MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND INSURANCE.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Richard Bond at 9:08 a.m. on February 18, 1994 in Room 529-S of the Capitol.

Members present: Senators Corbin, Lawrence, Moran, Petty, Praeger, and Steffes.

<u>Senator Lawrence moved to approve the minutes of the meeting of February 17 as submitted.</u> <u>Senator Steffes seconded the motion. The motion carried.</u>

Betty McBride, Gubernatorial Appointee to the Kansas Development Finance Authority, appeared before the committee for confirmation hearing. (Attachment #1) Ms. McBride is Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles and was appointed to the KDFA board in September, 1993. In response to Senator Bond's request, Mrs. McBride gave her impression of the KDFA and agreed that the KDFA should solicit bids on projects so that the taxpayer gets the advantage of the lowest price. William Caton, Consumer Credit Commissioner, submitted a letter of recommendation for Mrs. McBride (Attachment #2), and stated he is also in agreement with soliciting bids on projects. Senator Petty made a motion, seconded by Senator Steffes, to recommend to the Senate confirmation of Mrs. McBride to the KDFA. The motion carried.

The committee also considered the reappointment of <u>Sue Ann Shelby</u> to the Credit Union Council. Since Ms. Shelby is a reappointee, her presence was not required. (<u>Attachment #3.</u>) <u>Senator Petty moved to recommend to the Senate confirmation of Ms. Shelby to the Credit Union Council. The motion was seconded by Senator Lawrence. The motion carried.</u>

The hearing was reopened on <u>SB 540</u>, concerning the application process for banks and trust companies to establish contracts. This bill was originally heard in committee on February 2 and was referred to a subcommittee chaired by Senator Steffes and consisting of Senators Hensley and Bond. The subcommittee has recommended that <u>Substitute for SB 540</u> be approved by the committee.

Judi Stork, Kansas Bank Department, explained the changes incorporated in the substitute bill (Attachment #4). Senator Bond stated that this legislation was necessary to establish whether the Bank Commissioner or the Banking Board has approval authority for establishing trust desks and trust branches, and this bill will place the authority with the office of the Bank Commissioner. The bill also clarifies that a trust company in another state cannot establish a trust service branch in Kansas. The bill, as amended, clarifies that a non-Kansas trust company is prohibited from branching into Kansas, making trust company branching law similar to the bank branching provisions. Also, the bill will remove the requirement that the population of a town must be at least 20,000 before a trust company service can be established. Senator Bond stated that the original legislation dealing with the establishing of trust services did not have the population requirement; however, the 20,000 figure was inserted by the House to keep trust branches out of small towns. Senator Steffes noted that there is no such limitation on the establishment of bank branches, and that removal of this requirement would give more opportunities to consumers and encourage healthy competition. James Maag, Kansas Bankers Association, noted that there will likely be some members of that organization who will strongly oppose deletion of the 20,000 population requirement.

There being no further questions or comments and no other conferees, the hearing on **Sub. for SB 540** was closed. Senator Steffes moved to adopt the subcommittee's recommendations as **Sub. for SB 540**, and to recommend it favorably. Senator Praeger seconded the motion; the motion carried. Senator Steffes will carry this bill.

Hearing on <u>SB 567</u> was reopened. This bill, concerning delinquency charges on UCCC consumer credit transactions, was originally heard on February 3. <u>Bud Grant, KCCI</u>, stated that the original language in section 1 was quite confusing and presented an amendment to clarify the language by inserting a new section 2 and renumbering subsequent sections (<u>Attachment #5</u>). <u>SB 567</u> would allow a fee to be charged on

delinquent payments of 5% of the amount of the unpaid installment or \$25.00, whichever is less, or , as an alternative, language may be inserted in the contract to permit a delinquency charge not to exceed \$10.00. In response to Senator Petty's question, Mr. Grant advised that the current allowance of 5% of the unpaid balance may not be sufficient to cover the cost of collection, and that a larger penalty fee would provide incentive to pay monthly installments in a timely manner.

William Caton, Consumer Credit Commissioner, agrees that the proposed amendment clarifies the confusing language in the original bill, and stated that he has concerns that creditors with small payments may be unduly burdened by the \$10.00 delinquency charge. Mr. Caton recommended a threshold of a \$25.00 payment due for the \$10.00 penalty and a delinquency charge of \$5.00 on delinquent payments under \$25.00.

Mr. Grant noted that the average cost of collection is \$5.69 and if a \$5.00 cap is imposed, the retailer will lose \$.69 on each delinquent payment. There were no further questions and no other conferees; the hearing was closed.

Senator Petty made a motion to amend the bill as suggested by Mr. Caton. Senator Corbin seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Senator Corbin moved to pass SB 567 favorably as amended. Senator Moran seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The chairman reminded members that the committee will meet on Monday, February 21, for the purpose of continuing the hearing on <u>SB 622.</u>

The committee adjourned at 9:43 a.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for February 21, 1994.

- contracting trustee agreement (including trust service desks)
- trust service offices
- trust branch bank (branch bank for trust activity only)
- 2. Time line/approval process:
- * Publication of notice of intent to file an application must occur prior to filing of application (Affidavit of publication is part of application).
- * Public has 30 days from date application is filed to file a comment letter or a request for public hearing (new language distinguishes between comment and request for hearing: affirmative "request for hearing" now required to trigger public hearing).

30 days from close of comment/request period Request filed- commissioner holds public hearing-decision by commissioner within 14 days of hearing.

No request filed-commissioner decision.

15 days to appeal commissioner decision to banking board.

- 3. Requirement that notice must be given to existing trust customers prior to the implementation of a contracting trustee arrangement was reinserted (This notice must occur prior to filing of application because certification of this is a required part of the application). Sec. 1 (f)(5).
- There is no longer a requirement that the commissioner make a determination of "need" for the 4. service in the community in order for the application to be approved.
- 5. Strict prohibition against an out of state trust service provider establishing a trust "facility" in Kansas. New Sec. 3.
- Definition in K.S.A.9-701(t) of trust company business was changed. The defined term has been 6. changed to "trust business". This was done to decrease confusion by limiting the use of the phrase "trust company" to discussion of the specific activity of operating a trust company. Use of the new phrase "trust business" will be proper when referring to the broad activity conducted on the premise of any trust service provider. (i.e. trust co., trust dept. of a bank, trust service offices, etc.). Sec. 6 (t). This in turn required clean up in Sec. 7, 8, & 9.

AN ACT relating to the uniform consumer credit code; delinquency charge; amending K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 18a-2-502 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 16a-2-502 is hereby amended to read as follows: 16a-2-502. (I) The parties to a consumer credit transaction may contract for a delinquency charge on any installment not paid in full within 10 days after its scheduled or deferred due date either in an amount not exceeding 5% of the unpaid amount of the installment or \$25, whichever is less, on in an one unit not second as \$40.

20 (2) 3 A delinquency charge under paragraph (a) of subsection (1)21 may be collected only once on an installment however long it remains
22 in default. A delinquency charge may be collected at the time it
23 accrues or at any time thereafter.

(3) 4 No delinquency charge may be collected on an installment which is paid in full within 10 days after its scheduled or deferred installment due date even though an earlier maturing installment or a delinquency charge on an earlier installment may not have been paid in full.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 1993 Supp. 16a-2-502 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
