Sen. Langworthy requested the introduction of a bill which regards the financing of thoroughfares in the City of Overland Park. Sen. Langworthy made a motion that the bill be introduced, Sen. Reynolds seconded, and the motion carried.

Sen. Tillotson had a request for the introduction of a bill which would allow a district attorney for Leavenworth County. Sen. Tillotson made a motion for the introduction of the bill, Sen. Langworthy seconded, and the motion carried.

Sen. Reynolds requested the introduction of a bill which would allow the law enforcement of cities and counties to consolidate by option statewide. Sen. Reynolds made a motion to introduce the bill, Sen. Langworthy seconded, and the motion carried.
