Human Rights, and referred to the confirmation questionnaire (<u>Attachment 2</u>) completed by Mr. Mikesic. Mr. Mikesic introduced two staff members from the Human Rights Commission: Robert Lay, Assistant Director and Brandon Myers, Chief Legal Counsel for the Commission. Mr. Mikesic presented personal information (<u>Attachment 3</u>) to the committee and offered to answer questions from the committee.

Sen. Oleen asked Mr. Mikesic when he was appointed, and he responded he was appointed in October, 1992 and attended his first meeting in November, 1992. Sen. Oleen questioned why Mr. Mikesic's appointment was not forwarded to the committee and considered for confirmation last session, and pointed out that he has been serving on the commission for approximately 15 months without confirmation. Mr. Mikesic responded he understood he could not be confirmed last session because of paperwork and the KBI background check had not been completed.

Sen. Gooch asked Mr. Mikesic, since he has been serving for some time on the commission, how he feels the commission functions and if he feels the commission carries out duties that are assigned to it. Mr. Mikesic responded he is impressed by the professionalism of the staff and its dedication to educating the public about human rights. He stated it is a continuing challenge because of the increase in complaints and the number of complaints filed each month; he stated that the area with the greatest increase in complaints filed is the sex category. He is also proud of the commission's adaptation to the American Disabilities Act; that the commission is developing a one-year plan, which is discussed at their monthly meetings.

Sen. Gooch also asked Mr. Mikesic about the backlog of cases and if he could recommend a solution to the problem. Mr. Mikesic stated the commission needs eight more full-time investigators, but he realizes budget restraints will not permit that. He stated the commission is attempting to mediate more cases, which could be done by professional mediators in the state, thus solving the problem early; that a more cost effective way to work a number of cases would be to contract them out to the private sector, in particular, to non-profit organizations. He stated that Brandon Myers is researching this possibility. Sen. Gooch asked Mr. Mikesic if he feels the rights arena has been broadened too far so that it now includes everyone. Mr. Mikesic answered that broadening the rights area is a reflection of society; that the law has been extended to be responsive and defend the rights of individuals. He stated that broadening the arena does not dilute it; that discrimination

continues to occur whether it is because of sexual preference, race or housing. He stated we must continue to seek remedies for discrimination and help people seek regress. Sen. Tillotson asked if Mr. Mikesic is related to "Babe" Mikesic, and he responded he was my father. Sen. Oleen explained that earlier when she asked him when he was appointed, she meant no reflection on him - she stated she wished the committee could have considered his appointment last session. She told the committee it is evident that we have problems with receiving names of appointees for confirmation in a timely manner.

Sen. Praeger introduced her pages, who have been assisting the committee today, and she also introduced her intern for the session, who is from KU Law school. Sen. Oleen announced the agenda for next week.

Meeting adjourned at 11:50.

#### MEMORANDUM

Re: 1994 SB 509

The bill makes three basic policy changes. First, new section 1 creates a confirmation oversight committee composed of five members: (a) Three members appointed by majority leader of the senate; and (b) two members appointed by minority leader of the senate. The majority leader designates the chair and vice-chair of the committee.

The oversight committee is created to authorize a person appointed to fill a vacancy on a board or commission to exercise the powers, duties and functions of the office until the appointment is confirmed at the next regular or special session.

If the appointment is to fill a vacancy in which more than half the term has expired, the appointee is not subject to confirmation by the senate. This provision would not apply to appointments to the state board of regents which are required by the constitution to be confirmed.

The second policy change made in the bill affects when a member of a board or commission no longer has the authority to exercise the powers of office. In general, the statutes provide that a person holds office for a term "and until a successor is appointed and qualified." This means until a successor takes the oath of office (not confirmed). Under the bill, a person would continue to hold office until a successor is confirmed or authorized to act as provided in new section 1. Under current law and under the bill, if a successor is not appointed and qualified, or confirmed, the sitting member's term expires and that person begins to serve a new term until a successor is appointed and qualified, or confirmed.

The third policy change made in the bill affects when the terms of office expire. Under the proposal, terms would expire either on March 1 or December 31.

Sections 2 through 22 contain amendments to the various statutes necessary to implement these three policy changes.

The bill applies only to positions subject to confirmation, but does not apply to cabinet officers or heads of divisions within state agencies.



## Senate Federal & State Affairs Committee January 19, 1994

Thank you for the opportunity to meet with you today to consider my confirmation as a Commissioner with the Kansas Human Rights Commission. It is an honor to be considered for this position with the Kansas Human Rights Commission. As requested, at this time I would like to provide some background information about myself. I will try to be brief and stay to the purpose of our meeting.

My education consists of a Bachelor's of Arts degree from Emporia State University in 1973, with a Sociology Major and Psychology Minor. I earned a Master's of Arts degree in Sociology from Wichita State University in 1976.

My first job following college was four years in the Department of Human Resources as a Consultant with the Kansas Committee on Employment of the Handicapped (now known as the Kansas Commission on Disability Concerns).

Since 1984 I have been working in the field of Independent Living: I was Coordinator of an Independent Living Center, Operation LINK, in Hays, Kansas from 1980-84. Since the summer of 1984 I have been working for Independence, Inc. in Lawrence, Kansas. The first five years with Independence, Inc. I worked as the Residential Services Specialist, providing housing information and advocacy services. The remaining years up to the present I have been the Advocacy Coordinator, working to increase people with disabilities awareness and understanding of their civil and human rights, and what avenues are available for ensuring the enjoyment of those rights. I also provide technical assistance to businesses, local government, landlords, architects and builders regarding their responsibilities under the Kansas Act Against Discrimination, Americans With Disabilities Act, and the Fair Housing Act, and how society as a whole benefits from following these laws.

The field of Independent Living is about empowering people with disabilities to control their own lives and advocate for an integrated and accessible community. This central mission and message of equality is what the field of Independent Living has in common with all other groups protected by nondiscrimination law. And this belief in equality is what led me to actively support the rights of other.
