Chairman Lane asked the committee's pleasure on <u>HB 2292</u>. <u>Rep. Heinemann made a motion to amend HB 2292</u> to exclude firms who received a letter from the Secretary of Human Resources prior to 7/1/93 which states they are exempt from the law. Rep Pauls seconded the motion.

Rep. Greg Packer made a substitute motion to table the bill. It was seconded by Rep. Swenson. The motion to table the bill carried.

Chairman Lane told the committee they had been asked to consider <u>SB 326</u>, which deals with workers compensation coverage for motor vehicle owner-operators. If the committee has no objections, he would like to refer the bill to the Workers Compensation Advisory Council, which was created with the passage in 1993 of the Workers Compensation Reform Act. The committee agreed by consensus. Rep. Flora asked to be recorded as a nay vote.

Chairman Lane announced the **SB** 100 had also been referred to the committee, but will not be heard because no more formal committee meetings are planned for the 1995 Session.
