MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lana Oleen at 10:30 a.m. on April 30, 1994, at the Senate rail.

The following members were present: Senators Oleen, Papay, Tillotson, Ramirez, Parkinson, Praeger, and Vidricksen

Committee staff present: Donna Meister, acting Committee Secretary

The chairman stated that the purpose of the meeting was to deal with Indian Casino Gaming. It is necessary to have introduced a bill that would permit the video lottery as part of the trailer legislation before they introduce the casino gaming bill. Sen. Moran briefly explained that it would be necessary to introduce a bill authorizing state owned and operated video lottery pursuant to the terms of the compact. The attorney general feels Kansas law prohibits this and it is necessary that a bill be introduced before the gaming bill can be passed. Upon motion made by Sen. Vidricksen to introduce a bill concerning trailer legislation in regard to Indian Casino Compacts. Motion was seconded by Sen. Praeger. Upon discussion, Sen. Tillotson stated she is of the opinion that video lottery will not work under our constitution and that introducing this bill is a waste of time. Following discussion, the motion passed on a voice vote, with Sen. Tillotson voting "nay."

Meeting adjourned at 10:40 a.m.
