MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson August Bogina at 11:50 a.m. on April 27, 1994 in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

The Chairman stated that the purpose of the meeting was to review a request for the confirmation of Vernon Chesbro to the KPERS Board of Trustees. Statute requires that the Joint Committee on Pensions, Investments and Benefits review qualifications of the appointee and make a recommendation to the Senate Ways and Means Committee. Chairman Bogina read from the minutes of the April 6 meeting of the Joint Committee in which Mr. Chesbro was recommended favorable for confirmation to the KPERS Board of Trustees. Copies of Mr. Chesbro's Senate Confirmation Questionnaire, Statement of Substantial Interest, and personal resume were distributed to members (<u>Attachment 1</u>). The Chairman introduced Mr. Chesbro who answered members' questions.

Mr. Chesbro told the Committee that he has managed and had the financial responsibility for companies that employ over 100 persons and has has been involved in personnel functions of the company which included pension administration. He said that he believes the Board 's first objective is to provide funds that will be adequate upon the retirements of the members and that the Board must make decisions based on the interest of employees. He stated that he had participated in 3 Board meetings, and his assignments have been direct placement and personnel. Because of his employment background, Mr. Chesbro stated that he is very comfortable with his responsibilities in the personnel area. He stated that he believes his responsibility in direct placement will be the determination of the investment managers. He told members that if the state chooses to get back into the business of direct placement, he believes the structure would have to undergo a change.

Senator Kerr offered a motion which was seconded by Senator Lawrence to recommend favorably the appointment of Vernon Chesbro to the KPERS Board of Trustees to the full Senate. The motion carried on a roll call vote.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The Office of the Revisor of Statutes requested the introduction of a bill for the purpose of reconciling 1994 HB 2730 and 1994 SB 474. Senator Salisbury moved, Senator Morris seconded, that bill draft 3 RS 2696 be introduced. The motion carried on a voice vote.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:15 P.M.
